# **CEO REPORT**

Dear Members.

When looking back at the 2016 season, there were many things that didn't go well for us. One of the wettest football seasons in a very long time, which featured just one 'dry' home game out of 10, was compounded by our poor on field performance in winning only two games, along with a consistent sprinkling of injuries to key players across the season, giving us very little continuity. Although we are keen to put 2016 behind us and move towards a satisfying 2017, we are pleased to announce our third consecutive year of profit which was a fantastic performance given some of the issues already mentioned.

Key items that contributed strongly to the financial performance;

- Hosting the A & B grade Amateur Grand Finals at Steel Blue Oval compensated for the lost opportunity due to wet home games throughout the season.
- Expenses were well managed with supplier contract renegotiations realising costs reductions
- · WAFL raffle was again a strong contributor
- AFL draftee transfer fees from SDFC players selected was high.
- Significant increase in Development squad player's fees
- Swan Districts Sports Clinic profit distribution result above budget

The current economic environment is well reported and we have seen examples of local business in real decline. To be able to exceed our sponsorship targets for the year was a superb performance from everyone involved and reinforces the staunchness of our corporate partners. Thank you to each of you for continuing to contribute toward our goals; we can only put together a strong football program, including coaches and up-to-date equipment, with the financial support our sponsors provide.

# **BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT**

Peter Snow has updated you in more detail in his report, however it is important to note that the redevelopment of Steel Blue Oval is still very much a priority for the club and we are confident of getting a satisfactory result for the future of Swan Districts Football Club. 
V Swans is a leader in its field and Nicole Graves (General Manager) continue their outstanding work for our young people. The support they give the Football Department is invaluable.







# LEAGUE REPORT

2016 tested everybody's resolve at the footy club, even from well before the start of the season. Our planning in November got a real shakeup when new recruit Ryan Crowley was whisked away into the AFL, and then club superstar Ryan Davis received a lifeline by the Gold Coast Suns.

Our pre-season was strong across the summer, and we were extremely confident that we could produce a competitive season. Unfortunately, from the first bounce of the year we had to endure some serious adversity. Nathan Blakely landed awkwardly in the middle of the ground and tore his ACL which ended his season. This was quickly followed up by serious injury to two more of our boys and we limped our way to a 8 goal loss against East Fremantle.

In the build up to the game young Kirk Ugle had suffered a horrible family loss that he had to fight his way through, and following Round 1 we lost Murray Newman to unforeseen family circumstances.

After a win versus Claremont in Round 4, Jake Nuich had to take leave due to a cancer scare and the ensuing treatment didn't see him return until very late in the season. Jarred Blight didn't last much longer after breaking his leg in Round 5, and Aaron Elari went to bush footy at the end of Round 6.

In 22 years of WAFL and AFL footy, I have honestly never seen a string of events adversely alter the course of a clubs fortunes like the ones we encountered this year.

However, the difficulty we faced again provided opportunity for our young kids. We had 16 debutantes this year and all of these emerging talents showed signs that they can play high level WAFL footy in the future.

The exposure that these players received was critical. There's nothing better for the development of young footballers than to be exposed to a higher level. It is on the job tuition that tests every area of physical conditioning, skill execution and mental application and the lessons learnt will hold them in great stead in years to come.

The experience gained has sharpened the focus of our players in regard to what they need to work on the most, and that will drive them across the pre-season.

There's no doubt that we lacked stability this year on a week to week basis. With so many young players coming into the system we suffered periods of poor concentration and without a depth of senior players consistently on the park to provide strength, we were often blown out of the water in a short space of time.

We had many, many games where we had 3 strong, competitive quarters only to bleed goals quickly in short succession. It's these periods when experience and leadership is most important, and it's this area that we've been able to significantly add to in the off season.

The addition of Clancee Pearce, Dave Ellard, Jamie Bennell, Corey Gault and Ryan Crowley sees almost 500 games of AFL footy experience come into the mix. These players will provide amazing examples in regard to professionalism and preparation for all of our developing players. Our youngsters are strong, and with added stability we will see them progress even further in season 2017.

Well done to Matt Riggio who became a two time Swan Medallist and to all of the other award winners. Congratulations on all your hard work.

Finally I want thank all of our staff, our volunteers and our members for their unwavering support throughout the season. We understand that you ride the highs with us, and seasons like this with so many lows can be excruciating to watch. Throw in the wettest, coldest winter in decades and it made coming the footy tough going.

We are looking forward to repaying the support of our loyal fans by bouncing back quickly. We are certain that when we put our returning experience around our talented kids, the wheel will turn really quickly and the climb up the ladder will be rapid.

# **RESERVES REPORT**

The challenges faced with a young group of men learning their craft and attempting to implement it week in and week out were compounded by a variety of injuries, as well as inclement weather which made it difficult to implement a game plan that was intended to showcase the hard running and skilful nature of our players. Most weeks we were forced into a hard, in and under style of football against more seasoned and physical bodies. We quickly identified our major weakness was our mental ability to stay focussed as a group for large periods of time and week in, week out we attempted to minimise the periods within games where we were dominated. To the player's credit, the last 3 rounds saw our best, most consistent and more importantly, most team oriented football of the year. 3 wins to finish the season was a good reward for a long, hard year.

Moving on to 2017 it is important that we learn from the mistakes made in 2016 without dwelling on them as negatives. We have a strong spirited and young group that can improve markedly in a small period of time. 2017 will see a strong focus on implementing thoughtfully calculated individual training plans in order to maximise each player's strengths and improve their weaknesses. We will be entering a year where the majority of the players in the senior squad will have had at least 2 years exposure to the level and we anticipate that the growth of the players physically and mentally combined with an increase in their football knowledge to be significantly improved.

Reserves football is about learning what is required to make it at the top level and for many players it is a steep learning curve

on how to prepare physically and mentally in order to perform at an elite level every week. In 2017 we hope to create the optimal environment to create the best future Swan Districts League players possible.

As with any club there are many people put in a mountain of work for nothing more than to see the Swan Districts Football Club succeed. This makes it so easy for the players to focus on their football and for a coach to focus on coaching.

On behalf of the players I would like to thank Gary Rowlinson our team manager, Daryl Crotty our runner, Dave McKay our bench coach and Daniel Wulff our forwards coach as well as all the support staff within the club.

On behalf of myself, thank you to Greg Harding, Phil Smart, Steve Malaxos, Trent Cooper, Steve Thomson, Percy Johnson and Graham Hadley for providing me with immense amounts of support and passing on their amazing knowledge. As a developing coach myself, it is amazing to have the resources of these men around me, and I am extremely grateful for the opportunity I was presented.

# **COLTS REPORT**

We exceeded expectations early, winning five out of our first six games with the highlight being a solid win over eventual premiers Claremont at Steel Blue Oval.

At this point in the season, we lost our state players and it was really pleasing to see so many boys play in the national 18's carnival. When they were 16, we only had Brad Fullgrabe and Aidan Clarke play state football but two years on and we had a total of six players represent their state, with those two joined in the WA team by Josh Cipro, Griffin Logue and Sam Taylor and Rohan Armstrong representing the NT and Allies.

We struggled through the next six game block, only winning two games with inconsistency being our biggest challenge. We were left in a vulnerable position at the end of the state 18's campaign. We realised that we would have to win at least five of our last eight games to guarantee a third successive finals birth and it was during this time that the amazing amount of work put in by our Talent Manager, Steve Thomson, paid dividends.

After the carnival, the state players and many others were pushed up the grades to get a taste of senior football to prepare them for 2017 and beyond. Twelve boys played reserves and of those, four made their league debuts and hopefully that experience in trying times will stand them in good stead for the future. With so many of our best players unavailable, we were forced to play a lot of younger talent and kids from the country that had been scouted by Steve. We managed to win six of our last eight games with the highlight being a 12 point win over the eventual minor premiers. Perth, with only 7 of our best 22 available and no less than 6 players from our 16's. We played a massive total of 63 players in the colts this year and the fact that we could give so many a taste of wearing the black and white jumper should prove a great benefit for the club.

Our finals campaign was short-lived and extremely disappointing. We didn't get a chance to gel as a unit before the finals and that may have been costly in going further in the campaign as we couldn't get going in our elimination final against eventual Runners-Up, East Perth. The boys that came back from senior football struggled to impact the game in the way they would have liked and the boys who had done the bulk of the work over the previous eight weeks seemed to stand back a bit and the result was we played nothing like our best football and went down by 12 points in a very

Winning finals and premierships is always fantastic, but the main aim of Colts football is to develop league players for our club (or the AFL) and the disappointment of that performance will be a great learning experience for all involved. Hopefully, many of the boys who were out there can go on to represent Swan Districts in a league final and the experience of 2016 will hopefully stand them in good stead.

The contribution of the coaches mentioned earlier cannot be overstated and the boys have acknowledged how important they have been in their development. This was complemented by our league and reserves coaches. Greg Harding and Andrew Harman, who took guite a few of the boys under their wings at various stages of the season.

There are many other areas where we received great support, from Pete Harrison and James Anile, who doubled as strength and conditioning coaches and runners, to Sean Doody and his stats team, Indy and the property staff and the trainers led by Katelyn Meade.

There was no grand final appearance in 2016 for the Colts' side but it was another successful year. That success is hard to quantify at the moment but will hopefully be evident in the future by many of this crop going on to represent our great club in the league team in the future.

I would like the the club for the opportunity to coach the colts' side for the last three years and I look forward to tracking the careers of so many talented fine young men as they make their way in their footy careers and life in general.

Whilst season 2016 did not bring the football success on the field we were expecting, the Swansmen had a very successful year and provided many opportunities for our members to enjoy good fellowship and help raise some very valuable money for the Club at the same time.

We congratulate the whole football department on continuing to develop players for the future and we look forward with optimism to the 2017 season. The Swansmen appreciate the support received from Greg Harding and Phil Smart and to the players for making themselves available to speak at our functions.

The year commenced with the Annual Planning Seminar in February followed by the Club Busy Bee. We built a new fenced enclosure at the front of the Swansmen Lounge thanks to Jason & William Donald, Peter Bacon and capable apprentices. We continue to work with and welcome our Judda Bee members and look forward to strengthening the networking opportunities and mutual benefits that may arise.

In addition to the stubby raffle', the AFL Raffle sold out completely, netting \$6,500; the Auction netted about \$20,000. Thanks to George vander Meulen for selling the Margin tickets and, and despite the terrible weather at our home games, Dave Cianciosi and Peter Bacon ensured the Lounge sales were as strong as they could be

Our contributions to the Club included the annual sponsorship of the Development Squad; a payment towards the new memorabilia software, a payment of \$3,500 to purchase player GPS units, Count-Me-In table and Player Auction sponsorship; the Leading Goalkicking Award and an end of season donation to the Club of \$40,000. In addition, we had catering and bar sales of \$12,000 from our events bringing our total contribution this year to over \$60.000.

# **CAPITAL WORKS & STRATEGIC INVESTMENT COMMITTEE**

Last year's Redevelopment & Strategic Projects Committee has been renamed as the Capital Works and Strategic Investments

Committee to reflect its present focus.

# **Bassendean Oval Redevelopment**

A significant part of the Committee's attention this year was devoted to the Bassendean Activity Centre project which includes redevelopment around Steel Blue Oval. Following State Cabinet "in principle" approval, the Development Agreement between the Club, Town of Bassendean and Landcorp moved pn to extensive public consultation and development of concepts.

It was disappointing that a campaign of misleading and deceptive statements perpetrated by a small group of dissidents caused a great deal of unnecessary angst in the local community. The Club became an unfortunate beneficiary of protests by a minority that were mainly aimed at potential development of other sites in Bassendean town.

Despite the furore created, the Town resolved to move forward with development of three areas in the Town – one of which involves the Oval surrounds. As part of the arrangement, the Club's land footprint will nearly treble enabling development of additional facilities capable of generating additional revenue to sustain the Club into the future.

On a further positive note, the Department of Sport & Recreation and WA Football Commission have agreed to fund a "robust" Business Case aimed at seeking more than the initial \$3 million contribution from Landcorp's Bassendean development activities. That Business Case will specifically address football-related facilities and Club sustainability.

The Club is also taking advantage of a pro bono offer from The Jaycees Community Foundation Inc to develop a second Business Case and Feasibilities on a range of other revenue-generating facilities such as a Sports Village, childcare and sports medicine centres.

While actual construction is still several years away, members are likely to see visuals in the latter part of 2017 of what is proposed. One of our members is working in the background to establish a trust aimed at providing funding for the Club's future facilities.

# As part of its innovation and administration streamlining program, the Club adopted a state of the art Association Management System with the initial costs partly funded by the Swansmen and Past Players & Officials Associations. As was originally intended, a significant part of the annual cost is now being met through advertising on the site.

**Association Management System** 

This site was intended to be an "inner sanctum" specifically for members and was to sit behind the Club's main website but a decision has since been made to launch it as the Club's main website in 2017.

This innovation represents a significant upgrade to the Club's member management and communication system. It integrates the Club's social media and news distribution systems as well as offering a Club events calendar and direct booking facility, event tickets and name badges. The site will be progressively expanded to include special offers to members in their areas of interest. With more than half of our members having email addresses it offers considerable

savings in the cost of member communication with information also accessible on smartphones for those not using other devices.

The existing member database has been "cleaned" and uploaded to the site and will allow members direct online access to renew membership and update their personal information. Apart from current members, we are most grateful that willing volunteer Ann Slaven "cleaned" a previous database identifying more than 500 members who had not renewed membership in 2016. A campaign to re-engage these past members is being undertaken.

Apart from administrative savings, the long term aim is to encourage the many "closet" black and white supporters we have to access the system as a "Supporter" and then offer inducements to join, attend games and functions or at least buy some merchandise.



# **Swan Districts Sports Clinic**

The increase to 50% ownership of Swan Districts Sports Clinic reported last year has proved a valuable investment with a substantial increase in business and net earnings. The business is expanding with additional personnel and made a significantly increased distribution to the Club this year. The Committee will consider similar arrangements as part of the site redevelopment.

# Memorabilia Collection & Club Museum

As part of the development of a co-ordinated long term approach to accurately recording our history and memorabilia, our two coterie groups and an anonymous donor funded the acquisition of collection-specific Mosaic Software late last year. This has been installed on an office computer and a donated tablet and training is being undertaken before year end.

# Committee

The Committee comprised Directors Peter Snow (Chairman), Directors Sarah Curnow and Paul Rosair (until his appointment as Chairman of the VSwans Committee) and member Glenn Hall. President Peter Hodyl and CEO Tom Bottrell also sit on the Committee.

**SWAN MEDAL** SWAN MEDAL



MATT Riggio and Adam Faulkner were two outstanding performers in a difficult year for Swan Districts with the former taking out a second straight Swan Medal while the blackand-whites continue to make significant signings to improve quickly in 2017.

Swan Districts' season might have been disappointing with just the two victories and a wooden spoon finish, but the performances of Riggio and Faulkner right throughout the year were a highlight.

Therefore it was no surprise to see the pair finish up going neck and neck in the Swan Medal voting to determine the club's fairest and best winner for 2016.

Riggio ended up polling 130 votes to claim his second straight Swan Medal to win ahead of Faulkner who came runner-up with 110 votes.

The pair finished well in front of their teammates with Tony Notte coming third with 67 votes ahead of Justin Simpson (55), Jesse Turner (55), Tom Smirk (43), Todd Banfield (42), Tallan Ames (41), Laurence Grescos (36) and Graham Jetta (35).

The Swan Medal victory capped off a tremendous season for Riggio backing up his performance in 2015 that saw him score a narrow win in the fairest and best voting over Rvan Davis who went on to have a solid AFL season in 2016 with the Gold Coast Suns.

Riggio had a slightly slow start the season averaging just 16.5 possessions over the first month but for the remaining 16 matches he averaged 28 disposals. In that time, he never had less than 19 touches in a game and had it 30 or more times on seven occasions.

The 140-game WAFL veteran also represented WA in 2016 in the 134-point state game victory over Tasmania at Steel Blue Oval.

He is now a dual fairest and best winner to go with a 2010 premiership player, and is on target to earn Swan Districts life membership

Faulkner cemented himself as a mainstay of the Swans' midfield in 2016 with the best and most consistent season of his career. He averaged 26.7 possessions a game and had 23 or more disposals and every match during the season bar two to highlight his consistency.

Ricky Cary was presented with the Ted Holdsworth Memorial after being Swan Districts' leading goalkicker for the season, booting 21 goals from 13 games.

The RA Newby Award for Rookie of the Year went to Jesse Turner who ended up equal fourth in fairest and best voting.

The Jack Hickling Memorial Award was presented to courageous big man Jake Nuich who overcame a cancer scare to come back to play late in the 2016 season.

Swan Districts' reserves fairest and best award was won by Ben Whitsed who took out the Sweetapple Memorial Award.

Tobe Watson was named the colts fairest and best winner for 2016 as he was presented with the EJ McManus Award.

Swan Districts' women's team won the WAWFL premiership in 2016 and their fairest and best winner was Kara Donnellan who was presented with the Mandy McSherry Medal.

There was plenty of good news for Swan Districts as the black-andwhites look to bounce back with a bang in 2017.

# HALL of FAME 1934-2016

### SPECIAL INDUCTION: 1961 PREMIERSHIP TEAM

There was a special feeling in the air at Bassendean Oval before the commencement of the 1961 WANFL season, hard to describe, but a buzz of excitement and anticipation in a club that had finished last the previous season.

Swans President Percy Bright, Secretary Tom Moiler and a proactive committee had surprised the football world by securing rover Haydn Bunton Jr., already a respected coach from South Australia, to take over the coaching role for 1961. The son of football's greatest player, Victorian Haydn Bunton Sr., Haydn Bunton Jr. already had a West Australian connection through his father who played for Subiaco from 1938-41, winning three Sandover Medals to add to his three Brownlow Medals won in 1931-32 and 1935.

In another major recruiting coup, Swans had snared 19-year-old rover, Narembeen farmer Bill Walker, a player that all WAFL clubs had expressed an interest in. The quiet, determined and extremely skillful Walker initially came to Swans just to play the 1961 season and establish himself as a league footballer, seemingly oblivious to the challenges ahead in such a poorly rated side, that had won just 2 games in 1960.

Bunton brought to Swans a new style of play that included plenty of back up and running through for the handpass, plenty of handball and an early dictum that no-one apart from Keith Slater and Joe Lawson were allowed to do drop kicks. This later rule was gradually relaxed as the season progressed and Bunton himself became quite the drop kick exponent by year end.

Bunton however did not just change the way Swans played their footy. He was responsible for the introduction of the 'Fighting Swan' logo onto the jumpers and replaced the hooped black 'n' white socks with all black socks. These changes seemingly had an immediate psychological effect on the players, members and

Club CEO Tom Bottrell said of the event, "Swan Districts Football Club's inaugural Hall of Fame was one of the best football functions I have had the pleasure of attending. Certainly being involved in the planning and selection process gave me a deeper insight into the extraordinary careers of, not just the inductees, but many that were desperately unlucky not to be selected. Having grown up around a football club and with a long history in the WAFL, it was a pleasure to listen to some of the icons of Western Australian football as they accepted their induction.

As one of our zoned country clubs, we would also like to congratulate the South Bunbury Football Club on their inaugural Hall of Fame function in 2016. SDFC President, Peter Hodyl, and myself attended what was a highly successful evening, as the heartbeat of one of the most successful football clubs in Australia was on display".

supporters, giving the club a strong identity that had perhaps been somewhat lacking in previous years.

In 1961 a total of 36 players played League football with Swans. The team had a good nucleus of experienced players from the previous season; these included Brian Gray, Wally Brown, Keith Slater, Joe Lawson, Cyril Litterick, Colin Maynard, Tony Nesbit, Ken Bagley, Dave Thompson and Fred Castledine, these players were all experienced League footballers and had completed 'their apprenticeships.' In fact, the backline in the 1961 premiership side was the same backline that played for Swans in 1960!

Haydn Bunton was astute enough to utilise their talents, plus those of many others, including John Turnbull, John Mack,

Lindsay Johnston, Max Ashworth, Keith Watt, Craig Noble, and Tony Sangalli. Tasmanian centreman, Max ("Count") Kelleher was coaxed west from North Hobart specifically to provide some midfield strength at bounce downs. He became an integral part of the strong Swans side and also coached our Reserves.

Swans started the 1961 season in tentative fashion, defeating Perth by four points but then lost to East Perth the following week by 26 points. In a season where the team recorded losses in all three qualifying games to East Perth, the club eventually finished the qualifying rounds with 12 wins (and two draws) and second position on the League ladder. The campaign for Swans' first grand final and Premiership started poorly with a loss to East Perth in the second semi-final by 48 points. However, Swans bounced back well with a victory against Subiaco in the preliminary final by 16 points, setting up a Grand Final against East Perth, a team later described by Bunton as one that Swans could only beat once.

History records that on the following Saturday (October 7th 1961) history was made, as Swans recorded their first Grand Final victory against all popular perceptions. This was because the Grand Final was expected to be an East Perth cakewalk, as they had lost only two games in the season.

Swan Districts Premiership win in 1961 saw them become the first WANFL League club to win a Premiership after finishing last in the previous season.

There is no doubt that Swans' victory was as much to do with strategy as sheer determination. Swans ruckman, Keith Slater, playing with a broken rib from the second semi-final and a steely determination to nullify East Perth great Polly Farmer through a

ruck strategy in partnership with Fred Castledine, Cyril Litterick and tireless ruck-rover Tony Nesbit, played a magnificent game and was awarded the 1961 Grand Final Simpson Medal.

In the pressure of the 1961 Grand Final, first-year rover Bill Walker was Swans' most effective player with team statistics revealing that 12 of 18 kicks were effective, including kicking 5 goals and 5 points.

In an era when players seldom tallied more than 20 kicks, Haydn Bunton had 25, Johnny Mack 23, Ken Bagley 21 and Max Kelleher 20, with Wally Brown close behind on 19, to all be prolific ball getters. Full-back Joe Lawson, who possessed one of the best drop-kicks in the game, found teammates 11 times from his 15 kicks.

Full forward Lindsay Johnston's brace of three goals in a short space of time seemingly rattled East Perth's defence for a period. Ken Bagley's impassable display at centre half back was a great way to celebrate his 21st birthday, despite the treatment he received from the opposition. Colin Maynard in the back pocket and Dave Thompson on the half-back flank proved to be fierce defenders as always. Experienced wingman Brian Gray, and forwards Keith Watt and Max Ashworth were effective and prominent, and the history making team were ably supported by the two ever reliable reserves, Craig Noble and Tony Sangalli.

It was a true team effort and for Swans to come from last to first in one season was testament to the new found winning attitude at the club, the product of a masterful coach and a playing group that believed in themselves and saw no limit to what could be achieved. As the Sunday Times proclaimed, it was "The Greatest Upset in League History": a most fitting way to claim the club's first ever Premiership.

An outstanding junior career at the Forrestfield Rhinos led to selection for WA State 16's and subsequently the State 18's. He quickly locked down a permanent forward position at senior level with Swans, with his finals series in 2010 being of the highest standard.

5 goals in the preliminary propelled us into the Grand Final and his contribution in the 1pt victory was significant, finishing with 18 touches, a goal and 6 typically crunching tackles.

# SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

### **Basis of Accounting**

The financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 2015 (WA). The committee has determined that the club is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non - current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

### Income Tax

The Club is not subject to income tax and as such there is no provision for income tax payable.

### Property, Plant and Equipment

Depreciation on Buildings and Club House Improvements is calculated on a prime cost basis so as to write off the net cost of the fixed assets over its expected useful life of 25 years. It is anticipated that existing Buildings and Club House Improvements will be fully written off by 31st October 2022.

Depreciation on Plant and Equipment and Motor Vehicles is calculated on a diminishing value or prime cost basis so as to write off the net cost of each fixed asset over its expected useful life.

At the end of each reporting period, the committee review the carrying amount of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income statement

### Inventories

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Leases are classified at their inception as either operating or finance leases based on the economic substance of the agreement so as to reflect the risks and benefits incidental to ownership.

### Operatina leases

The minimum lease payments of operating leases, where the lessor effectively retains substantially all of the risks and benefits of ownership of the leased item, are recognised as an expense on a straight line basis.

### Finance leases

Leases which effectively transfer substantially all of the risks and benefits incidental to ownership of the leased item to the club are capitalised at the present value of the minimum lease payments and disclosed as motor vehicles under lease. A lease liability of equal value is also recognised.

Capitalised lease assets are depreciated over the shorter of the estimated useful life of the assets and the lease term. Minimum lease payments are allocated between interest expense and reduction of the lease liability with the interest expense calculated using the interest rate implicit in the lease and charged directly to profit and loss.

### **Employee Entitlements**

Provision is made for annual leave estimated to be payable to employees on the basis of statutory and contractual requirements. Vested entitlements are classified as current liabilities. The contributions made to superannuation funds by the Club are charged against profit.

### Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the club has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be readily measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with the original maturities of three months or less.

# **Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors**

Accounts receivable are recognised and carried forward at the original invoice amount less any provision for any uncollectible debts. An estimate for doubtful debts is made when collection of full amount is no longer probable. Bad Debts are written off as incurred.

### **Revenue and Other Income**

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive the dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, amounts are carried forward to be matched with expenditure in regard to those grants. All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST)

# Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST. The net amount of GST recoverable form, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the balance sheet.

### **Financial Assets**

investments in financial assets are recognised at cost which includes transaction costs.

### Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the club during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability. 2016 2015

The Club has had an outstanding amount in regard to a shortfall in Superannuation Guarantee contributions (SGC) together with penalties and interest imposed by the ATO from an audit in 2010/11. Whilst the shortfall in SGC has been repaid, the ATO imposed Aprt 7 penalties have been in dispute with the Club for many years. Following a foraml appeal process in the latter half of 2016, the Club received written confirmation from ATO in January 2017 advising that the appeal was successful and all Part 7 penalties and interest have been waived.

As a result, the taxation liability raised in previous years has been reduced by \$109,866 to reflect the amount owing.
