FROM THE PRESIDENT

Bob Shields



After the trauma of the Covid Season 2020, this Season can only be described as a Watershed moment for our Club.

We suffered the humbling 11 losses in a row to see us finish 9th- then had the reaffirming, magnificent fighting win of our Reserves Premiership, and then we farewelled six Perth warriors who retired taking with them more than 600 games of WAFL experience.

Far from downbeat, your Football leadership, your Directors and Executive team approach Season 2022 with quiet confidence.

We have recruited well, signing marquee players such as Brayden Ainsworth, a hard running midfielder and a crucial powerful ruckman in Ajang Ajang with both showing confidence in the direction that PFC Football is taking.

A key aspect is that we realised mid-season that there had to be some flaw in our football programme with an abnormal 22 players injured at one time; we hired the best high-performance manager in the AFL in Glenn Stewart to run the rule over our football operation. The subsequent Stewart report has given our Coach and football leadership valuable feedback, resulting in a reset which will see a much-improved performance and I can promise that the Perth players will definitely be "Football Fit".

The business of PFC is in good shape-we report a strong \$227,147 net profit, with excellent growth in our sponsorship revenue and a pleasing take-up of membership already for season 2022. I take this moment to thank your Directors who have each taken responsibility for a portfolio-and this result is great testament to their stewardship.

The Directors were also totally involved in the stressful period following an approach from the West Coast Eagles to house players with the Perth Football Club. We understood the angst from some members who were strongly opposed; not well known is the fact that there was almost the same amount of angst directed to the Board from members and sponsors who were adamant that Perth should take this opportunity. We considered the facts carefully but ultimately decided it was not in the Club's best interests. We then played a leading role with the other WAFL Clubs in changing the rules so that a WCE team remains in our competition in a workable, but not dominant way.

All WAFL Clubs know the growth frontier is in Community areas, which includes a renewed focus on junior and community football.

For the past year we have embarked on our Women's Football strategy, with the first fruits being a valuable collaboration with Penrhos College, resulting in more than 100 young women being coached by Perth players to prepare them for entry into Schools football.

This year's Centurions Lunch was a sellout with the added attraction of a special event to salute and financially support Perth great Peter Bosustow. My thanks to Club Patron Peter Gilkison and his team for the financial support the Centurions provide for the Club.

While on thanks, we could not achieve all we do without the solid, background support of the Past Players & Officials Association, all of the volunteers who never see the limelight-but do the heavy lifting, the football support staff-and certainly the backbone of the Club in CEO Russell Clark and his team.

2022 may be our last season in the current facility, as the Town of Victoria Park notes on its website that the new Perth Football Club building project will start in late 2022. We reaffirm that Perth Football Club plans to remain here during the rebuilding period, and we will play on our oval for many years to come.

In closing, please join with me in acclaiming our best Club person for 2021 in Arthur Ransted, who was here in 1967 as a boot-studder when your President was a player.

I also want to proudly announce that the Club Legend for Season 2022 is Ken Inman who will take over the mantle from Murray Couper. Thank you Murray for the grace and enjoyment you gave to us all in Season 2021.

There is no secret that the PFC has the lowest number of players in our combined Metro and Country zones and therefore this has a huge influence on our playing strength in the Colts age group. There are too many people in a football club to thank them all individually so I would extend my thanks to all the Coaches, Support Staff, Trainers, Players and volunteers for playing their role at the Perth Football Club in 2021.

Football returned to some sense of normality in season 2021 with a regular 18 game Home and Away season getting under way in April. A couple of 'Covid' pauses along the way did not derail the season, some minor fixture adjustments saw a full season, albeit extended into October to get the Finals Series completed. And speaking of Finals, I will take this opportunity to jump to the end of the season in my report to say well done to Andrew Panetta and all the Ressies players for their great achievement in winning the WAFL Reserves Premiership in 2021.

After losing the ANZAC Day fixture to Covid we got our season back on track against EF away. Again, we were beset with significant long term injuries in this fixture to Michael Sinclair and Brady Grey which would ultimately impact our season. In subsequent weeks we had a loss to Peel, but then two good wins against SF and WP had us with a 4 and 3 win/loss after 7 rounds.

Unfortunately, we lost the next 11 games straight to end the season 4 and 14.

We are not about excuses and blaming injuries but more so on reflection there needs to be, and indeed has been, a review of our Football Operations, Player Preparation and Leadership with the view to seeing a significant turnaround in 2022.

Well done to all the Coaching Staff for your dedicated work and support of each other in challenging times. Mossy and Panetts led the way with great support from Daine, Steve, Chance, Kim, Pat, Craig, Jack and all being mentored by Earl.

Thank you to Saia and his strength and conditioning team for the professional approach to helping the players prepare and recover in readiness for training sessions and games. Evan did a great job in getting our extensive injury list through rehab and back into training and playing.

Our medical and training staff are an awesome team. Brett as our physio, and Ewan as club doctor, working with our head trainers, Hayley and Charlotte provided a great professional service to all our players...and at times staff. We are truly grateful to Hayley and Charlotte who have been Head Trainers for several years now; and it is with great sadness that they will not be continuing in this role next season, however they will not be lost to the PFC. They have led a great team of assistant trainers and interns volunteering hours to assist; never to complain, always there on cold wet nights offering support. We thank you all.

Match days can be hectic, and I'm truly grateful for the work and support I received from many to help the day work...Garry Lendich as our ground manager is second to none. Team Managers are pivotal, with pre and post game duties, as well as having teams and coaches on time. Thanks Kevin (League) and Peter (Reserves) for your work as Team Managers in 2021.

The 2021 season was a year that was full of challenges and disappointment. The season and result didn't go the way we had planned or expected. 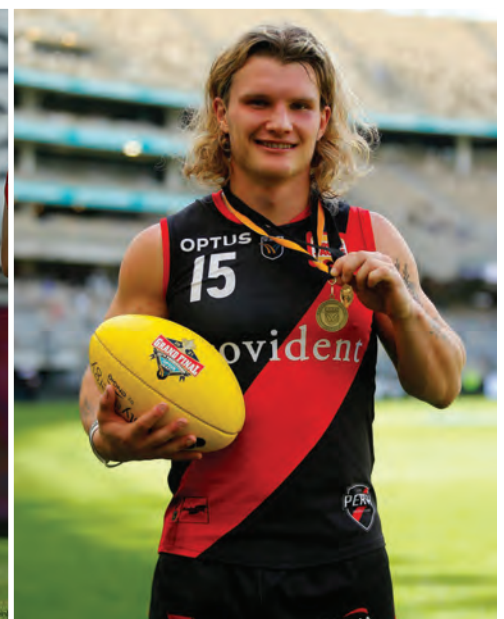

FROM THE COLTS COACH

Thanks for the amazing support provided by the Perth Footy Club to the Colts program throughout the 2021 season.

To say that this year has been a challenging one is somewhat of an under-statement. Whilst it is true that the success or otherwise of 'Talent Pathway' football is not solely measured by on-field results, it is also true that everyone involved in a football environment (in particular the players and coaches) desperately WANT to win each and every week. For our players and staff to go through an entire season without singing the song was incredibly disappointing.

Is there another side to this seemingly bleak season? Well – of course! Firstly, the resilience shown by the playing group and staff to keep pushing to improve despite the lack of on-field success was quite inspiring. The passion displayed by the staff – assistant coaches, S&C, Medical and admin to keep trying to find 'another' way – and more importantly a BETTER way to do things to help the players achieve their goals was amazing. And whilst the on-field outcomes could be challenged – we simply MUST be better on match day – the effort and commitment of the players remained strong throughout and listening to the opposition coaches consistently praise our players for their 'never give up' approach was most gratifying.

Further to the effort of our players and staff, 2021 also gave us the opportunity to expose 59-players to state level footy. Of those players, 12 were graduates from our successful 2021 "Futures" program (what used to be called the u16's). It is highly unusual for this number of 15/16 year olds to play Colts footy in a single season – and this should provide those players with a real jump-start to their footy career (particularly when compared to their peers from other WAFL clubs who typically would not get an opportunity to compete at Colts level until the year they turn 17). Will this provide us with a significant advantage during 2022? Well – it is always difficult to predict the future, but they are a group of highly committed young players, and we are really looking forward to their improvement.

Also, amongst those 59-players were 6 young men who went on to play senior footy during this season – one of whom (Jack Avery) also went on to make his league debut. To move from Colts to League footy within a single season is an incredible effort and for our club to have four players do that within 2-seasons (Logan McDonald, Nathan O'Driscoll, Conor McPartland and now Jack) is a great reflection on both those individuals and the senior club's willingness to promote the talented young players in our district. Certainly, if there are talented kids out there in the community with the desire and dedication to play league footy, they could not be in a better place than the Perth Footy Club!

What else was positive? Well, it was incredibly gratifying to watch our reserves team – packed full of the Colts graduates from the past few seasons – win on Grand Final day. As I noted in last year's report, so many of our incoming juniors are – through absolutely no fault of their own – facing a very steep learning curve when they arrive at our club. Transitioning from junior footy to state level competition is hard enough – doing so from the lower divisions of the central conference as so many of our players are, is even harder. This does not mean they don't have the capacity to 'make it' – it just means it is going to take a little bit of time whilst they learn the game, build their bodies, and develop some real resilience. The success on Grand Final day really shows what is possible and I am certain those players will be pushing hard for success at League level during 2022 and beyond.

Lastly, I would just like to pay tribute to all the staff associated with the Colts program. The amount of time they commit – medical staff and trainers, the S+C team, runners, assistant coaches and our team management/admin staff really is amazing...we train LATE (the coaches rarely leave the club much before 9pm) and our games start EARLY and everyone just gets on with it without complaint. Here's to a successful 2022.

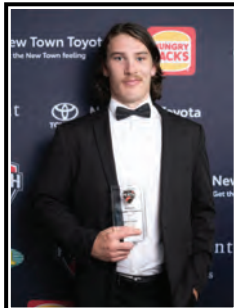

The 2021 season got off to a busy start with both our Futures and Colts pre-seasons running parallel to each other.

We started the Futures program with a squad of 58 players with the majority of them transitioning from the 15's development program which was run at the end of 2020. The squad also included some 17-year-old players who remained in the Colts squad but played some Futures games to add strength to the team and continue to develop their game in a Perth jumper.

The Futures coaching team was led well by former Perth League player Scott Moore in his second year in the role. Scott's Assistant Coaches were Cal Walley, Kristian Leeson and Damian McCague and Development Coaches Ross Clark, Jos Welch, Irene Hall, Karen Turnbull and Mark Millington who also filled the role of runner on game day. Scott Glassby, Aaron Dean and Brodie Adriaens all did a great job of working together to prepare the players to achieve good fitness levels to compete well at training and in games.

Some special moments included the fact that we had 4 players who played Futures for Perth as they strive toward following in the footsteps of their fathers who all played league football at our great Club. Not only was our Coach Scott Moore a former league player himself but he is also the son of former league player Jeff, and Jeff's younger son and Scott's brother Cooper played Futures and was also selected in the Western Australia State School U15 team. Other father son combinations were- Club CEO Russ Clark and son Taite, Winston Abraham and son Garry, and Adrian Cachard and son Noah. In addition to those players, we also had 1966 League premiership player Mal Winsor enjoy watching his grandson Baxter Philip play Futures.

Fourteen players who played Futures in the early part of the year then transitioned to play Colts level football this year. Fifty-nine players played Colts football this season under the valuable coaching of Michael Pratt and his assistants Kurt Bufton and Mark Piani. It was a tough year for the Colts players who were unable to register a win all season but the positive to take from that is that we exposed as many 16-17 year old players to Colts level football as we did. These players were required to play against bigger, stronger, fitter opponents some of whom are involved in the State 19's Academy program and some who will be drafted into the AFL system later this year. For our young players to be exposed to opposition of such quality is a great opportunity for them to learn from and refer to in their development over the next year or two.

At the other end of our Colts list we were pleased that Deklyn Grocott, Liam Kelly, Harry Quartermaine and Ben Weymouth played some Reserves football and Jack Avery progressed to make his league debut. Jack also represented Western Australia in the NAB AFL U19 Championships.

A big, big thankyou must be extended to our Colts Head Trainer Jess Vince for the medical care she provides our players with the support of Emily Gibb and Ethan Lee-Visser. Over the past 3 years we have been fortunate enough to have Peter Gangemi working with our players in the Physiotherapy role and this year Pete successfully transitioned the position to Dan Anderson. Both Pete and Dan have done an amazing job of looking after our players as they work through the niggles and injuries of a football season, and I know our players, families and coaches really appreciate the work of Pete and Dan.

We will miss some of our magnificent medical team as we move toward the 2022 season. Pete has moved onto a new work opportunity and is busy planning his wedding with his fiancée Jaye and our Senior Head Trainers Charlotte Elliott and Hayley Patterson will be taking a well-deserved break. On behalf of all our players, families, coaches, and staff we wish you all the very best and hope to see you at the footy from time to time.

As we wrap up season 2021 and work hard toward an improved and successful 2022 season we thank all of our players, families, coaches and staff and wish you all a safe and happy summer.



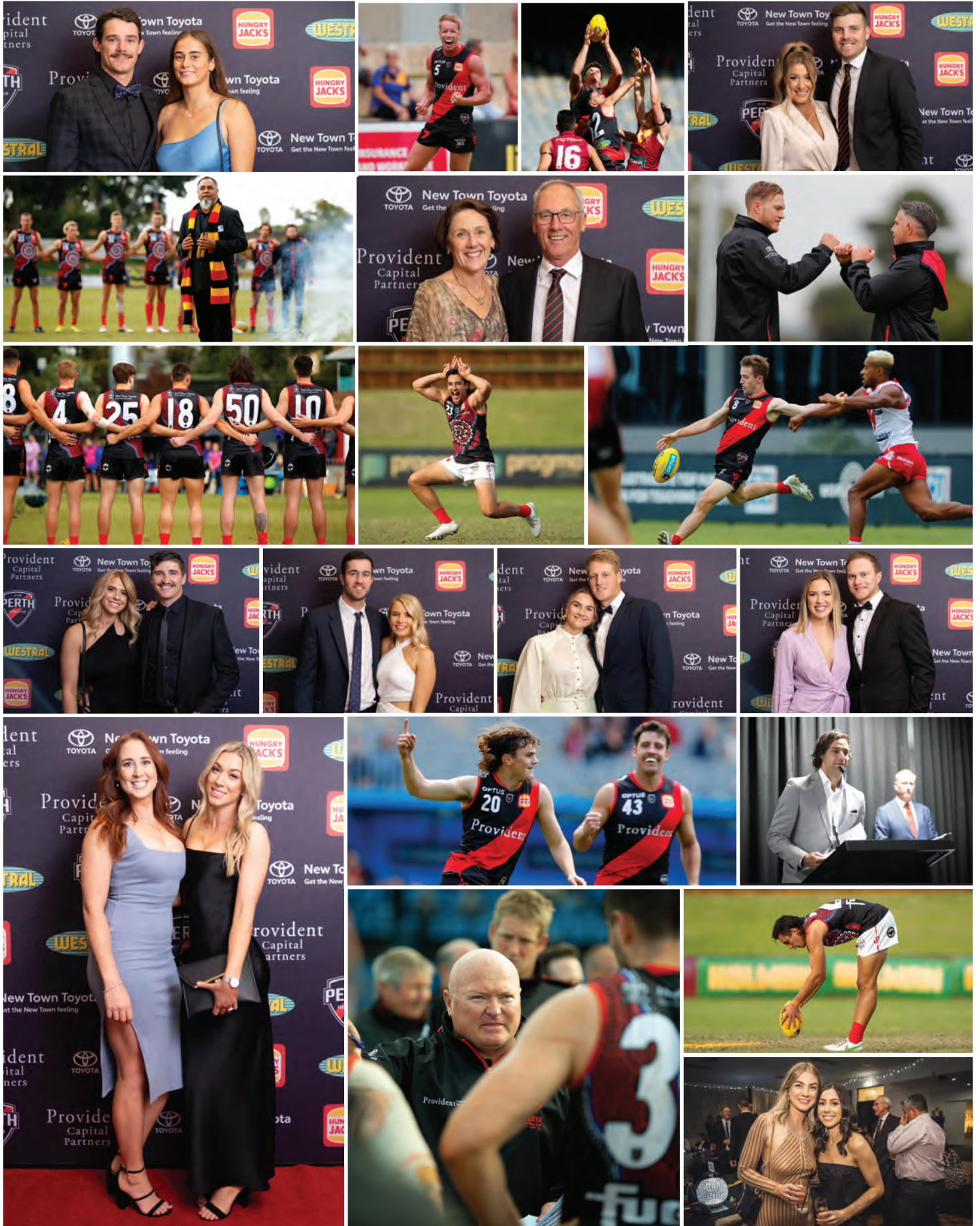

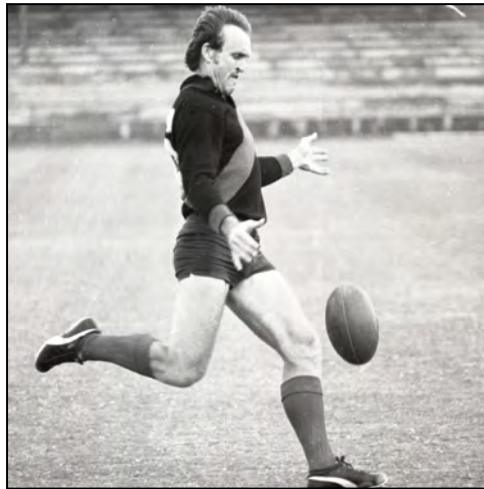
