A brief history

Beginning in 1922, the WAAFL is now in its 91st year of operation. With 65 clubs, 235 teams and over 14,500 registered players, the WAAFL has grown from a six team competition to the largest single organised football league in WA, catering for players from the age of 16 years, as well as considerable volunteer personnel and social supporters.

The WAAFL provides a high standard competition for those players not wishing to endure the commitment to WAFL training due to study commitments, career commitments or simply a lifestyle that considers football a recreational pursuit.

The WAAFL also bridges the gap between amateur football and the champions of tomorrow, with many well-known WAFL and AFL personnel beginning their careers in the WAAFL. Former West Coast Eagles and Hawthorn coach Ken Judge began his coaching

career at an A Grade amateur club and former Dockers coach Gerard Neesham played several seasons of amateur football and was even selected to represent the WAAFL at a state level.

Other high profile players include Drew Banfield, Phil Scott, Troy Wilson (West Coast Eagles), Gary Buckenara (Hawthorn), Shane Parker (Fremantle), Simon Beasley (Western Bulldogs), Sandover Medalists Ian Dargie (2), Alistair Pickett (2) and Shane Beros.

Former amateur players who have gone on to be senior administrators include former WA Football Commission Chairmen Dr Neale Fong (a triple A Grade Fairest & Best medalist with the WAAFL) and Dr Peter Tannock, current Chairman of Sydney Swans Richard Colless, and former West Coast Chairman and AFL Commissioner Terry O'Connor.

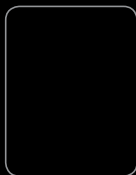

THE WA Amateur Football League inducted seven new members into its Hall of Champions in front of more than 190 guests at the Subiaco Sports Bar this May.

The WAAFL Hall of Champions was introduced in 2010 as a way to recognise the outstanding contribution to amateur football by players, coaches, umpires and administrators, as well as those who began their careers at an amateur level before going on to higher tiers.

Speaking to guests, President of the WA Amateur Football League John Davies said that the Hall of Champions was a unique way of honouring significant people for their unselfish contribution to amateur football over many years.

“We are all here to honour them, to welcome or remember them, to embrace them for their efforts and to add their names to the already prestigious list of people currently in our Hall of Champions,” he said

“It is right and proper that amateur football has this event because for just over 90 years, community football has held a great place in the overall structure of Australian Football.”

Six inductees were recognised in the High Achiever category, and Wembley’s Malcolm Murray was inducted as a Champion of the WAAFL for his 30-year contribution to amateur football.

Murray began his amateur footballing career with Wembley in 1955 and went on to play 252 games for

the black and white, captaining the side from 1963 to 1966, and winning the best and fairest in 1965 and 1969.

He was selected to represent Western Australia four times – in 1962, 64, 65 and 67 – and also earned selection in the All Australian team at the conclusion of the 1962 National Championship.

Murray later went on to coach Wembley’s A Grade side in 1972, 74 and 75, winning the Premiership in 72 and 74. He was also selected by the WAAFL to coach the 1974 and 1975 state teams.

Another six former WAAFL greats were recognised in the High Achievers category, as players who began their career at an amateur level before going on to higher tiers.

Former Fremantle coach Gerard Neesham, former West Perth player and Fremantle Chairman Ross Kelly, former AFL umpire Paul Smith, Subiaco and Sydney Team of the Century member Bill Faul, Wembley great Brian Featherby and Scarborough co-founder Jim McGann were all recognised as High Achievers.

The High Achievers join the likes of Peter Featherby, Simon Beasley and Gary Buckenara as players who came from humble beginnings in the WA Amateur Football League before contributing to the game at higher levels.

West Coast Eagles under 23 state amateur team



IN 2012 the West Coast Eagles State Amateur under 23's program culminated in a match against the Victorian Amateur Football Association, with the WAAFL rep side looking to become only the second WAAFL team to beat the Vics on home soil.

After an eight week preparation that included matches against the WA Country Football League and the Peel Football League, the WAAFL state side headed east to Victoria looking to recreate the famous 2006 victory at Sportscover Arena, Elsternwick.

The VAFA got out to an early lead but were unable to kick clear of the West Coast Eagles State Amateur 23's, who remained in touch by nine points at the first break and 15 at the major change.

After half time the tide turned and the Big V, who had kicked 7 goals 13 to that stage, kicked 6 goals 3 to lead by 33 points heading into the last.

The West Coast Eagles State Amateur under 23's, led by Benjamin Grace, Luke Conca and Jamie Del Borrello refused to give up, cutting the margin back to 10 points during the final term.

It proved too little too late however, Victoria claiming the win and bragging rights by 26 points.

Benjamin Grace was awarded best on ground for the West Coast Eagles State Amateur under 23's for his performance.

This years' match against the VAFA was the beginning of the tri-annual series – a three year competition between Western Australia, Victoria, South Australia and Tasmania. Under the tri-annual series rules,

each team plays each other once with the team who finishes at the top of the ladder at the end of the series crowned champion.

The West Coast Eagles State Amateur under 23's finished in second place in the 2008-2010 tri-annual series, defeating Tasmania and Victoria but suffering a narrow loss to South Australia in their final game. Victoria, after having already defeated South Australia, claimed the series on percentage.

The loss to Victoria was the second loss of the program for the 23's, after they were also knocked off by the WA Country Football League by 26 points earlier in the year.

It wasn't all doom and gloom however, the West Coast Eagles State Amateur under 23's managed to record a win against a talented Peel Football League rep side just days after the loss to the Country.

The West Coast Eagles State Amateur Colts shared a similar fate to their 23 counterparts – losing their matches against the State 16's and the WA Country Football League, but recording a win against the Peel Football League.

WAAFL Integrated Football

Now in its fourth year, the Integrated Football Program provides players with an Intellectual Disability the opportunity to play in a fully structured football competition.

The 2012 season had five clubs involved in the competition, hosting six teams. Kingsway, High Wycombe, Lynwood Ferndale and Warnbro all hosted Integrated teams, while Fremantle CBC had an abundance of players and was able to field two teams this season, Gold and Green.

The 8 round season, played with modified rules, was the fortnightly highlight for most players, with weekly training being an essential part of their football commitment.

The competition targets players aged 16 years and older to become involved in their community and ultimately enjoy the game of football.

Many players say being involved in the competition has been a life changing experience. Kirk Barker (20) from Fremantle CBC stated that "It's good to be able to be part of a sport team. My brother is and I wanted to be like him, and now I am... It's good that he comes to watch me now."

Integrated Football hosted its second Grand Final on the 26th of August, 2012, with the home team, Lynwood Ferndale defeating Fremantle CBC Gold. Each team had only one loss during the season and the Grand Final showcased the talent each team had with a final score of Lynwood-Ferndale 6.2 (38) to Fremantle CBC Gold 5.5 (35).

The game was a close match, full of drama, with the Best on Ground being awarded to Damien Watson from Lynwood Ferndale, who was awarded the match ball for his performance.

Integrated Coordinator Sophie James said she was very pleased to see how many players had stayed on board after the inaugural year, and how the league looked to be a sustainable competition in the future.

"It's fantastic to see that the five WAAFL clubs continued to host an Integrated team in 2012. The time, effort, and additional volunteers needed to run these teams is, at times, especially difficult," She said.

"The success of the season is proof of how hard everyone worked to have players on the field, and competing in a fortnightly competition".

She said she was impressed by the pro-active mindset of some of the clubs, and that it was obvious this was a league that wanted to grow.

"Fremantle CBC had two teams this season, the amount of effort put into their Integrated teams was enormous. CBC's team lists grew throughout the season and they were always able to lend players to their opposition on game day."

As the Integrated players continue to play and train, 2013 will definitely see some players move up the grades and into mainstream amateur football league.

WAAFL broadcast

FOR the first time in WA Amateur Football League history the A Grade Grand Final will be broadcast on TV, radio and internet.

Continuing on from last years' success, the WAAFL A Grade Grand Final will be available to watch on the WAAFL website and will now also be broadcast live on Radio Fremantle 107.9.

In addition to the radio broadcast, an hour highlights package will screen on Monday, October 1 on Foxtel channel Aurora.

General Manager of the WAAFL David Armstrong said that he's excited at the prospect of bringing amateur football to more people than ever before.

"The A Grade Grand Final is our showcase game of the year and it's exciting that fans will be able to watch it across so many platforms," he said

"We anticipate a tough fought contest that will show the spirit of amateur football"

As well as showcasing the WAAFL A Grade Grand Final, the B Grade League, Reserves and Drew Banfield Colts will also be broadcast via the WAAFL website, with DVD's of all three games available for purchase, as will the C1, C1 Reserves and Ian Dargie Colts.

After being relegated from A Grade at the end of 2011, Wesley Curtin and Fremantle C.B.C have been the standout teams of B Grade to earn their spot in the B Grade Grand Final.

In the Reserves it will again be Fremantle CBC, this time taking on Wembley, while the Drew Banfield Colts will be a preview of the main event with Wesley Curtin taking on CBC.

All three games will be available to watch on the WAAFL website the following week.

Pink Tigers raise money for Breast Cancer

IN 2012 the Wesley Curtin Amateur Football Club did what many teams and football traditionalists would consider unthinkable – wear a pink jumper.

Long considered a macho sport, the Wesley Curtin Amateur Football Club showed a different side to football when they ran out for their match against Scarborough wearing pink jumpers.

Starting last season, “Pink Tiger Day” is a ladies only event that sees the Wesley Curtin league team don a pink jumper as part of a fundraiser for the McGrath Foundation.

The event attracts between 100 – 150 women who are provided food, drinks and entertainment, including being served drinks by some of the Wesley Curtin players.

Pink Tiger Day was a huge success in 2011, raising \$17,500 for the McGrath Foundation, but remarkably, the total was bettered in 2012 with \$21,000 being raised by the event.

Wesley Curtin Fundraising Co-ordinator Mark Hayter said that all funds go to the McGrath Foundation, who fund breast cancer research and provide nursing support for breast cancer sufferers.

“We have 11 sponsors who donated \$1,000 each with the rest coming from auctions and fundraising on the night” He said

“Everything goes to the McGrath Foundation”

Mr Hayter said the event wouldn’t be possible without sponsors and the help of volunteers Anne

Pride, Josie Caputo and Sue Rickleman who work tirelessly to make the day happen.

Sponsors for the event are Shakespeare Partners Chartered Accountants, Galvin Engineering, Habitat Finance, Philips Technology Transport, Soco Realty, Cottesloe Constructions, Rhino Water Tanks, Phoenix Insurance Brokers, Fuller Fitness, Structure Consulting Engineers, Roadbend Jaguar, Breakwater Tavern and Lenton Brae Wines.

Mr Hayter said the event came about as the club wanted to give back to the community.

“As one of the bigger clubs we felt it was important we did a community based event”

“This event helps to engage all of the wives and girlfriends at the club, as well as the community as a whole.

Although not a traditional football colour, Mr Hayter said that so far the players have enthusiastically embraced the pink jumpers.

“Twenty years ago the players may have told us to get stuffed but they have really warmed to it (the jumpers)”

“They have been great, last year they really enjoyed it”

Wesley Football Club President Rod Phillips said some players even used them as training jumpers.

“We sold the jumpers to the players at \$100 each and they all wanted one,” He said

“Even the players who didn’t play, the rest of the club guys asked if there were any jumpers for sale”

Kingsley remembers

TEN years on from their first WA Amateur Football League Premiership in 2002, the Kingsley Amateur Football Club this year both celebrated the achievement and grieved for the tragedy that followed.

Kingsley joined the WAAFL E Grade competition after moving from the Sunday Football League in the 1990's. The club received its first taste of team success in 2002 when both the E and E Reserves sides made the Grand Final – the reserves winning the clubs first ever flag while the league just fell short of premiership triumph.

Sadly, what should be remembered as one of the clubs proudest moments will also serve as a reminder for all at the club of how precious life can be.

After a successful season where both their league and reserves sides made the Grand Final, 20 Kingsley players headed to Bali on an end of season trip that should have been one of their happiest football memories.

Instead, just six hours into their trip, what was meant to be a celebration turned into a tragedy as a bomb planted by terrorists in a car outside the Sari Club where the team was partying exploded with devastating effect.

202 people lost their lives in the Bali Bombings on the 12th October 2002, 88 of them Australian and seven from Kingsley Amateur Football Club. A further two Kingsley players suffered burns so severe they had to be airlifted back to Australia for treatment.

On their return to Australia the 13 survivors worked to raise funds to build a memorial clubroom for

their fallen teammates (pictured).

Now, ten years on, Kingsley remembered the outstanding season as well as the tragedy that befell the group of 20 mates, many of whom were on their first trip outside of Australia.

Following the conclusion of the B Grade's last home and away match for the season, a Kingsley Amateur Football Club "Legends Team" took to the field against representatives from the Kingsley Junior Football Club, celebrating their 30th year.

The Kingsley Legends side was comprised of players from the early years of the club, with the game also involving other football identities such as former West Coast Eagles, Port Adelaide and Fremantle Dockers star Jarrad Schofield.

Former Essendon, Port Adelaide and West Coast Eagles player Scott Cummings was also on hand to provide entertainment.

The match itself started at 6:00pm, with other entertainment such as a DJ and bouncy castles keeping the crowd entertained throughout the evening.

The Legends game reunited players from the early days of both Clubs, many who have not been back to Kingsley for years.

Showing that the tragedy is never far from the minds of those at Kingsley, part of the proceeds raised on the night went towards funding a trip for Bali Bombing victims and victims' families wishing to return to Bali to pay their respects on the tenth anniversary of the tragedy.
