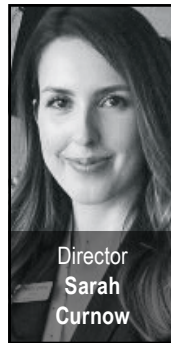

CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

The 2018 season presented many highlights for the club that all Swans supporters can be very proud of. Whilst the season didn't see our men's League side reach the finals, our Reserves, Colts and all three Women's teams played in the finals, with our Colts losing the grand final by only 2 points.



The club continues its transformation to meet the significant challenges Swans and the WAFL faces. It's essential we keep faith with the club's vision and strategy to ensure Swans remain relevant, builds a new generation of fans and is financially sustainable. This strategy will continue to transform the club from a traditional football focussed club to a more outward-looking engaged community enabler.

The club's purpose is to build community and develop people. The vision is to be a well-connected and community-engaged football club which improves social outcomes and the sense of wellbeing within the wider Swans community. The club's values that provide the foundation to deliver this aspiration include – we act with integrity, everyone matters, raise the bar (to be the best person you can), and we fly together (an old Swans catch cry representing loyalty to family, friends and club).

The club's strategic pillars are developing people, building community, business sustainability and developing a strong football program.

The future relevance of Swans won't come from mainstream media, but rather a strong symbiotic connection with community. The club continues to widen its scope of influence and building social capital by developing community through a collaborative approach with a wide and varied group of partners. This year we created the following community driven working committees.

Swans Aboriginal Advisory Committee (SAAC) – chaired by Cheryl Thomas the committee is responsible for building the club's capacity to deliver community programs that improve social outcomes and sense of wellbeing in the Swans Aboriginal community including education, employment and football player retention outcomes. The committee delivered a very successful NAIDOC home game this year, secured funding for a 16 week program working with Aboriginal teenagers at risk, and is in the process of renewing the club's Reconciliation Action Plan.

Disability Advocacy Inclusion Sub-committee (DIAS) – chaired by Eliza Harrison the committee is responsible for providing a safe and inclusive environment at Steel Blue Oval where people with disability can feel valued, have a sense of belonging and have social connections with others in the Swans community. This season the committee delivered an amazing Count Me In home game including an Integrated football game prior to the League game.

Swans Youth Committee – chaired by Jim Benson the committee is responsible for helping the club connect with youth through programs building a sense of belonging to and reciprocity with community. The committee has been building community alliances to create, and in turn once funding is secured, deliver a program working with teenagers at risk from disconnecting from community.

I must send out a big thank you to Cheryl Thomas, Eliza Harrison and Jim Benson for their untiring support in this very important transformative work. Next season will see us extend our community outreach by establishing community working committees in the seniors and multicultural areas.

Financially we continue to work on increasing operating profit, improving accountability and transparency, and realigning our resource allocation with the club's new vision and strategic plan. We're also continuing to build the balance sheet by increasing cash reserves and creating strategies to develop a sustainable economic model by diversifying the club's revenue opportunities.

Our match day activation has also transformed in our effort to build the next generation of Swans fans. This season we've had an Integrated football game and also a Swans League female football game immediately prior to League games. We've also created a new home game value proposition including various food and drink offers, buskers at the entry gates, interactive competitions on the ground at half time and a Swans Play Zone providing free games, activities and competitions for the kids at every home game.

Phil Smart continues to be a strong and committed advocate and performer for the club. As the club's Football Manager, he's responsible for all football operations including the senior men's teams, the new men's talent development program and the club's very successful women's program.

Head Coach Adam Pickering and his coaching and support staff have all been unyielding throughout the year to ensure our players performed at their very best. While the League narrowly missed out in the finals, we're very happy with the progress Adam and his team have made.



Congratulations to Tony Notte for winning the 2018 prestigious Swan Medal and also the WAFL Mark of the Year. A special mention to Mitch Bain for winning the WAFL Goal of the Year with an incredible run almost the length of the oval in his debut game. We say farewell to a club stalwarts Kirk Ugle and Todd Banfield who retired this season. Kirk must also be recognised for reaching his 100 game milestone.

Greg Harding and his very loyal and hard-working assistants worked tirelessly with the club's Colts and Academy programs. The success of our Colts is a strong endorsement of the depth of quality coaches and player talent in our football program. Greg has black and white running through his veins and we're delighted that he'll take on the role as the club's Talent Manager in 2019.

This season Nic Graves was replaced by Kara Donnellan as the women's head coach mid-season. Both have been instrumental in building depth in all three squads ensuring they were in the finals again. It's essential the club continues to invest in our women's football program because it will play an increasingly significant role in the club's future.

Kara Donnellan was appointed the Manager of V Swans in December 2017. Kara and her staff at V Swans have again achieved amazing social outcomes in the club's community program throughout the Pilbara. Our regional staff in Onslow, Roebourne, Port Hedland and Newman are to be congratulated for their tireless work delivering several school and community programs that improve the lives of so many people.



The club continues to work closely with the Department of Communities, WA Football Commission and Town of Bassendean on a Business Case to redevelop the club's current football club facilities. The plan is to create a design that is more than a traditional football club. It will be a community hub servicing the needs of the Swans community and our future football programs.

Thank you to the unstinting work of the administration team. Ross, Jenny, Jess, Jim, Lucy and Gerard have been tireless in their efforts in supporting the club's vision, values and strategic pillars. They all need to be commended for their commitment and loyalty to the club and their respective jobs.

It is a privilege to be able to provide a Football Report for the 2018 Annual Report. The end of the 2017 football season saw Greg Harding, our league coach for the past eight seasons retire. The Board of Directors put in place a process to appoint a new coach for the 2018 season. After an Australian wide advertisement campaign and several interviews, Adam Pickering was appointed the new league coach, beating several highly ranked coaches.

With the continued vision of "Develop Our Own and Promote From Within" Adam's impact on the football club, and more importantly the players was immediate with a new focus for pre-season training being weights and the development of a new game plan. With a very young list to work with, all seventy or so senior squad members bought in to the pre-season program. By game one the players were ready to go and Adam's debut as a league coach ended with a forty-five-point win against Perth.

As Adam has highlighted in his report, at the half way mark the league team was well entrenched in the top five and looking forward to possibly some finals action. The reserves on the other hand were the complete opposite. After a difficult start to the year, they were now starting to find some form. Our Reserves Coach at this time, Daniel Wulf, had just stepped down due to pressing family reasons, and the club would sincerely like to thank Daniel for his commitment to our club in the first half of the year. Mitch Burgess, who had been assisting Adam in the league side, and Daniel in the reserves stepped up to coach for the remainder of the year.

The season continued to fly by and as Adam has outlined, the league team were challenged towards the end of the season, both with injuries and loss of form. However the positiveness of the group and the debuting of several young players points to a bright future for our football club. The reserves and colts continued to push for a finals berth, and even up to round 19 our league side could have stolen a spot in the top 5. At the end of the day it was a disappointing conclusion to the league season finishing 8th with 6 wins and 12 losses, although the many positives to come out of the season will be evident as we challenge for a top 5 spot in 2019.

The reserves managed to secure a top 5 spot with 9 wins and 9 losses, and after tasting finals football I am sure that a core group of reserves players will be pushing for league selection. Our colts finished 3rd with 10 wins and 8 losses and their performance in the Grand Final has been well documented. A core group of colts and reserves players have already started a pre-season program to develop their strength over the summer period and I know we will see them return to the track late January fitter and stronger than this year. I would like to at this stage thank the Past Players and Officials for their significant contribution in providing morning tea for all supporters at our home colts games.

As the Director of Football, I would like to acknowledge all of the commitment and sacrifice of our coaches and support staff that goes in to putting competitive teams out on the field. Being part of this team is not a "part time" commitment and on behalf of the club I would like to sincerely thank you, especially the many volunteers who turn up week in week out to training and game day. To our League Coach, Adam Pickering and his assistants, Mitch Burgess, Reserves Coach and Greg Harding Colts Coach, thank you for season 2018. The Football Department, Phil Smart and Mick Moylan, thank you for the often unseen work that you do behind the scenes, and we wish Mick all the best on his move to Geelong to be closer to family. To the coterie groups who continue to support our club through fundraising and sponsorship to assist in attracting players to our club, thank you. To the Board of Directors, and especially President Peter Hodyl, thank you for your relentless drive to ensure that our football club continues to have relevance in the WAFL and remains competitive across all three grades of senior football and the grades of junior football commencing with the under 14's development program.

Finally, but not least, thank you to our many loyal supporters who week in week out show their loyalty to the Black and White. Your support is what makes this great club. As with all members I can't wait for the 2019 football season to commence.

FINANCE & RISK COMMITTEE REPORT

COMMITTEE

The Committee comprises Des Hardiman (Chair), Peter Hodyl, Peter Snow, Neville Bassett, Jeff Dennis and Gerard Roelofs. Meetings were held monthly one week prior to the Board.

KEY OBJECTIVES

To align with the new Strategic Plan (2018-2022) under the Business Sustainability pillar, the committee now includes risk under its responsibilities and changed its name to Finance & Risk. With the support of the Board and the leadership of the CEO, a very clear financial discipline has been implemented over the past two years with the objective of correcting the Balance Sheet current ratio deficit, diversifying revenue opportunities and building a sustainable economic model for the future.

NEW DEVELOPMENTS/ACHIEVEMENTS

The following items were addressed and discussed in committee during 2018:

- The WAFL implemented a new standardised Chart of Accounts from November 2017 and whilst it took some time to bed-down the new GL codes and monthly reports, it is now working well. The MYOB accounts comprise eight 'job centres' to enable each division of the Club to provide its own P&L each month.
- The appointment of Gerard Roelofs as Finance Manager and increasing from three to four days per week to adequately service the \$4.7m turnover and accounts.
- Staff long service leave and annual leave accruals have been reconciled and correctly recorded in the Balance Sheet.
- The Debtors process has been tightened resulting in Aged Debtors reducing from \$236,000 to \$78,000 at year end and mainly in the current month ageing.
- Risk has been activated, reviewed and assessed, is now a monthly reporting item at committee level.
- Home Game and events are reconciled by the Operations staff after each event, providing the Finance & Risk committee with relevant data and ratios.
- The CEO was actively involved in financial modelling for the new Talent program, the introduction of a 10th WAFL team and the proposed WAFLW competition. Swans were active participants in the scrutiny and final improved position in all cases.
- Improved audit process and preparation of accounts resulting in a smoother audit and clearly understood Balance Sheet and accounts to be presented in the Annual Report.
- The Financial Statements will reflect the major Income and Expenditure accounts with a comparison to the previous year adjusted to reflect the new Chart of Accounts.

RESULT

The result for the year is a healthy surplus of \$62,199 after depreciation (last year \$34,723). This result is significant considering the improvements to the Balance Sheet position through additional payments for termination payments for long serving staff (\$102,000) and final repayment of the long-standing taxation debt and penalties (\$62,600)

BALANCE SHEET IMPROVEMENTS

A critical strategic focus over recent years has been the improvement to the Current Ratio. This measures the ability to meet the current liabilities with sufficient cash and other current assets. This deficit was over \$750,000 five years ago. At the end of 2018 it is -\$279,000. It will cause reason to celebrate, when we bring this back to zero in the next year or two! The Net Assets (Total Equity) have increased from \$138,600 to \$196,500 this financial year.

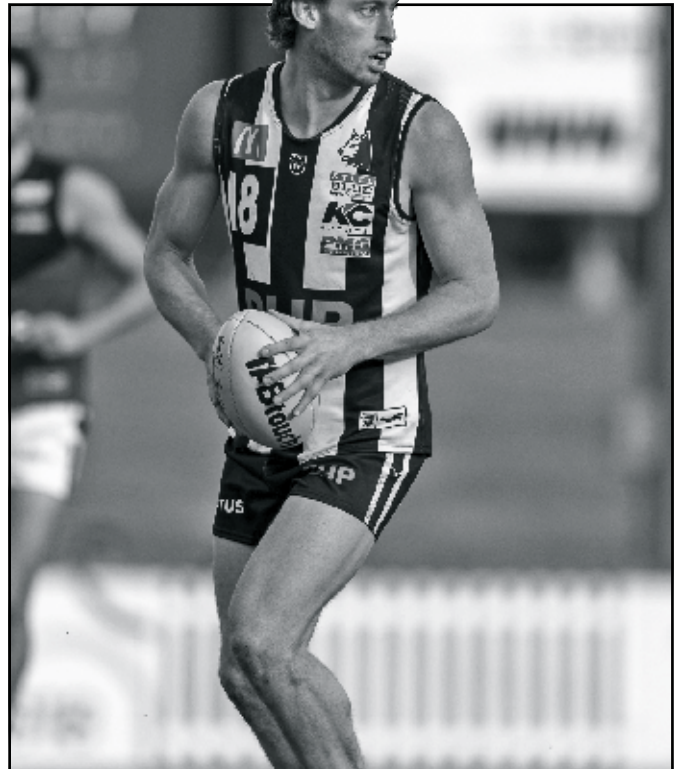

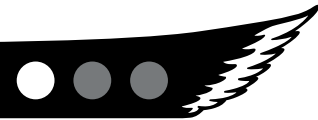

The start of 2018 saw staffing changes and changes in our Perth office portfolios. Nicole Graves, a stalwart of V Swans and Swan Districts Football Club has moved on to new opportunities in the AFLW. We thank and acknowledge Nicole for fantastic achievements during her time at the helm, and welcomed our new Manager V Swans, Kara Donnellan.

During this year we have not slowed down and have continued to increase our presence both in Perth and the North West with programs continuing to grow in our Pilbara region, we have extended our Strength 2 Succeed (S2S) Female Football and Netball Development Programs into Hedland in 2018. With 14 staff permanently based in the Pilbara and another four in Perth all working to bring the V Swans Active Education Framework to our communities.

With our social media presence directly connecting with over 13,000 followers across our programs and regions.

V SWANS HIGH PERFORMANCE AND COMMUNITY – MAJOR PARTNERS WAFC, WEST COAST EAGLES FC

During this reporting period we saw Kara Donnellan move from High Performance and Justice Manager to Manager V Swans taking over the role from Nicole Graves. Shane Beros returned to Perth at the start of 2018 and took on the role of High Performance and Community Manager, after working in Hedland for the last five years as our Active Education Development Manager where he successfully managed the V Swans Kicking Goals and developed the Hedland Reds junior football program. Shane will be a major loss to the Hedland team and community, but he is a bonus for the Perth team. Cheryl Thomas our Senior Administration Manager has continued to bring her wealth of knowledge and wisdom to the business, having a positive impact to our community both in the Pilbara and in Perth.

Once again V Swans managed the Female Football Program, including membership, training, coaching, merchandise and events. Half way through this year we lost Nicole Graves to the Carlton Football Club as General Manager of AFLW, we will miss her dedication to Female Football at our club. Nicole leaving meant that we needed to make changes half way through the season, this saw Kara Donnellan take over the role of head coach. All three teams made the semi-finals but could not go any further. We continued to have AFLW success with another five Swans women drafted to clubs around Australia taking our three-year tally to 20 AFLW draftees.

During the year, V Swans lost the Department of Corrective Services contract, this project was our men's Amateur football team operating out of Wooroloo Prison Farm. This provided us an opportunity to restructure in our Perth office by adding Community. Community will be an extension of the V Swans community work in the Pilbara that will be part of the Swans in the Community work for the Perth region. It will include community programs that will work with the following groups- Aboriginal, Youth, People with Disabilities and Seniors.

Some of the successful outcomes for this year:

HIGH PERFORMANCE

- The WA North West Academy Program, in partnership with WAFC, this year saw the participants from the Pilbara invited to Perth for a four-day camp which included accommodation at Guildford Grammar, educational sessions, masterclass training sessions, a tour of the West Coast Eagles facilities and a game to finish the camp off. Jahmal Daly was talent identified on this program and went on to play representative football for the WA State 16's this year.

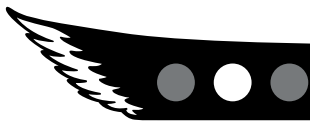
- In 2018 we were invited into Acacia Prison and conducted a 10-week fitness program. This may see V Swans in more private run Serco prisons in the future, to continue our program work within correctional facilities.
- The club attended a Football Carnival at Punmu, for talent ID. The outcome from this event is – three boys attending 14/15 talent program, two boys attending colts pre-season, five girls attending Naitanui S2S Academy program in Dampier in November. Swans also provided certificates of appreciation to the organising committee of the local carnival, to recognise their hard work for a successful carnival. This is a result of the work Shane did liaising with Ngurra Kujungka and the Martu community.
- Strength to Succeed [S2S], this is the V Swans participant fee-based program, all participants receive specialist coaching for their chosen sport. This year has seen the addition of S2S Netball in Hedland. This year saw 4 S2S participants make state football representation.
- Another successful S2S Female Cultural and Leadership Tour this year. V Swans staff travelled with 19 girls from the Pilbara and Perth to Alice Springs for the 7-day tour. We would like to thank the local communities for sharing their time and communities with all of us.

COMMUNITY

- The Swans in the Community program includes several active community working groups including the Swans Community Steering Committee, Swans Aboriginal Advisory Committee, Swans Disability Inclusion Advocacy Sub-committee and a Swans Youth Committee.
- Each committee has members that include subject matter specialists from our region and local community including local shires, government departments, business and school representation, to ensure that we are inclusive and holistic in our planning and decision making moving forward.
- Mentoring programs in Swan View Primary School – delivered by Shane Beros and young Aboriginal Female leaders and role models within our community.
- Developing a 'Youth at Risk' program that will start in November 2018, re-engaging and re-connecting local Aboriginal males and females back to their family, community, culture, and school.
- Developing partnerships with local high schools including Swan View Senior High School, Kiara College and others within the Swans catchment area.
- First public National Reconciliation Week event, with special guest speaker Jim Morrison, Executive Director of Yokai.
- NAIDOC week events in the community, included participating in Shire of Mundaring event, City of Swan event and Town of Bassendean event .
- NAIDOC Billboard Competition with local primary school students from St Michael's Primary School, with winner, nine-year-old - Stacey Blurton's artwork now on display at Steel Blue Oval.



- We also held our very own NAIDOC home game vs Perth. This year it included for the first time in club history, a female league match alongside our men's league and reserves matches at Steel Blue Oval. This year we introduced our first NAIDOC playing jumper for our Female Football Program, designed by local Aboriginal artist – Kylie Graham. The Welcome to Country was performed by Robyn Collard, along with a traditional dance performance from a number of students from Kiara College Girls Academy and West Beechboro Primary School. A half-time traditional Marngrook game with local Aboriginal boys and girls was a highlight of the day. The Legends luncheon on the day included special guest speakers; Rishelle Hume AM and Dr Cheryl Kickett-Tucker, with Bindi Bindi caterers.
- This year Swans held the Integrated football match, this included 40 training on our ground before the main game.
- Swans Big Campout in partnership with The Fathering Project, providing an overnight camping experience at Steel Blue oval including many fun activities to enjoy with family and friends.

V SWANS HEDLAND AND NEWMAN – MAJOR PARTNERS BHP & DEPARTMENT OF THE PRIME MINISTER AND CABINET

This region has partnerships more than 17 & 11 years with BHP and the Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet have provided the Pilbara Region and indeed V Swans and the Club with a business model envied by many WAFL clubs. These partnerships have built a business hub for the Club that has ensured our viability and success as one of the regions most trusted community providers. With over 220 students enrolled in the Kicking & Shooting Goals Program across the two High schools it is the largest regional Football and Netball Program in Australia. These programs are fully integrated into the PE curriculum at the schools, meaning our program does not sit separately from the curriculum it is the curriculum. With students graduating in each program with multiple Certificate II and a host of coaching, first aid and umpiring qualifications. With full classes in all levels from Year 7 to Year 12 at both Hedland and Newman Senior High Schools this program is a very popular and vital outcome for the schools in this region.

Again, more staffing changes. Our Hedland team change-over included the farewell of Shane Beros, Cindy Hackett, Shaquade Smith and trainee Ashlee Ward, we thank them for their time at V Swans Hedland. Steve Thomson started in Hedland this year as the Active Education Development Manager taking over from Shane Beros. Everyone at the club will know Steve, he was the Talent Manager at Swans for the last 6 years. We also added Emma McSweeney to the Hedland team as our Active Education Administrator, who brings a wealth of knowledge and experience in the health and fitness domain. This year saw our Regional Manager Tracey Swami reach 10 years' service with V Swans, your long-term dedication to your community is fantastic. Given all the movement of staff, our programs continued smoothly. Many thanks to Hedland team for your effort.

Newman staff remained consistent this reporting period, Paul Pitchers and Callie Walker continued to manage the Newman Programs, overseeing our successful school-based trainee program, which saw Breanna Shuttleworth finish in December 2017 and Tina Jacobs start in February 2018.

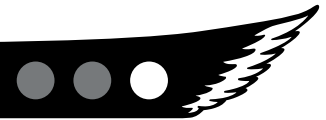

Tony Notte cemented his legacy as a great of the Swan Districts Football Club by winning his second Swan Medal during a memorable night celebrating the 2018 season at the picturesque Mandoon Estate on Friday night.

Over 200 club supporters were on hand at Mandoon Estate in the Swan Valley on Friday to witness the medal counts for the colts, reserves and league teams at Swan Districts for the 2018 season culminating in Tony Notte winning his second Swan Medal.

It was a tremendous night celebrating the 2018 season that saw two of the three grades at Swan Districts reaching the finals with the reserves reaching a first semi-final against Claremont while the colts had a stirring run all the way to the Grand Final, falling just two points short of a stunning premiership.

The awards night also included Freddie Clutterbuck being named fairest and best for the reserves and Mitchell Bain for the colts while Matt Riggio received his life membership having reached 150 games, and the careers of the retired Kirk Ugle and Todd Banfield were also celebrated.

The night continued to highlight what a tremendous servant of the Swan Districts Football Club Tony Notte is as he won his second Swan Medal.

Whether playing up forward as a marking target, pinch-hitting in the ruck or in his most regular role at centre half-back where he is the best intercept mark in the competition, Notte has now put together a remarkable 219-game league career at Swan Districts.

The 28-year-old made his debut for Swan Districts back in 2008, playing in the Grand Final of that year, and he has never looked back going on to become one of the finest servants in black-and-white who is showing no signs of slowing down.

Notte had another outstanding 2018 season playing a variety of roles for Swan Districts averaging 13.8 disposals and 5.8 marks again showing tremendous durability and consistency by playing every match.

His durability is now becoming the stuff of legends with Notte having played 144 consecutive matches. The last games he missed were the final three of the 2011 season.

Notte is a regular high up in Swan Medal voting and now has the 2018 award to go with his triumph of 2013 having also been runner-up to Corey Gault in 2017.

By finishing as runner-up in Swan Medal voting and claiming the Norm Thomas Memorial Award and also the RA Newbey Award as Rookie of the Year, it was a tremendous recognition of the season Watson had.

Having found his way into the league side late in 2017, including the finals campaign, he took the next step in 2018 becoming a key member of the Swans team starting in the back-line before spending time in the midfield and even up forward on occasion.

Backing up his Swan Medal victory of 2017, Gault finished in third-place in 2018 voting after a season where he spent the majority of his season as a key forward before ending the season down back and also backing up Nathan Blakely in the ruck.

Speaking of Blakely, his season was a tremendous success after two years out of the WAFL and that was recognised with him receiving the Jack Hickling Memorial Award as the Most Outstanding Player on and off the field.

There were plenty of experienced campaigners in Swan Districts' reserves team for much of 2018 and that was highlighted in the award winners with 137-game WAFL veteran Freddie Clutterbuck winning the FA Bonney Sweetapple Memorial Award as the fairest and best.

Clutterbuck polled 70 votes to win ahead of another league veteran of 120 matches, Adam Faulkner (63) in front of Ethan Maguire (53), Callum Garcia (51), Brandon Erceg (49), Jack O'Sullivan (47), Albert Dean (44), Levi Ridley (40), Brad Fullgrabe (36), Mitchell Bain (35), Mitch Mackenzie (34), Aaron Wheeler (34) and Tom Whittle (33).

Swan Districts' colts turned out to be the great success story of 2018 with new coach Greg Harding leading them all the way to the Grand Final at Optus Stadium where they came ever so close to coming home with premiership glory against Subiaco.

The colts season was celebrated with Mitchell Bain claiming the EJ McManus Award as fairest and best winner to go with a season where he also played reserves and league football, and won the Goal of the Year Award for his stunning running effort in his league debut in Round 21.

He polled 135 votes to claim the colts fairest and best award ahead of Kade Wallrodt (103), Denzel More (74), Jackson Beck (68), Patrick Farrant (61), Riley Garcia (59), Joe Hinder (59), Harry Edwards (58), Atem Deng (55), Seb Bright (54), Jarrod Cameron (53), Graydon Wilson (36), Matthew Germs (24), Ben Taylor (22), Jaygar Martin (18) and Brenton Hilton (18).

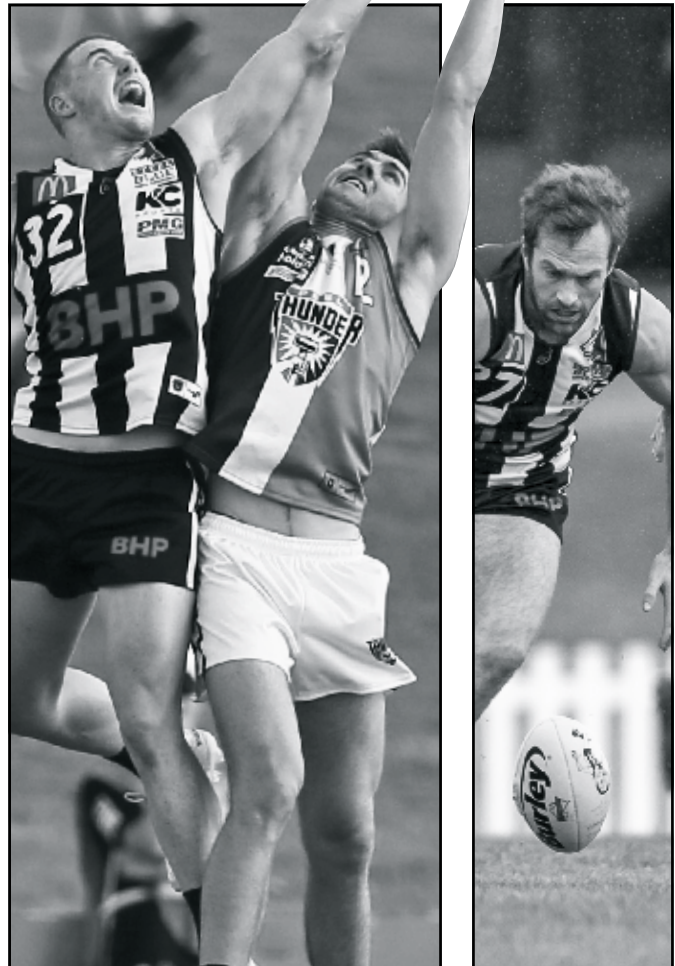

The fact we won the inside 50 count by almost 20 was testimony to being a little wasteful.

The Subiaco players were outstanding as well and deserve credit for the way they went about the entire season.

The ending of the game was marred by a substantial breach of the rules and guidelines under which we play. To the players and parents, all I can offer is a simple explanation that the club and the players showed great integrity and we weren't supported as we should have been.

It was an unfortunate scenario, but we cannot allow those final moments to define our season. From our perspective as a club, even in loss the players showed incredible character. There was genuine hurt after the match and that outpouring of emotion shows that the players care a lot about winning, their mates and their footy club.

I believe this group will produce a lot of WAFL players over the next few years on the back of the strong character that they showed for the entire year!

Each of our Swans boys carried themselves professionally wherever they played be it community, amateur, school, senior or state and I look forward to watching them progress in years to come.

Congratulations to the boys that were drafted into the AFL and now the grind starts for Tobe, Jarrod and Harry in the toughest footy environment there is.

Well done to the award winners in Kade Waldrodt, Denzel More and Mitch Bain. All three of these players are very talented, and more importantly A grade people.

Thank you to all that helped with the colts this year especially our Strength and Conditioning co-ordinator Jimmy Anile, property man Alan Hickling, Head Trainer Kaitlyn Meade and her amazing team and Physio Shelly Matcham. To Tonya and Sean, thank you for all your wonderful stats that you provide. It really does make a difference.

To the coaching staff, I can't thank them enough for their commitment to promoting talent within our club. Russell Wholagan and John Laurito have both been involved for over 10 years nurturing our youth and they both do a wonderful job. Percy Johnson, Tallan Ames and Shane Sanders also put in hours of work for little reward and deserve recognition.

Finally, we wish incoming colts coach Simon Bergin all the best of luck as he takes the colts into 2019. His teaching background and knowledge of our players is going to be a great strength that I'm sure will reap benefits for our club in the near future.

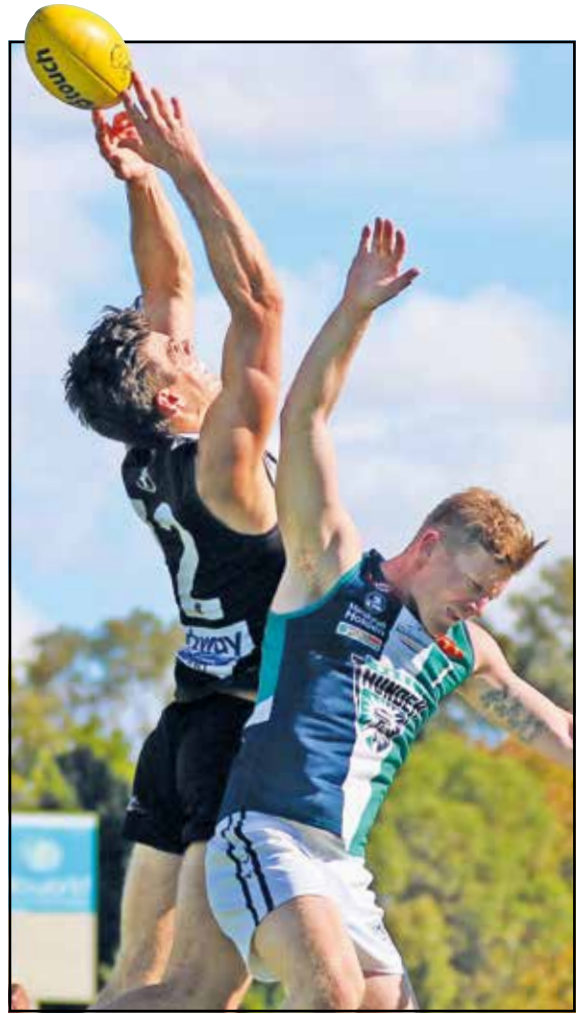

CONSTITUTION AND POLICY REVIEWS

A revised constitution in line with the new legislation was drafted after wide consultation and review. A copy is available on the Club website and a feedback session was held on August 23 for all members. Members will vote on the revised constitution at our upcoming AGM in February 2019.

Policy reviews were undertaken, and an audit committee has instigated a range of initiatives to streamline processes and put a compliance schedule in place for SDFC. OSH Inspections, Fire Inspections, risk management protocols and reviews of all insurance policies were undertaken.

Paul Murray facilitated a risk audit session for the Club on September 5 and a follow up session on November 21 to map out the process to update the club's risk management plan was held. A broad range of risks associated with the club including VSwans, facilities, finances, events and football programs were identified. These risks were evaluated and will lead to changes to our strategic planning in 2019.

COMMUNITY FOCUS

The Swans in the Community Youth committee instigated several initiatives to enhance the involvement of youth at our Club to help foster the next generation of Swans supporters. Community activities like the Big Campout have received great feedback as has the Kids Play Zone.

Four sessions on mental health via "Outside the Locker Room" have been conducted and next year it is planned to roll out the programme to other groups in the Club.

Strategic Planning and Activating Community initiatives were instigated. More community grant opportunities have been identified and applications are underway. A club-wide cultural survey was completed, and the positive results were encouraging.

OTHER INITIATIVES IN 2018

- A new Club website and new IT systems with better controls were instigated in 2018. IT management has improved with the focus on shared data files and an improved capability of the Club's server. Logins for all Board members to the Board portal on our server were also introduced to allow for remote access.
- Tightened liquor licensing requirements were enacted.
- The Club's branding and style guide were introduced. All coterie groups and staff were advised of the Club's new strategic initiatives to be further developed in 2019.
- KPI's for the CEO position were updated to support the role of the CEO.

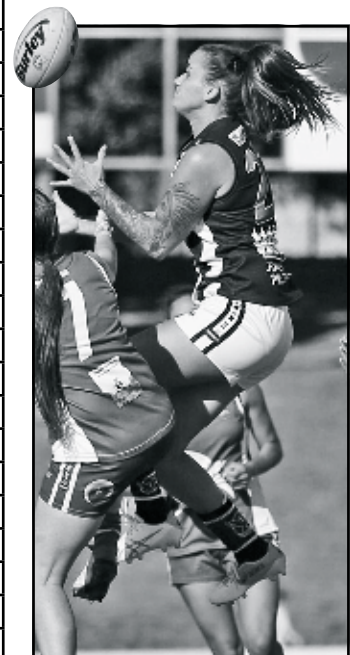

COMMITTEE

The Committee remained unchanged since last year and comprised Directors Peter Snow (Chairman) and Sarah Curnow and members Kylee Schoonens, Matt Hewitson and Paul Murray. President Peter Hodyl and the Club's CEO Jeff Dennis are ex-officio members of the Committee.

BASSEDEAN OVAL REDEVELOPMENT

As reported last year, the Department of Sport & Recreation and WA Football Commission has funded a "robust" Business Case aimed at not just providing football facilities, but incorporating commercial space that can assist in the sustainability of the football club in the long-term.

Although scheduled for completion in May, as has been the history of the project, the consultant's report it is expected to be delivered prior to year-end and publication of this report.

Once accepted by the Club and Bassendean Town Council, the case will be submitted to Treasury for review and submission to Cabinet. Then it is a matter of availability of state funds which, as we all know, are in short supply. One can hope that this project is a priority.

Considerable work has also been done on feasibilities for related commercial facilities that can complement our overall plan to be a leading community and sporting hub for the north eastern corridor.

Our CEO has worked tirelessly on establishing a good working relationship with the new councillors who did not appreciate the extent of Swans' significant community involvement. This has played a major part in gaining enthusiastic Council support for the redevelopment of the Club's facilities.

The Board recently signed the new 5 year license referred to in last year's report under which the Club will continue to have access to the Oval during football season.

Investigation has also been undertaken into the viability of installing higher grade lighting to improve the opportunities of evening use of the oval and surrounds and it is hoped that an application for grant funding to facilitate this can be made in 2019.

A grant application has been lodged to provide an improved ground audio system which should enhance the game day experience for all visitors and the outcome should be known by the time this report is published.

A substantial grant application has been lodged for the development of separate new female football facilities to improve the conditions for our 3 grades of female footballers. The outcome of this application should also be known by the time this report is published.

SWAN DISTRICTS FOUNDATION LTD

As mooted last year, the Swan Districts Foundation Ltd was established in June.

It is registered as a charity with the Australian Charities and Not for Profits Commission and has been granted GST and FBT concessions by the Australian Taxation Office. It is planned to make application for Deductible Gift Recipient status in 2019 allowing tax deductible donations.

The Board of the Foundation comprises Chairman Neville Bassett AM, Past Presidents Bill Walker AM and Jim Watterston along with Club President Peter Hodyl. It has been established as an independent entity with a view to long-term funding of capital works for the Club.

HERITAGE COMMITTEE & CLUB MUSEUM

During the year, representatives of the Swansmen and PP&OA under Chairman Des Hardiman work diligently on its program of recording and preserving club memorabilia and records. The Club Board has accepted the Committee's recommendation that it be renamed as the Heritage Committee to more correctly reflect its wider scope of activity. Major storage equipment was donated and installed during the year.

APPRECIATION

By now you would know that I did not seek re-election to the Board but I am pleased that my seat will be taken by Matt Hewitson - both on the Board and as Chairman of the Strategic Projects Committee. I am keen to see all our work on the redevelopment project over many years through to at least construction commencement and, with that in mind, have sought to remain on the Committee in 2019.

As my six-year stint (this time) on the Board concludes, I express my parting thanks to our CEO Jeff Dennis, the Board and my Committee for their enthusiastic contribution during the year.

I also say a big thank you to the Club's Coterie Groups for which I have had the privilege of being the Board's liaison Director for the last six years.

The financial and other support and co-operation from the Swan Districts Past Players & Officials Association Inc. (and its President John Rowe) and Swansmen Inc. (and its President Trevor Hoy) for our 2018 initiatives has been willingly given and greatly appreciated.

Special thanks also to Operations Manager Ross Leipold and his team of Jenny McBride and Jess Belladonna for their ongoing support and co-operation over many years.

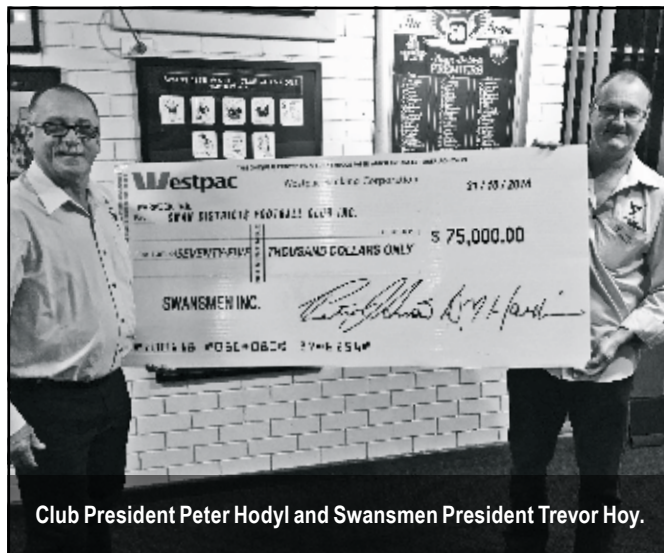

OPINION

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of Swan Districts Football Club Inc. (the club), which comprises the director's report, the balance sheet as at 31 October 2019, the income and expenditure statement and the statement of cash flows for the year then ended and notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, and the statement by directors.

In our opinion, subject for the effects, if any, of the qualification mentioned below, the financial report presents fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the club. as at 31 October 2018 and its financial performance for the year then ended in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial statements, and the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act of WA. and other appropriate Australian Accounting Standards.

QUALIFICATION

The Club, in common with other similar organisations, only records amounts received relating to voluntary activities when these amounts are banked as it is not practical to establish control over such income, prior to its initial entry in the accounting records. Our audit relating to such income was therefore limited to ensuring that the amounts banked are properly recorded in the financial statements. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on whether all receipts have been banked and we cannot determine the effects of such adjustments, if any, as might have been required had this limitation not existed.

GOING CONCERN

The accounts have been prepared on a going concern basis which is dependent on the continued financial support of The WA Football Commission and major sponsors. There is no reason that this will not be forthcoming.

BASIS OF OPINION

We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report section of our report. We are independent of the club in accordance with the ethical requirements of the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's APES 110: Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (the Code) that are relevant to our audit of the financial report in Australia. We have also fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

EMPHASIS OF MATTER – BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

We draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared to assist the club to meet the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act of WA and the Australian Charities and other appropriate Australian Accounting Standards. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

DIRECTOR'S RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE FINANCIAL REPORT

The directors of Swan Districts Football Club Inc. is responsible for the preparation of the financial report, and has determined that the basis of preparation described in Note 1 is appropriate to meet the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act of WA and other appropriate Australian Accounting Standards and is appropriate to meet the needs of the members. The director's responsibility also includes such internal control as the directors determines is necessary to enable the preparation of a financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial report, the directors is responsible for assessing the club's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters relating to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the directors either intends to liquidate the incorporation or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Financial Reporting Framework

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 2015 (WA). The Board has determined that the club is not a reporting entity.

Statement of Compliance

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the Associations Incorporation Act 2015 (WA), the basis of accounting specified by all Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of Accounting Standards AASB 101: Presentation of Financial Statements, AASB 107: Cash Flow Statements, AASB 108: Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors, AASB 1031: Materiality and AASB 1054: Australian Additional Disclosures.

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs. They do not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Income Tax

The Club is not subject to income tax and as such there is no provision for income tax payable.

(b) Property, Plant and Equipment

Depreciation on Buildings and Club House Improvements is calculated on a prime cost basis so as to write off the net cost of the fixed assets over its expected useful life of 25 years. It is anticipated that existing Buildings and Club House Improvements will be fully written off by 31st October 2022.

Depreciation on Plant and Equipment and Motor Vehicles is calculated on a diminishing value or prime cost basis so as to write off the net cost of each fixed asset over its expected useful life.

(c) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee review the carrying amount of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired.

If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income statement. SportsHero Limited Shares were revalued in 2017 and 2018.

(d) Inventories

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

(e) Leases

Leases are classified at their inception as either operating or finance leases based on the economic substance of the agreement so as to reflect the risks and benefits incidental to ownership.

Operating leases

The minimum lease payments of operating leases, where the lessor effectively retains substantially all of the risks and benefits of ownership of the leased item, are recognised as an expense on a straight line basis.

Finance leases

Leases which effectively transfer substantially all of the risks and benefits incidental to ownership of the leased item to the club are capitalised at the present value of the minimum lease payments and disclosed as motor vehicles under lease. A lease liability of equal value is also recognised.

Capitalised lease assets are depreciated over the shorter of the estimated useful life of the assets and the lease term. Minimum lease payments are allocated between interest expense and reduction of the lease liability with the interest expense calculated using the interest rate implicit in the lease and charged directly to profit and loss.

(f) Employee Entitlements

Provision is made for annual leave and long service leave estimated to be payable to employees on the basis of statutory and contractual requirements. Vested entitlements are classified as current liabilities.

The contributions made to superannuation funds by the Club are charged against profit.

(g) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the club has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be readily measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

(h) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with the original maturities of three months or less.

(i) Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable are recognised and carried forward at the original invoice amount less any provision for any uncollectible debts. An estimate for doubtful debts is made when collection of full amount is no longer probable. Bad Debts are written off as incurred.

(j) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive the dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, amounts are carried forward to be matched with expenditure in regard to those grants.

(k) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the balance sheet.

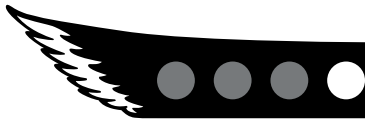
(l) Financial Assets

Investments in financial assets are recognised at current value.

(m) Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the club during the reporting period that remain unpaid.

The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.
