



### **Development Umpire Coach Accreditation - Performance Criteria**

You will be observed demonstrating the below elements during a workshop or training session to determine your competence for Umpire Coach Development accreditation. Observation will be necessary to ensure that the assessment meets the *'rules of evidence'*, i.e.: evidence should be - valid, authentic, sufficient & current. For some elements some additional evidence will need to be provided to the person assessing you, e.g. Assessor Course Certificate of Completion.

The Assessor is responsible for 'signing off' your Umpire Coach accreditation.

<b>1. Demonstrate qualities of an umpire's coach</b>			
• Communicate clearly

<b>2. Demonstrate effective communication skills with umpiring personnel &amp; others</b>			
• Relate positively to/engage with umpires			
• Engage with umpire coaches/mentors			
• Communicate with football personnel – coaches, administrators			
<b>3. Establish/contribute to &amp; maintain a positive umpiring group environment</b>			
• Develop an umpiring group environment which is inclusive, safe, friendly, supportive and welcoming			
• Ensure fun activities are an integral part of the environment			
• Develop/maintain a learning and challenging environment			
<b>4. Utilise umpires/others in coaching/training sessions</b>			
• Delegate sessions/parts of sessions to senior umpires			
• Involve other umpire coaches/mentors in sessions			
• Involve 'guests/experts' in the development of the umpiring group			
<b>5. Conduct umpire coaching sessions coaching session outlines</b>			
• Conduct sessions which are well planned			
• Conduct interactive, engaging and facilitated sessions			
• Conduct sessions that are targeted – eg. umpires experience/discipline			
• Use variety of approaches in training/coaching sessions			
• Utilise NUAS materials in coaching			
• Prepare and present a Coaching Plan to State Manager			
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<b>6. Observe umpiring performances &amp; facilitate feedback to umpires</b>			



• Collect information about an umpiring performance			
• Discuss performance with umpire			
• Discuss follow up actions			
• Provide umpire with report			
<b>7. Completion of the online AFL Assessor Course</b>			
• Provide evidence to your Assessor of satisfactory completion.			
<b>8. Completion of the post workshop knowledge test</b>			
• Provide evidence to your Assessor of satisfactory completion.			
<b>9. Completion of the AFL Umpire Coaches Code of Conduct</b>			
• Provide evidence to your Assessor of satisfactory completion.
