Claremont Tigers and Country Football WA staff visited the girls at the Shooting Stars Program at East Kimberley College in Kununurra



Kimberley All Girls Football Clinic - Dockers Cup Broome



On the May 24th West Kimberley Primary Schools came together for the annual Netball and Docker's Shield Football Carnival at Broome Recreation and Aquatic Centre. There were a whopping 9 schools involved in the Docker's Shield, some travelling 2+ hours from their remote communities to participate.

This year, as part of our efforts to align with the AFL's Women's and Girls Strategy - we offered girls at primary schools in the area an opportunity to nominate and be part of an all-girls football clinic/carnival running alongside the mixed Docker's Shield and netball. We were pleasantly surprised to have over 40 year 5/6 female students choose to participate in the All-girls football clinic, proving there is an appetite in the Kimberley for female football pathways. Students from all schools combined to participate in 3 hours of footy skills, drills, games and team building activities.

Fitzroy Valley Dockers Shield & Dockers Cup



This year in Fitzroy Crossing we held both a Docker's Shield (boys) and Docker's Cup (girls) football carnival with schools in the Fitzroy Valley. 6 schools travelled from their remote communities resulting in **120 students** playing football and participating in the health education sessions. Nindilingarri Cultural Health Services supported the event by hosting health workshops for all teams to participate in between their fixtured games and sponsoring spirit and best & fairest awards for each team. An important part of football's relationship with communities is to foster healthy environments for people to participate in the sport.
