

Swans Awards and Recognition Policy

1. Purpose

The Swan Districts Football Club (Swans) has a long and rich history which is memorialised through a number of ways including recognising the achievements of its players, volunteers and staff through the presentation of awards.

The purpose of this policy is to preserve the importance safeguard the high standing of the club's awards.

2. Policy

The following is a list of official club awards which should maintained. Most are perpetual awards which must be presented at the completion of each season. However, some awards are memorial only and will only be awarded should there be a worthy candidate.

It's important that the award name, reason for the award, and the selection process be preserved.

The introduction of any new awards must be approved by the Board at least 3 months prior to any awards ceremony. The Board will consider the following when reviewing any proposed awards.

- The award category.
- Whether the award can be awarded perpetually without diminishing the standing of the award.

| Judy Sarich Memorial Award | Colts Runner Up Fairest and Best player | A perpetual award using a 5,4,3,2,1 voting system for every qualifying and finals game voted by three Colts coaches or support staff. |
| Cooper Brothers Award | Colts Third Highest Fairest and Best player | A perpetual award using a 5,4,3,2,1 voting system for every qualifying and finals game voted by three Colts coaches or support staff. |
| RA Newby Memorial Award | Best League rookie player | The player must be under the age of 21 as of the 1st January and have played no more than 10 WAFL games prior to the start of that season, who polled the most votes in the Swan Medal. |
| Ted Holdsworth Memorial Award | Highest League goal scorer for the season | A perpetual award for the highest goal scorer in the League. |

| Chelsea Randall Medal | Rogers Cup Fairest & Best player | A perpetual award using a 5,4,3,2,1 voting system for every qualifying and finals game voted by three Colts coaches or support staff. |
| WAFLW Person of the Year | An individual who has shown commitment to the club over and above what's expected | Selected by the WAFLW Football Affairs Committee. |
| Rookie of the Year | Best Rookie Player | The player must be under the age of 21 as of 1 January and have played no more than 10 WAFL games prior to the start of that season, who polled the most votes in the McSherry Medal. |

| Life Membership | Player who has played 150 League games or a combination of minimum 120 League games and remainder Reserves games to accumulate 150 games or a person who the Board believes has rendered outstanding or exceptional service to the Club. | Nominations by club members are received by 31 August, endorsed by the club's Life Member Committee, and then ratified by the Board. |
| Ten Year Service | Completing at least 10 years' service at the club. | Nominations by club members are received by 31 August and ratified by the Board. |
| PJ Bright Memorial Award | Best Club Person Award | Nominated by a club member prior to 31 August and approved by the Board. |
| WAFL Ball Legend | Club WAFL Legends. | A perpetual award selected by the Board using any of the following criteria: number of SDFC games and seasons, number of club and/or league awards, number of State representative and/or AFL club games, long service, or combination of any of the above. |
| WAFLW Ball Legend | Club Women's Football Legends. | Selected by the Board using any of the following criteria: number of SDFC games and seasons, number of club and/or league awards, number of State representative and/or AFL club games, long service, or combination of any of the above. |

| Ken Ball Players' Memorial Shield | A club volunteer who has provided support to the WAFL players over and above what's expected. | Selected by the WAFL senior playing group. |

| Joe Pearce Courage Award | Presented to a club player, member or official considered worthy in any one year of triumph over adversity | Nominated by a club member prior to 31 August and approved by the Board. |
| Hall of Fame | The Hall of Fame recognises and enshrines players, coaches, administrators, volunteers, and iconic moments that have made a most significant contribution to the club since its inception in 1934. | Nominations are made for Board approval by the Hall of Fame Committee guided by its Terms of Reference prior to any Hall of Fame induction. |
