2006 PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It is with somewhat mixed feelings that I present this year's report to members. This has been a very successful year for the club and a second successive premierships would have provided a very satisfying conclusion. However, this was not to be and we congratulate Subiaco on their brilliant performances throughout the year.

There is no doubt that the highlight of the year was the unveiling of the John Gerovich statue at the Foundation Day Derby. To bring this project to fruition in such a short time required an enormous amount of work and organisation. Brian Ciccotosto did a wonderful job as team leader. We received terrific support from the City of Fremantle, especially Mayor Peter Tagliaferri and Councillor Geoff Graham. The largest WAFL home and away crowd of the year attended the game. Our thanks goes out to all those who contributed to the project.

This year our heritage night paid tribute to the South Fremantle players selected in the Indigenous Team of the Century. Stephen Michael, Nicky Winmar and Peter Matera received the accolades of the very large crowd in attendance. Neville Collard delivered a traditional Noongar welcome and Richard Walley's considerable talents contributed to this memorable evening.

The District Development model is now in its third season of operation and it is in this area that the most significant developments occurred. Thanks to the wonderful leadership, energy and enthusiasm of Rob Taylor and his DDC members we were able to further establish the club as a true "Centre of Excellence". It was very gratifying to hear so many junior and senior club officials talk with genuine pride on being part of the South Fremantle family. A number of new initiatives were adopted this year to further enhance this concept.

- John Dimmer took on the role of District Head Coach. He conducted seminars and coaching demonstrations in both the country and metropolitan areas and is currently producing a coaching DVD. All sessions were extremely well attended and were received with enthusiasm.
- The "Africans in Aussie Rules" programme, conducted as a pilot programme, saw 125 young people from Africa attend six sessions

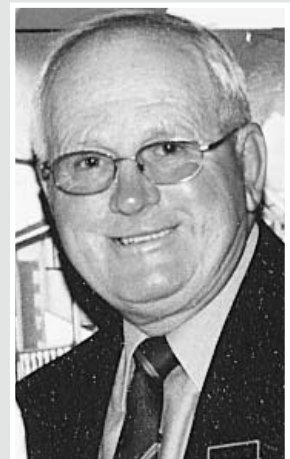
during which they were introduced to our great game.

- Thanks to sponsorship from the Bendigo Bank we were able to provide goal posts for seven district schools that did not have them.
- Supported by United Credit 1300 red and white footballs were purchased and given to every 9 – 13 year old registered in the District.
- The DDC has contributed to promote the value of volunteers by encouraging recognition of their efforts and the importance of developing skills through education. Cheryl Ward, DDC Secretary, was acknowledged as West Australia's volunteer of the year and on Sandover Medal night Cheryl was presented with a trip for two to the this year's AFL Grand Final.
- The importance of connecting junior clubs with the senior clubs in the district has continued to be developed to provide young players with a career pathway outside of AFL – WAFL. Some junior clubs have adopted the jumper colours of the nearest senior club, notably Kardinya (CBC Amateurs) and Mundijong.
- For the first time this year we also introduced the "Adopt a Charity" scheme which saw the club fund raise for Multiple Sclerosis and the Murdoch Hospice.

The South Fremantle Warriors continues to be the centrepiece of the club's development programme. This year a group of 15 year olds were taken to Melbourne on their annual tour. Warriors chairman, Jim Hurst, ably assisted by Graham Cornell and a very enthusiastic group of volunteers have ensured that we are now all singing from the same song sheet.

The club's policy of, wherever possible, appointing people with a South Fremantle background has certainly paid dividends with the appointment of Development Officers Bradd Gardiner and Jason Burton. They have worked most capably and enthusiastically in our zone including the newly allocated Carnarvon – Gascoyne region.

In conclusion I would like to thank the many volunteers who have contributed so much this year. Our coaching, medical and support staff have again been magnificent. To the people who assist with fund raising, food preparation,



organisation of social events and the myriad of other tasks necessary to run a successful football club our sincere thanks.

Again we have been well served by our administration staff and I'm sure members will be well satisfied with our balance sheet when presented at the AGM.

To our bar managers, firstly Peter Williams and then Gary Manolas and their staff thank you for the professional manner in which you ran the social club.

Our Board has been recognised as a very positive, innovative and enthusiastic group and I thank you all for your support and friendship.

To all our members: we were unable to achieve that elusive back to back premierships but we will continue to strive to remain to the forefront of WAFL clubs. I wish you all the very best for the coming festive season and urge you to stick with "The Premier Family Club" in 2007.

CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

Members of the South Fremantle Football Club, on behalf of the Board of Directors, I have much pleasure in presenting for your adoption the Club's 107th Annual Report.

Congratulations to the players, coaches and support staff in reaching the grand final for the second successive year. Though we were not able to achieve back to back premierships our performance during the year were most impressive and we were certainly beaten by a far better side on the day.

The premiership victory in 2005 resulted in a large increase in membership and merchandise sales in 2006 which was most encouraging.

It was most pleasing to note that the total attendance at home games in 2006 was 25% up on the season average for the past five years. The figures reveal that Friday night games are a real winner and the two Monday games held on Foundation Day and Easter were very well attended. It will continue to be the club's policy to avoid clashing with Dockers and Eagles home games and further promote our night games.

In 2007 we plan to play curtain raisers to our Friday night games with the West Australian Women's Football League very keen to play their fixtures and be part of our Friday night package.

The major highlight of the year was the joint venture between the club and the City of Fremantle to commission the construction and installation of a bronze statue of the "Mark of the Century" taken by John Gerovich over East Fremantle's Ray French in the 1956 preliminary final at Subiaco Oval.

The mark and photograph have become part of football history and folklore capturing the imagination of generations. The bronze statue was officially unveiled by the Honorable Alan Carpenter MLA, Premier of Western Australia on the 5 June 2006 on the back of a Metro Lintel's truck at the Foundation Day Derby in front of a very large crowd.

The artwork was funded by the Department of Sport and Recreation, City of Fremantle, City of Cockburn, South Fremantle Football Club, Fremantle Football Club, West Coast Eagles and the West Australian Football Commission.

Our supporters were also very generous in donating to the fund and in particular Stephen

and Yvonne Brown, George and Mara Ravlich, John Hughes, Dennis McInerney, Max & Lil Viskovich, the DiPrinzio Family and the board members of the South Fremantle Football Club who all made significant contributions.

The function to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the mark and the unveiling was very well attended. Guests of honour were John Gerovich, Joy French (widow of Ray), Lyn Ward (daughter of photographer Maurice Hammond) and sculptor Robert C Hitchcock.

Players from the two competing teams in the 1956 final were also present to celebrate this great day.

Former Labor politician Bill Thomas who first came up with the idea of a bronze statue of the mark was on the steering committee that launched the project. He was joined on the committee by Mayor Peter Tagliaferri, Councillor Geoff Graham, Terry Dean and event marketing professionals Marija Jelavic and Gina Church.

Peter Tagliaferri, in particular must be congratulated in the role he played which made my job of coordinating the project so much easier.

The major social event of the year was the tribute dinner for Stephen Michael, Maurice Rioli, Peter Matera and Nicky Winmar all of whom were inducted into the AFL Indigenous Team of the Century.

Plans for a blockbuster week of celebrations in 2007 are already underway to celebrate NAIDOC week with many outstanding highlights to focus on the contribution that Indigenous footballers have made to our great game.

First Year Players

Eight players made their league debut for South Fremantle in 2006, seven of which graduated from our colts. Our colts contingent was made up of Leroy Jetta, Clayton Collard, Keith Pickett, Callum Wilson, Brad Collard, Jordan Smith and Brenton Edwards.

Best Player Awards

Congratulations to Clinton Jones in winning his second fairest and best award, the WJ Hughes Medal. He has had another outstanding season.

2005 premiership player, Ray Smithers was the recipient of the Roy McGuinness Medal for the reserves best and fairest which is another impressive performance.

Outstanding junior Callum Wilson, who kicked five goals on league debut won the coveted Dave Ingraham Memorial Medal for best and fairest in our colts.

Special Awards

The Clive Lewington Medal for our best player in the Foundation Day Derby was won by Andrew Siegert. Clinton Jones won the Neil Lewington Medal for best in the second semi final which was his second in a row.

Adam Hay put in an impressive performance on preliminary final day to win the Stan Poole Medal. The Ron Doig Medal for best in the grand final was won by Paul Duffield.

State Representatives

Four players represented WA in the state game versus South Australia at the Adelaide Oval won by South Australia. Toby McGrath, Clint Jones, Evan Hewitt and Hayden North all made solid contributions.

Life Membership

At the 2005 Annual General Meeting Life Membership was bestowed upon David Gault, Jim Hurst and Lorne McGuinness. Each received their medallion at the Life Members Reunion.

Jones continues to rise

CLINT JONES had a stellar season in 2005 winning the Hughes Medal in a premierships year. While South Fremantle couldn't quite repeat the premierships success Jones took his game to another level.

Jones had an astounding 306 handballs for the season - 54 more than anyone else in the WAFL while his 620 disposals placed his second in the competition.

The 22-year-old wingman's ability to get his hands on the ball comes as the result of a simple philosophy. "If you don't run you're not going to get hold of the footy," he said, "running has always been a strength of mine and I try to run as hard as I can in every game."

After his success in 2005 Jones was the object of greater attention from opposition teams and he found the best way to break tags was to cover plenty of ground.

Hard running often sent him well forward and he kicked 14 goals for the season and had a hand in many more.

Jones represented Western Australia against South Australia in Adelaide this year and finished third in the Sandover Medal voting to further enhance his status as one of the

WAFL's best performers.

With the Bulldogs losing just four home and away games in 2006 Jones felt the season overall was similar to the successful 2005 campaign. "From the word go, with the same sort of players as we had last year, we always thought back-to-back premierships was a realistic goal," he said. "But I'm not sure we were travelling as well at the end of the season as we were last year.

"We made the grand final - so we were going pretty well - but on the day Subi were just way too good for us. "Some of the young guys would have got a bit of experience out of that so I think we can give ourselves a chance again next year."

Jones said he has not given up his dream of playing in the AFL. "It's all about opportunity," he said, "but I'm happy to play good consistent footy with my mates at South Fremantle and to see where that can take me."

When he topped the voting for the 2006 Hughes Medal Clint Jones became just the 11th player to win consecutive South Fremantle fairest and best awards since 1926.

TREASURER'S REPORT

I am pleased to announce that the club has made a substantial profit for the year ending 31 October 2006 of \$162,511 which includes an abnormal income item of a donation of \$100,000.

Interest accrued from the investment of the donation has been designated to assisting promising young footballers in the areas of transport, accommodation and education. Regardless of that donation our profit has virtually doubled compared to the previous 12 months.

Apart from the normal maintenance costs no major capital works expenditure occurred this financial year.

Bar trading and catering has returned a reasonable profit this year after a restructuring of personnel and greater utilisation of the Griff John Function Centre.

The Foundation Day Derby and regular Friday night games saw a marked increase in gate receipts.

The spin off from the 2005 grand final success was a substantial increase in membership income.

Interest received from cash investments went up due to the increase in cash reserves and interest rates which should be maintained over the next twelve months.

All areas of the club's finances have been satisfactory maintained with a view to improving income from sponsorship.

Thank you members for making 2006 a financially successful year as we look to maintaining the momentum in 2007.

THE Griff John function room was crowded on Foundation Day for a lunch in honour of the unveiling of Robert Hitchcock's statue of the famous mark by John Gerovich's in the 1956 preliminary final.

There were members of the family of East Fremantle's Ray French, the other player in the famous photograph upon which the statue was based. There was no way John Gerovich was going to maintain his preferred low profile. When he got up to speak to the huge gathering he said he felt like a corpse providing the eulogy at his own funeral.

He acknowledged those who had organised the project and those who had come along for the day.

"I knew Con Regan would be here, he never left me alone," Gero said of his regular opponent.

He spoke of his team mates, especially the "genius" Barry White whose kick was so famously marked.

He spoke of the "saintly virtues" of his mother.

He was, he said, coming to terms with the honour that had been bestowed upon him. "Maybe it will take the eye of some aspiring kids and give them a kick along," he said.

The thought of being confronted by his larger-than-life likeness made the humble man uncomfortable. "It's going to be hard coming into Fremantle," he said, "but I'll get over it."

2006 JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT REPORT

The South Fremantle Football Development program for 2006 has been successfully completed.

2006 has been my first year as the Junior Development Officer and it was an exciting and challenging year.

The main focus of our program was to again maintain the level of participation across our district by again offering skill clinics to all 70 schools.

One of the major achievements for 2006 was the first ever "Africans for Aussie Rules" multicultural football program. 125 young African children aged between 5 and 17 took part in a 6 week NAB AFL Auskick program. Multicultural groups are often forgotten about but we are looking to bring as many new people to our game as possible. The program was a massive success and attracted the attention of both the WAFC as well as AFL Game Development. A big thanks to WAFC, Kardinya Junior Football Club, Centerlink, and Paul Mugambwa, who was a terrific ambassador for the program and a perfect role model for the young Africans.

Another major focus for our junior district is ensuring all 14 clubs remain strong and viable. The Kardinya Junior Football Club, which almost folded 2 years ago, this year tripled its amount of players from just 33 Auskickers in 2005, to 77 Auskickers in 2006, as well as fielding a 9's team for the first time.

SCHOOLS

- 35 schools were exposed to an AFL Auskick (5-8 years) Clinic to help increase the Auskick community numbers. 3,967 children aged 5,6,7 and 8 experienced a clinic.
- 12 Development programs completed (3 clinics in 3 weeks), 1500 children aged 9,10,11 and 12 experienced development programs.
- 20 schools were exposed to a WAFL one-day clinic; Gerard Wilkie, Jordan Smith and James Daniels conducted them. 2, 256 children aged 10,11 and 12 years experienced a clinic.
- School based Auskick centres at Beeliar PS and Kardinya PS attracted 58 participants.

COMMUNITY

- Auskick participants up by 12% this year to 1190 Auskickers, including 125 young African children involved in the "Africans for Aussie Rules" program.
- Bulldogs of the Future at Fremantle Oval for the 5-8 year olds was a massive success with 46 teams involved in the night on June 17. Over 500 kids each played in 5 Auskick grid games under lights.
- Conducted parent in servicing of all parents at Auskick Centres to promote the effectiveness of parent help.
- The April and July School Holiday Super Clinics at Fremantle Oval were very well attended with 95 kids aged 5-12 attending in April, and then a further 294 attended during the July school holidays.

- All junior clubs in the District played at half time of the South Fremantle games played at Fremantle Oval as well as all 14 Auskick Centres.

With 2006 being my first year as Junior Development Officer I need to say a big thank you to Bradd Gardiner, Brian Ciccotosto, and Rob Taylor and the entire DFDC who were always willing to help and guide me in the right direction. Also a big thank you to James Daniels who was our Little League manager again this year. James also made my job a lot easier by helping out with anything that I needed and always was there at very short notice.

Special congratulations to Sheryl Ward, our DFDC Secretary, who was awarded the honour of WA Volunteer of the Year in 2006.

I look forward to 2007 and the challenges we'll face in growing our great game, especially with a new structure in place as we move forward.

RESERVES REPORT

When the opportunity arose to get back into coaching for the 2006 season - at South Fremantle under John Dimmer - it was one which I was never going to pass up. Having been involved as League runner during throughout the Premiership season of 2005, I felt confident in my understanding of John's game plan and coaching style, and in my ability to continue assisting the development of emerging players within the winning culture of the senior squad.

The season provided many challenges, frustrations and successes for all involved with the Reserves side. Key processes were identified as being the requirement on players to perform consistently at training and in games, and to improve their decision making within the game plan. It was also vital to sustain the fiercely competitive desire displayed by the League squad throughout 2005. A review of the season's statistics and results shows a team that was highly competitive in every game, fighting out some close contests and recording several powerful victories. However, a number of tight losses would prove costly to our finals aspirations, most notably in Round 3 in what would turn out to be the Peel Reserves only win for the season. The disappointment of missing finals action so narrowly, but in great form, must serve as motivation for next season.

52 players represented our club at Reserves level in 2006 and, of the 21 who did so for the first time, 14 were products of our Colts teams of the past two seasons. The high turnover of players from week to week made it difficult to effectively consolidate team structures and systems, however, the core group of players showed great resilience and discipline to perform strongly week after week. The key to future success for all of these players is to develop greater consistency, to persevere, and to grasp any opportunities, if and when they arise.

Throughout the year I received valuable assistance from a large number of highly committed people. John Dimmer is always in control yet encourages others to assume responsibility. I have a strong belief in John's football thinking and an absolute respect for the way he challenges others - players and coaches alike - to become more

confident in their roles. His guidance has been invaluable to me. My assistant coach, Troy Stubberfield, provided outstanding support, with his knowledge and experience proving an asset to our club. I also benefited from the regular discussions, advice and match day assistance of Shaun Tinsley and Marty Atkins.

Peter Matier, our Reserves team manager, was often tested by late team changes and timing issues, but he carried out his duties meticulously, displaying great passion, awareness and a sense of humour. Carl Micale also provided tireless assistance at training and on match days, fulfilling his role on the bench as boardman for both Reserves and League teams. Travis Jones joined the club at the beginning of the season with the intention of assisting and developing with our League fitness expert James Bridle similar match day routines for the Reserves team. He was quick to step up when required to take on the runner's role early in the season and combined both tasks with great professionalism.

Our hard-working group of support staff have again made an enormous contribution to our club this year. I would like to acknowledge Greg Wootton and Nick Caputi, Merv Lockhart and all the trainers, Ron Porter and the property men, Alan Powell and the team of statisticians, and all those whose efforts often go unnoticed but have been very much appreciated.

Although I have acknowledged Marty's match day contribution to the Reserves team, I would also like to thank him for all of the support he has given me in my first coaching appointment at this great club. His advice, humour and enthusiasm has been outstanding.

In closing, I sincerely thank Terry Dean and the Board for the opportunities and ongoing support they have given me this season. With such an exciting group of young players already in our senior squad, I look forward to continuing the challenge.

2006 DISTRICT DEVELOPMENT REPORT

Continuous Improvement in Environment and People in the District

- We have had a major focus this year on Coaches and coaching development. John Dimmer has run courses here at Fremantle Oval with 42 coaches attending; the next was 4th July at Atwell Reserve involving a practical part.
 - We also invited 2 coaches each home game to listen to John pre game and then sit in the box and soak up how a professional operates under pressure. We had 3 senior and 5 junior clubs participate in the initiative and all have very much appreciated the opportunity and learnt plentiful from the experience.
- We have also constructed a detailed email database of all coaches in our metro and country Districts and have weekly sent those coaching updates and resources that they can use.
- John Dimmer is also working with the District to develop a coaching DVD to hand out to all 150 coaches in our Metro and Country zones. This will be completed by December this year and handed out at the commencement of the 2007 season.
 - Coaching accreditation is at 95% across the board in the metro area and is up 5% from 2005.
 - Have conducted Risk Management Seminar with the help of Warren Nel, had all 14 clubs in attendance.
 - Promoted the umpiring pathway to students at DHS and SHS in the South Fremantle District and working with Graeme Chamberlain and Peter Matier in continuing to recruit and entice back umpires

Player Retention

- Footballs for Juniors program has also been a overwhelming success with over 1300 footballs given to every child aged 9-12 that is registered at a Junior Football Club. Enhances the profile of the South Fremantle Football Club, enhances the pathway, enhances the Childs skills through the use of his/her own ball and enhances the reputation of the District, with all clubs very well aware that we as a Development Body have the players best interests at heart.
- "Goals for Schools" programs, we have 35% of Primary schools in our District without any form of goals posts, we are about to remedy that. We will identify 6-7 schools per year for the next 5 years and pay half of all costs of getting 4 posts up with sleeve, so they can be removed if need be. DFDC will decide which schools need them.

Reaching new Populations

- A woman's team will be playing in the Woman's Football League in 2007 under the banner of the South Fremantle Football Club. Discussions are in their infant stages but we are confident of having a team.
- "Africans for Aussie Rules" initiative that is mentioned in the Junior Report

Strengthening Links with Key District Stakeholders

- At each South Fremantle home game the District invited a Senior Community club, the Junior clubs that send their players there and also the schools that feeds into the junior club. It is all about relationships and strengthening the links between the important stakeholders in the development system.
- School Ambassador program is going very well with the District increasing from 32 to 41 school ambassadors. The continued strengthening of our relationships with the schools is an integral part of the future growth in our area.

Facilities and Grounds

- We are continually working with councils to ensure the growth in our District will be catered for in the form of grounds and lights. South Coogee JFC has 4 brand new light towers placed at Santich Park and they will have

the ability to play night games in 2007.

- The District is in discussions with the Cockburn Council at present in regards to future grounds available along the freeway.

Warriors Program

16's

- The 16's squad coaches by Graham Cornell did reasonably well winning 2 of their 6 games throughout the carnival. We had 4 boys successfully make the transition from 16's to the South Fremantle Colts. The Melbourne tour was a fantastic success. Took a squad of 32 players and 14 adults across and the boys played two games and won both. Attended 3 AFL games at the MCG and Telstra and also visited 3 AFL clubs in Richmond, Collingwood and Essendon. Extremely rich experience appreciated by all.

14/15's

- The program has started extremely well with the 14's development squads coached by Wayne Johnson and Paul McGrath winning 10 out of their allotted 12 games. The development of the players throughout the 10 week experience has been very pleasing.
- The 15's also did very well winning 7 of 12 games and showing plenty of potential for the 16's in 2007. The 15's were coached this year by Arthur Maskos and David Hynes.

State Representatives

- Congratulations go to Anthony Collica, Aaron Oliver and Luke Gash for making the state school boys
- Congratulations to Clayton Garlett for making and performing well for the State 16's.
- Congratulations to Leroy Jetta, Clayton Collard and Justin Hill for making the State 18's. Leroy Jetta was also All Australian.

Country Servicing

- Jason Burton and Jason Colgan (country development officer) conducted clinics in Katanning from Thursday 20th through to Friday 21st April
- South Fremantle took a gala day in Narrogin on Wednesday 26th April, where John Dimmer, Jason Burton and Bradd Gardiner conducted training sessions that covered all age groups and then a coaching seminar for all the coaches in the UGS conducted by John.
- Provided bi-monthly football budget articles for the UGS
- Garry Fuller and Marc Arnold presented 5 parts of the Level One coaching Accreditation in Narrogin on the 26th March and all coaches were very impressed with the information and professionalism of the two coaches
- Conducted level one accreditation course in Carnarvon with a number of senior coaches in attendance.
- Conducted clinics at Exmouth DHS, Carnarvon DHS and St Mary's PS
- "Gascoyne Bulldogs", the new development side from Carnarvon and Exmouth competed and won the carnival in Geraldton on the June long weekend. They beat the Geraldton team for the first time.
- Upper Great Southern Rams competed in the Country carnival in the July school holidays and were all richer for the experience.

This year the South Fremantle District has achieved some remarkable outcomes; "Africans for Aussie Rules", Goal Posts for Schools, Football for Juniors, Resourcing the Coaches and the Warriors Development program has gone to the next level in regards to it's professionalism.

These programs have all been implemented by the District whilst still delivering the quality participation and retention programs we would normally do.

The Development structure in 2007 will be slightly different with Jason Burton becoming the Development Officer who will take care of all the participation and retention programs as well as coaching. I will then become



the District Development Manager for the club and will be responsible for all Development in our zone as well as Talent. We will then put in place a Development trainee who will run all the school programs. This will ensure quality outcomes are continually achieved.

A huge thank you must go to the volunteers who sit on all our Development arm bodies. Rob Taylor, Graeme Smith, Shane Harding, Sharon Greengrass, Sheryl Ward, Charlie Ricciardello, Terry Dean and Garry Gough who make up our DFDC – all outstanding!

Jim Hurst for all the work he does helping me make the Warriors Program what it is today – Brilliant!

A big thank you to all the Warriors coaches and support staff for your efforts in delivering a fantastic program for all the players.

Thank you to all Junior Clubs for all their support for the year, because if the junior clubs didn't embrace the programs and the direction we are taking with our development then we would be up against it.

And to all members of the football landscape, thank you for a most enjoyable and challenging year that has delivered so much for the South Fremantle Football District – Well Done!

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST OCTOBER 2006

STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements (Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views). The financial statements have also been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the company in the preparation of the financial statements.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment are brought to account at cost or at independent or directors' valuation, less where applicable any accumulated depreciation or amortisation. The carrying amount of property, plant and equipment is reviewed annually by directors to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal.

Employee Entitlements

Provision is made for the company's liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee entitlements expected to be settled within one year together with entitlements arising from wages and salaries, annual leave and sick leave which will be settled after one year, have been measured at their nominal amount. Other employee entitlements payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those entitlements.

Contributions are made by the company to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

Cash

For the purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash includes cash on hand and in at call deposits with banks or financial institutions, investments in money market instruments maturing within less than two months, net of bank overdrafts.

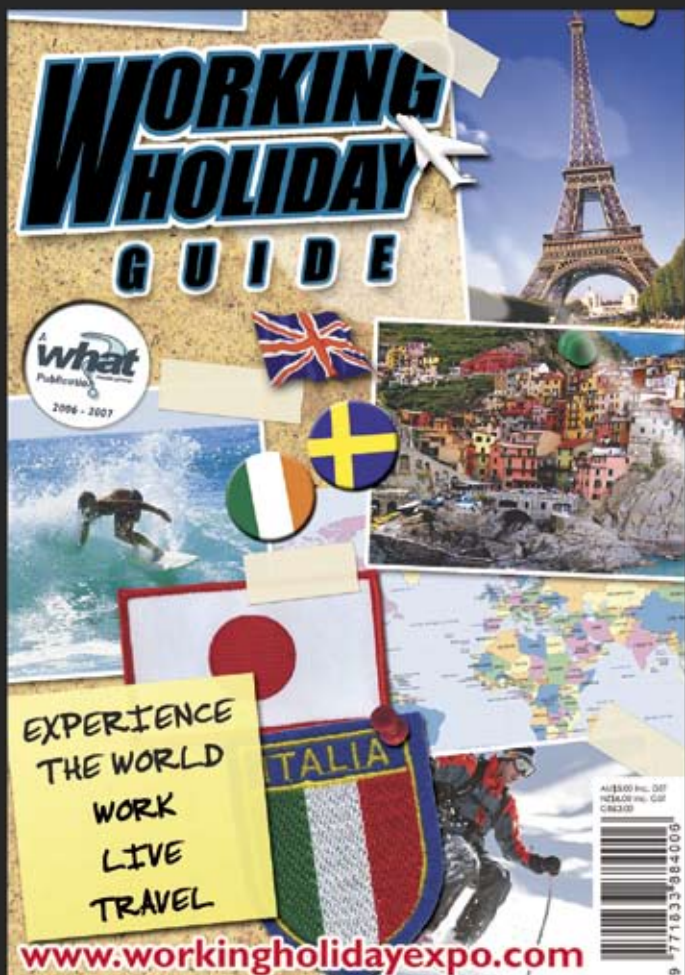
