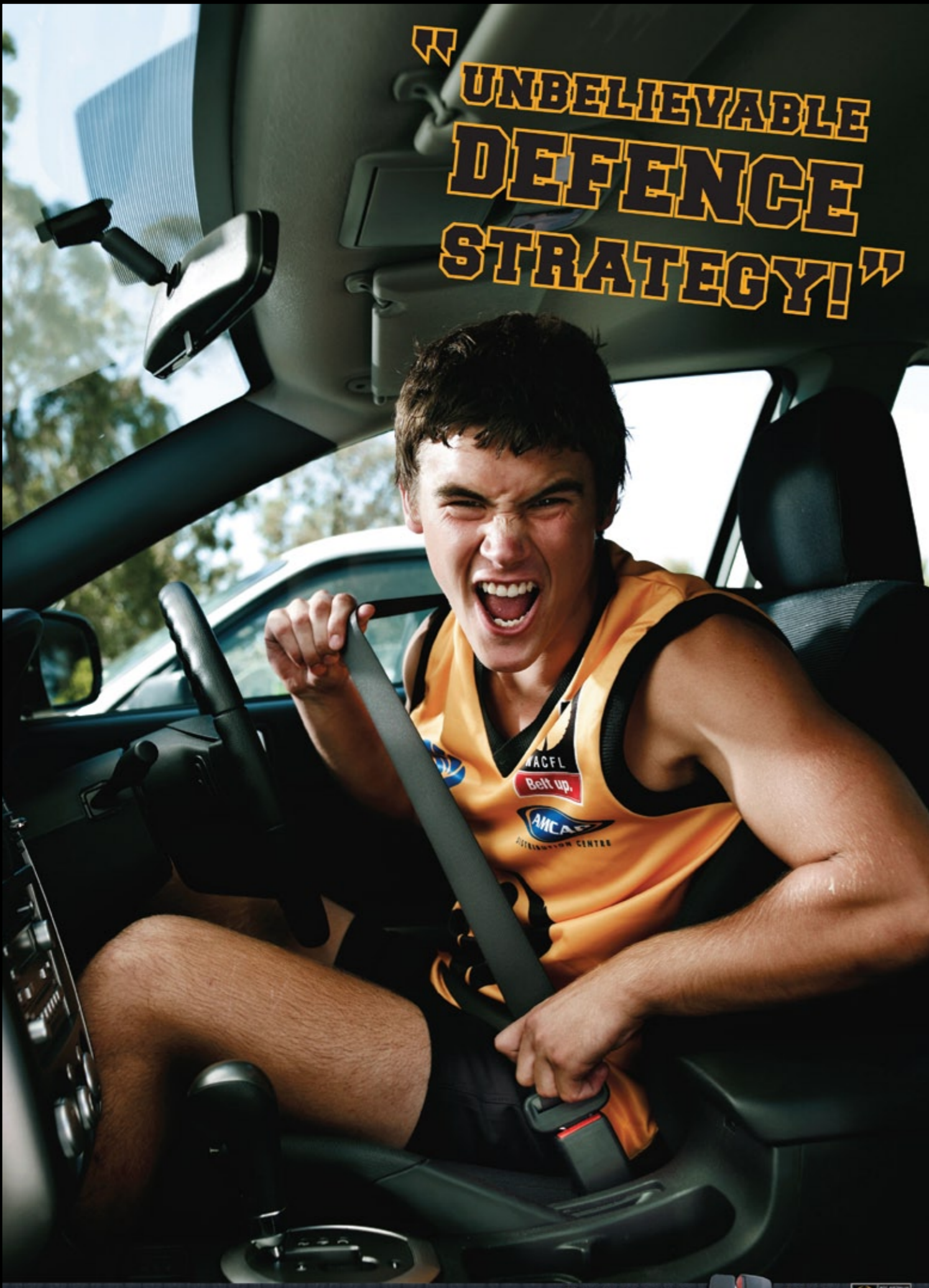

## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

There has been some ongoing uncertainty around the future of football in the State which appears to be coming to a pointy end early in 2017.

The WACFL continues its negotiations with the State Government around the future financial model of football and the WAFC is also conducting a 360 Review of Football - a review which has the potential to alter how football is run in the State.

Both these projects could greatly impact on country football moving into the future, so it is critical that the WACFL continues to represent the interests of Country Football to ensure the best outcomes for our Leagues, Clubs and players.

The WACFL's 2014-2016 Strategic Plan is coming to an end and we look forward to using this plan as a building block to a more comprehensive plan for country football in which we address the challenges faced by country football.

At the commencement of this year, the Country team changed its reporting lines through to a 'Community Football' branch under the management of Warren Nel. This decision was made by the WAFC as it felt that closer integration with community football would result in more efficient management. We look forward to working with Warren and the Community Team into the future.

A highlight of the 2016 year was the appointment of WACFL Life Members Catherine VanderWeide and John Morton.

Both were deserving recipients, Cathy for her involvement in the Great Northern Football League, women's football and her 11 years of service to the WACFL. John has been a driving force behind the Great Southern Colts Carnival for decades and has given opportunity for countless Colts aged players to play representative football.

Congratulations are also in order for WACFL Life Member Jock Beattie who was recently honoured with WAFC Life Membership for more than 50 years' service to the game.

In February 2016, the WACFL lost a valued Life Member with the passing of Clem Bray. Clem was a fantastic contributor to the WACFL and football in the Great Southern, so we offer our condolences to his wife Jeanette and family and thank him for his contribution.

The WACFL's financial position has plateaued at \$365,000 after returning a small profit in 2016. 2017 is shaping as being the tightest budget in a number of years and the WACFL will be investigating strategies to increase our revenue and

ability to adequately staff country football in 2017.

The Country team of Joe, Brent, Robyn, Kellie and Ben continued to work hard to develop country football and are a fantastic asset for our Executive and leagues. We are all excited about some of the initiatives on the radar and their ability to enhance the management of country football.

I'd like to thank my fellow Executive members for their contribution to country football in 2016. Each of us has our unique experiences, situations and challenges, but it's pleasing to see that we all put those aside for the betterment of country football and make decisions we feel are in the best interests of the game.



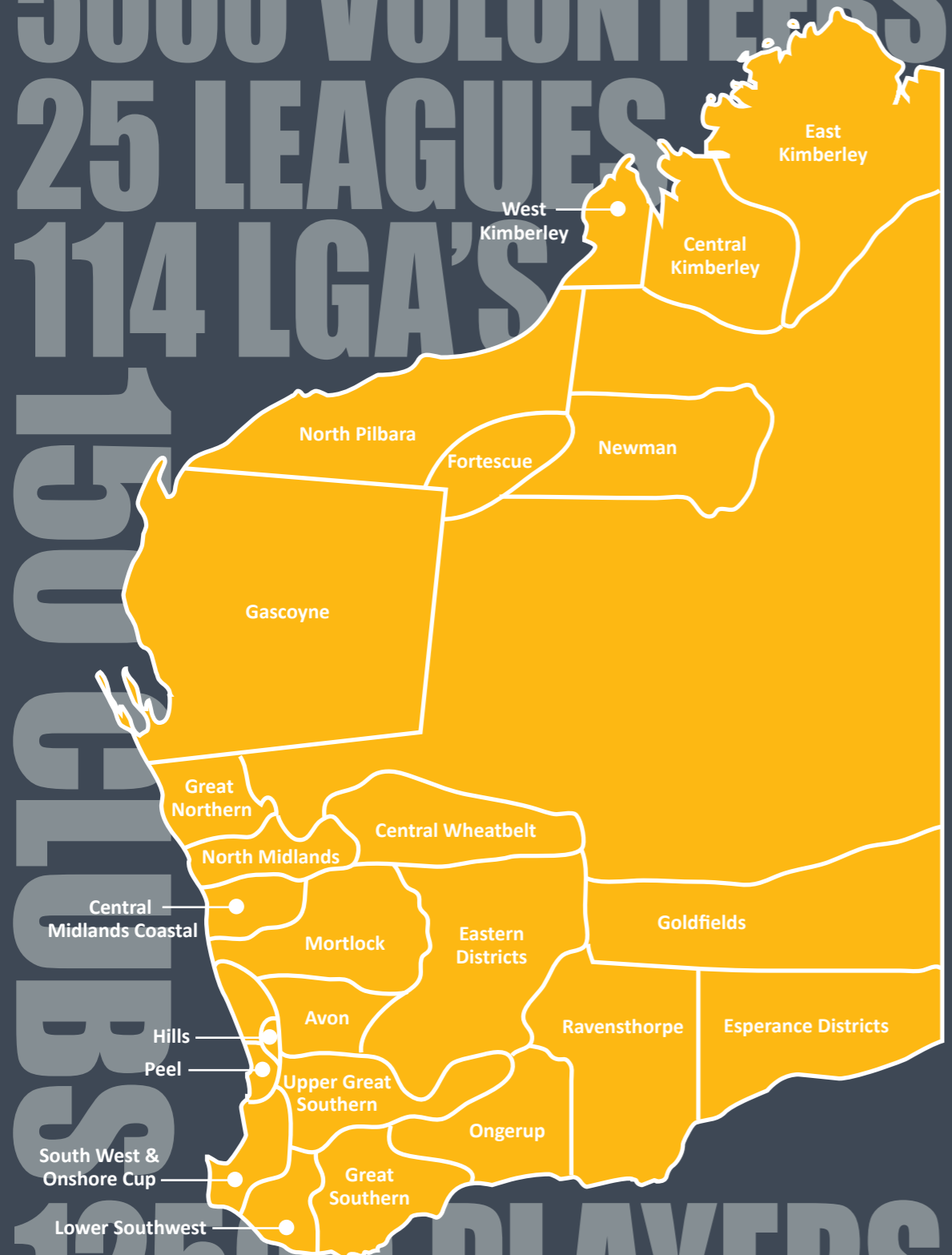

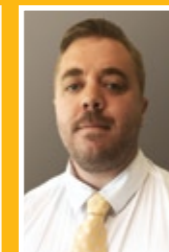

## GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

The 2016 season was a busy one for Country Football, especially our State programs with the CBH Colts playing a number of matches including a curtain raiser on Domain Stadium in April and a match against the State Amateur Colts. Continuing to enhance the pathway and programs for country colts has been a significant talking point for the Executive and an area in which we are keen to invest in years to come.

A highlight of the season was the State side's trip to Adelaide where they played on the magnificent Adelaide Oval. It was a massive honour for all those who took part in this match. Despite losing by 36 points, it was a highly competitive match and there was improvement shown by all those who partook in the program. I'd like to thank everyone who helped bring this trip together and look forward to hosting South Australia in 2017.

The Landmark Country Football Championships undertook a revised format in 2016 which saw regional matches played over a weekend in June, as well as a shortened weekend in July. This trial was done for several reasons and we will again look at carrying on a similar format in 2017.

This 2016 championships will be most remembered for the wet weather experienced on the Saturday which saw some teams play in hail. Peel Football &

Netball League also ended the South West League's run of five straight Division 1 titles when they brought a very strong side to town.

Mortlock and Eastern Districts played a highly competitive Division 2 Grand Final which Mortlock narrowly won. The South West was back to its best in the Colts section defeating an improved Great Southern unit. A Regional All Stars composite side gave opportunity to players from outer lying leagues to experience Landmark and had a great Championships which gave opportunity for some players to play State football.

From a competition management perspective, following a disappointing end to the 2015 season, our network has embraced a continual improvement approach which has seen development in how we manage incidences like poor player, official and spectator behaviour. Pleasingly,

there was a significant drop in these incidences in 2016 from previous years. We have finished off the year with further improvements to our systems which should see further enhancements to the running and match day environments of country football in years to come.

The Executive was also proactive in introducing a Drug Policy to assist our network manage this concerning issue. This initiative was strongly driven from our regional stakeholders who were wanting football to be proactive in addressing this societal issue.

Player payments have been the elephant in the room of country football for some time and the Executive was keen to implement policy to address this issue. It's always hard implementing State wide policy for such an issue as each league is unique, however we are confident we have a system that will have a positive impact on football in

2017. The upside to country football if we can address this issue will be significant, so we therefore felt it was well worth the effort. The responsibility will now be put on clubs to try and win the premiership whilst working within the set guidelines, with harsh penalties for those that step outside them.

The WACFL again received fantastic support from our partners including the WA Football Commission, ICWA, Landmark, The CBH Group, The Regional Men's Health Initiative, New Holland, West Coast Poly and Media 365.

The WAFU has undertaken a major review of football and I'm confident there will be positive changes on the horizon for country football that can support those running competitions in the country. Whilst the current structures of football may have served us well, it seemed an opportune time to assess whether things can be done better. Country Stakeholders were given a number of opportunities to contribute towards this

review, so we look forward to early 2017 when the findings and recommendations will become public.

I was happy with the volume of work our WACFL staff members Shaun Jasper, Brent Sheridan, Robyn Payne, Kellie Morley and volunteer Ben Ralph accomplished this year and we continue to endeavour to help support healthy competitions around the state.

Shaun resigned from the Operations Coordinator position early in the year to move to Queensland where he has since landed a job for AFL Queensland. I'd like to thank him for his contribution to country football. We are certainly proud to have helped a country lad on his football journey.

Shaun's resignation opened the door for Brent Sheridan to join our team. Brent has had a great start with us and his initiative has been noticed by all involved.

I'd like to take the time to acknowledge all those who are exiting the administration of country football at the end of this season and thank them for their services to their communities. Volunteering is a thankless job at times, but without our volunteers the game would not be possible at a grass roots level.

Thank you also to our Leagues and Clubs for their support of our team throughout the year.

Finally, I'd like to thank the members of the Executive for their support in the previous 12 months. I believe the WACFL is becoming stronger each season and we need to ensure we are well positioned in the coming years.

# W AFC MANAGER UMPIRING PATHWAYS REPORT

Umpiring Programs to assist WACFL affiliates and identify umpires for the WAFL talent pathway commenced with the Umpire Coach PD program delivered throughout February. A total of 39 umpire coaches attended from across regional and metropolitan WA (nine WACFL affiliate umpire coaches), with representation from market sectors including AFL to juniors. The format included laws and interpretations through to a consistent umpire coaching philosophy across WA.

The 2016 Landmark Country Football Championships provided another great opportunity to identify talented umpires who may transition to WAFL and provided further development and coaching opportunities for all those umpires who attended. Full credit is extended to the collective team of 76 umpires and umpire coaches alike who participated in the Championships.

61 umpires in total (22 field, 18 boundary and 21 goal umpires) from WACFL affiliated leagues were provided with an opportunity to learn from evening and match day coaching. Mindful of the importance of the Championships to players, they all umpired to the best of their abilities which was terrific to see.

Congratulations to South West field umpire Aaron Andrews, who was awarded the JJ Lussick Medal as 2016 Umpire of the Landmark Championships.

Aaron, together with Theo Bennett (GNFL boundary umpire) and Jason Crowe (South West goal umpire), were afforded the great opportunity of umpiring the SACFL v WACFL match in Adelaide in July.

The AFL Umpire Roadshow Program visited Esperance in March 2016.

AFL umpires Nick Brown (Victorian based AFL field umpire), Brett Dalglish (WA based AFL boundary umpire) and Brett Rogers (WA based AFL goal umpire) visited the region, accompanied by W AFC Umpiring and Development staff. The visit included sessions with local tribunal members, plus skills sessions with local Esperance umpires.

A highlight from the roadshow was the 50 people, including umpires, umpire coaches, and player coaches, in the one room in a highly interactive session that included viewing game vision and interesting discussion. It was also great to see the roadshow receive coverage with regional media outlets.

W AFC Umpiring staff also visited several regional leagues and communities throughout 2016 including Karratha, Tom Price, Wickham, South Hedland, Dampier, Albany and surrounds, South West, Esperance, Broome, Carnarvon, Geraldton, Peel, and Bruce Rock.

Full time W AFC staff based throughout regional WA remain important to supporting local umpire supply (recruitment) and quality (education via resources), in partnership with local leagues.

We will continue to work with Country Leagues in 2017 to prioritise the appointment of local umpire coaches and to have attendance from league representatives at the next Umpire PD workshop early in 2017. This is a financially subsidised PD opportunity, that kicks off the important obligation of leagues to have their umpire coach and umpires accredited.

Interest in our code reached record breaking levels in 2016. There are now over 70,000 players enjoying a structured football experience in community clubs and schools across regional WA. This large participation base would not occur without a passionate army of volunteers, collectively dedicating countless hours of their valuable time into delivering our great game.

These thousands of selfless acts showcase what is special about WA footy. Volunteerism is front and centre in our football heartland and offers a range of benefits to our society. Nowhere is this more evident than across the regions of WA. It can allow families to share meaningful experiences together and provide a sense of satisfaction in contributing to the social fabric of our respective communities.

2017 will continue to provide challenges for us to tackle together. Regionally, the issues of population shift, financial sustainability, constitutional reform, player access, climate and employment opportunities are

ever present realities that are contended by football stakeholders every year. However, with the close partnerships and aligned objectives of the WAFC, WACFL and RFDC's, we are in a good starting position to move these issues forward.

I would like to congratulate the efforts and successes of Terry House, along with the WACFL Board, leagues and clubs for delivering a fantastic year of football in 2016. 

# NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2016

<p><b>1. BASIS OF PREPARATION</b></p> <p>In the opinion of the Committee of Management, the Association is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial report who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the Act.</p> <p>The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards and Accounting Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements, AASB 107 Statement of Cash Flows, AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors and AASB 1054 Australian Additional Disclosures.</p> <p>Significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and are consistent with prior reporting periods unless otherwise stated.</p> <p>The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.</p> <p><b>2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES</b></p> <p><b>Impairment of Non-Financial Assets</b></p> <p>At the end of each reporting period the association determines whether there is an evidence of an impairment indicator for non-financial assets.</p> <p>Where this indicator exists and regardless for goodwill, indefinite life intangible assets and intangible assets not yet available for use, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated.</p> <p>Where assets do not operate independently of other assets, the recoverable amount of the relevant cash-generating unit (CGU) is estimated.</p>	<p>The recoverable amount of an asset or CGU is the higher of the fair value less costs of disposal and the value in use. Value in use is the present value of the future cash flows expected to be derived from an asset or cash-generating unit.</p> <p>Where the recoverable amount is less than the carrying amount, an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.</p> <p>Reversal indicators are considered in subsequent periods for all assets which have suffered an impairment loss, except for goodwill.</p> <p><b>Cash and Cash Equivalents</b></p> <p>Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.</p> <p><b>REVENUE AND OTHER INCOME</b></p> <p>Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the association and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.</p> <p>All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).</p> <p>Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.</p> <p><b>Interest revenue</b></p> <p>Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method.</p> <p><b>Dividend revenue</b></p> <p>Dividends are recognised when the right to receive payment is established.</p>

<p><b>Rendering of services</b></p> <p>Revenue in relation to rendering of services is recognised depending on whether the outcome of the services can be estimated reliably.
