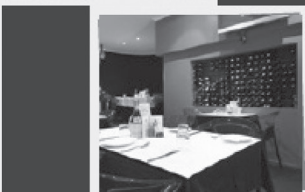

CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER REPORT STUART KEMP

There was much to like about 2014.

On the field, winning six out of our last seven games, and our last five straight has provided the players and our organisation with a great fillip for next year. Unfortunately, again, we let ourselves down with a poor start to the season, with our first win not coming until Round 5 when we defeated West Perth by 23 points. We can't afford to have these starts as we 'chase our tail' all year and makes it very difficult to gain momentum and confidence.

Our senior squad was stretched this year and this resulted in a difficult year for our reserves coming off a premiership in 2013. The players would not field a team if wasn't for the efforts of this group. CO-LOCATION BUSINESS CASE

On May 30 this year, the club sent to the media a release titled – ‘The South Fremantle Football Club and the East Fremantle Football Club are to investigate the opportunity for co-tenancy at Fremantle Oval’.

The business case, which will be commencing shortly, will involve investigating a range of options which may include EFFC staying its current home East Fremantle Oval or sharing Fremantle Oval with us. The advantages and disadvantages of these options along with the associated costs will be determined during the course of this business case. This investigation recognises our and EFFC commitment to the greater Fremantle community and to Club members to assess whether co-tenancy is best for our long term future.

Our decision to investigate this is for the long-term sustainability of South Fremantle and will result in the saving of many costs, (electricity as an example).

The State Government, through the Department of Sport and Recreation, is helping facilitate the process of this investigation and along with The City of Fremantle have committed to providing some funding to assist with the process. Finally, I feel it would be negligent of SFFC to its members not to investigate all sustainability opportunities for the betterment of the organisation and its future, however remember nothing is a certainty at this stage.

ADMINISTRATION

Firstly I would like to thank our mainstays in the office, Michelle Miller, Mel Marsh, Jess Nolan, Darren Winnett, Chris Pike and Steve McCarthy for all of their hard work again this year. Their professionalism has really taken our organisation to a new level. In saying this, there has been a few changes this year and we have seen a few movements including:

- David Depane replacing Garry Davidson as football operations manager
- Jason Pedulla replacing David Depane as player development manager
- Aldo Marsegaglia replacing Troy Mahoney as the club accountant



I would like to make a special mention to Garry Davidson for his hard work with the organisation over his four years. Garry has been a true professional and brought many outstanding qualities to our club from his previous employer – the Geelong Football Club. We wish him all the best for his future endeavours.

On field performance does have a correlation to the financial performance of the organisation and I now feel our senior list is not too far away from some sustained success. With this in mind we are hoping with more success will come more opportunities in our memberships and gate numbers and will definitely aid in the procurement of new sponsorship. Finally, we will continue to carry out a policy of tight fiscal management and aim to streamline expenses while increasing our revenue streams.

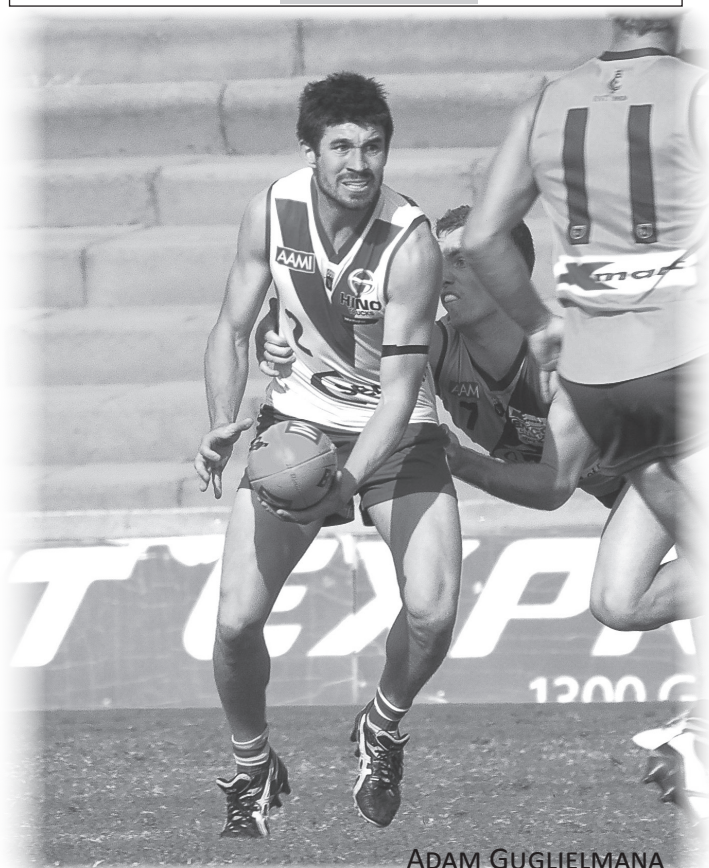

BULLDOGS DOMINATE INDIVIDUAL AWARDS

A host of South Fremantle players had outstanding seasons in 2014 and were acknowledged including Ashton Hams winning the Simpson Medal and Ben Saunders claiming the Bernie Naylor Medal.

Hams (pictured below left) won his Simpson Medal after being judged best afield in Western Australia's State game win over the NEAFL in Sydney while Saunders claimed the Bernie Naylor Medal as the WAFL's leading goalkicker in the 2014 season.

Haiden Schloithe (pictured below middle), Ben Sokol, Matthew Ah Siu and Cameron Loersch were among the other players to either win significant league or club awards in 2014.

Hams was one of four players to represent WA in the State game win over the NEAFL at Blacktown in Sydney, and the 28-year-old who was in his first season back full-time with the Bulldogs was given the nod for the Simpson Medal ahead of Schloithe, Ryan Cook and Saunders.

He tore the NEAFL apart racking up plenty of the ball and using it well on his left boot, and his reward was the Simpson Medal and it's the second of his career after also receiving one following the Bulldogs' 2009 premiership victory.

Jarrod Pickett, Jarrod Garlett, Brad McPhail, Kade Stewart, Jacob Dragovich, Ah Siu and Billy Frampton all represented WA in the State 18s in 2014.

Cameron Loersch was also the colts' leading goalkicker in 2014 with 57 majors while also being named the full-forward in the Colts Team of the Year alongside Ah Siu (wing), McPhail (half-back) and Frampton (ruck).

South Fremantle was also well represented in the State 16s with Mitchell Dzelebdzic, Luke Strnadica, Dylan Brown and Zane Sumich all selected in the WA team to play at the National Championships on the Gold Coast.

Meanwhile, Saunders (pictured below right with Minister for Sport Terry Waldron) claimed his second Bernie Naylor Medal as the WAFL's leading goalkicker in three years since joining the Bulldogs from Claremont.

The 22-year-old has just completed his third season with South Fremantle and now has a second Bernie Naylor Medal to show for it after kicking 59 goals in 2014.

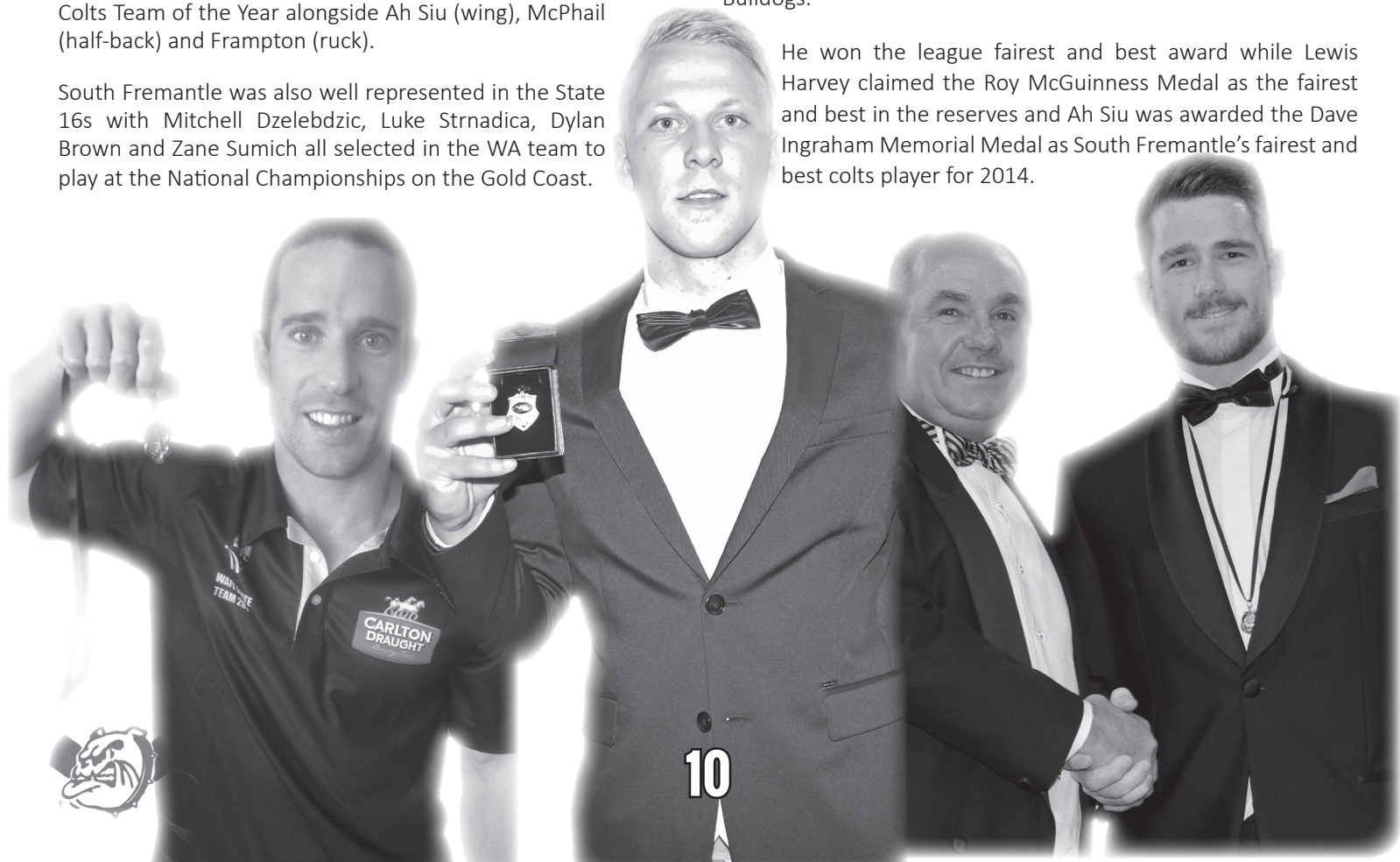
Despite a seven-goal haul in Round 5 against West Perth in what was South Fremantle's first win of the 2014 season, Saunders had plenty of work to do to chase down Subiaco's Matt Boland, but he finished the season in hot form as did the team which won the last five matches.

Saunders kicked six goals against Perth in Round 16 and then backed it up with four against East Fremantle in Round 19, four against Swan Districts in Round 21, five in Round 22 against Subiaco and another five against Peel in the final round.

That meant that he kicked 14 goals in the last three weeks and 27 in the last seven to wrap up the Bernie Naylor Medal for the second time.

Then there were the club fairest and best winners for 2014 with Schloithe capping off his tremendous season following the last two years on Fremantle's rookie-list, by claiming the WJ Hughes Medal after a strong year as a goalkicking midfielder with the Bulldogs.

He won the league fairest and best award while Lewis Harvey claimed the Roy McGuinness Medal as the fairest and best in the reserves and Ah Siu was awarded the Dave Ingraham Memorial Medal as South Fremantle's fairest and best colts player for 2014.

ROUND 1

Inaccuracy cost South Fremantle to open the season against Subiaco with the Bulldogs kicking six straight behinds in the third quarter, and then 2.5 in the last to lose by 38 points despite more disposals, inside 50s and scoring shots.

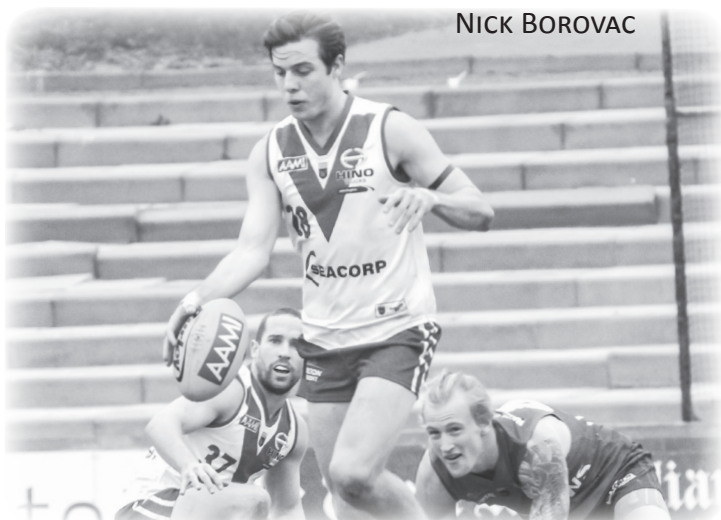
ROUND 2

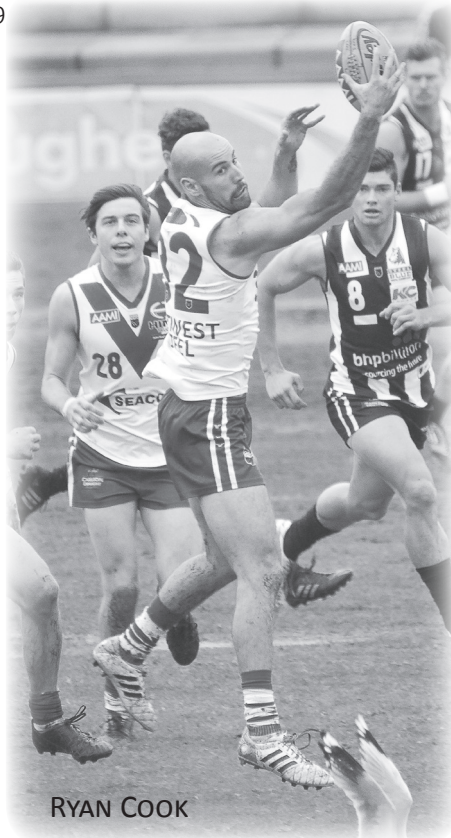
The reserves lost by two points with Bewick picking up 25 possessions while the colts lost another grand final rematch by 36 points.

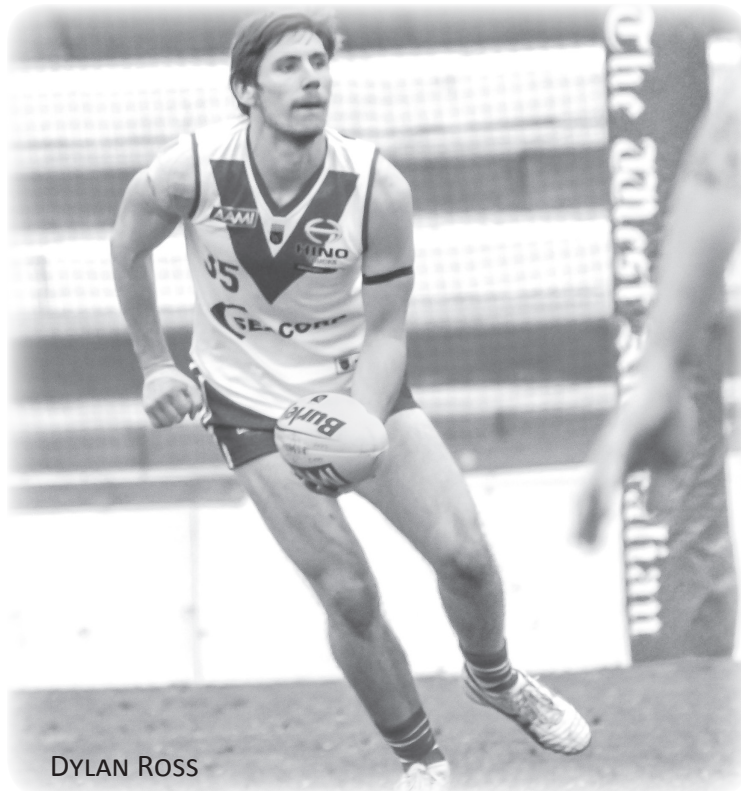

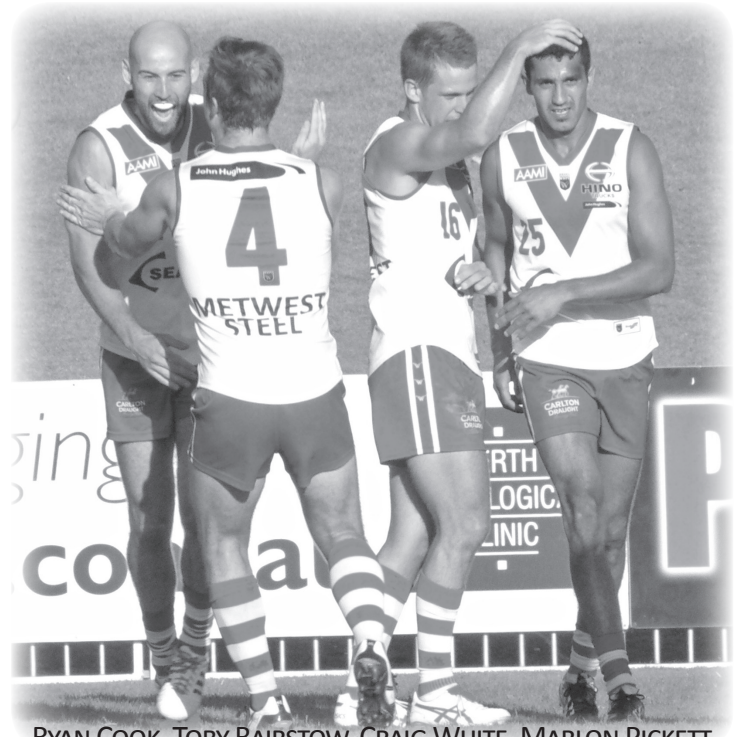

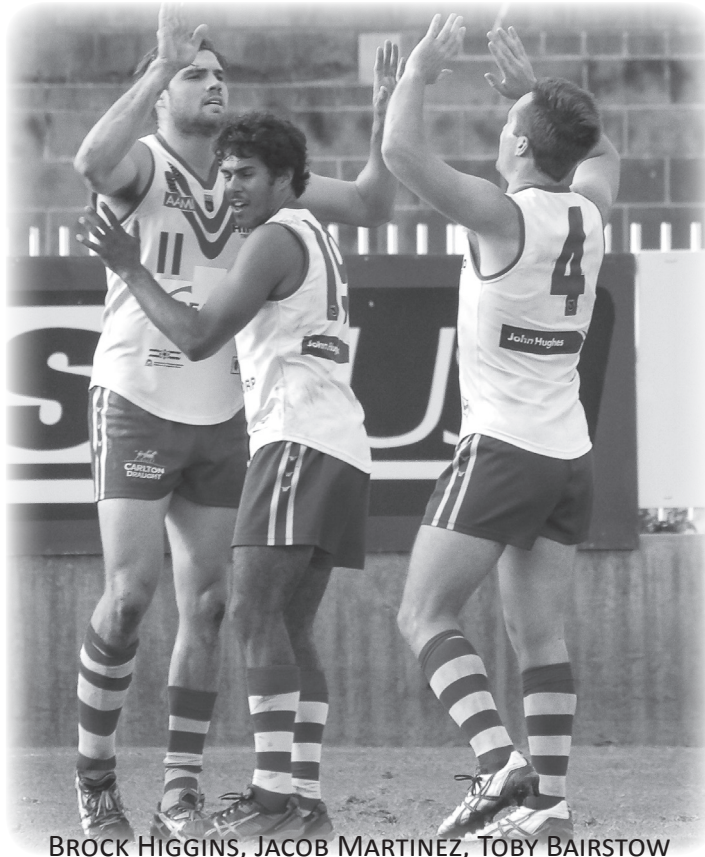


ROUND 22

KRIS MILLER TRIBUTE 300-PLUS GAME LEGEND RETIRES

The remarkable WAFL career of Kris Miller came to an end in the Foundation Derby on WA Day at Fremantle Oval and it was a fitting occasion to recognise the contributions he made to both the South Fremantle and East Fremantle Football Clubs.

While the result didn't go his way with South Fremantle coming up short against East Fremantle, playing on Fremantle Oval, performing well with 20 possessions and having a crowd of 5566 in attendance meant it was a fitting occasion to end his stunning 303-game WAFL career.

His 303 games in the WAFL were made up of 153 with East Fremantle and 150 with South Fremantle which makes him the only player in history to reach 150 matches with two clubs, and just the sixth player in WAFL history to reach 300 overall.

Along the way, Miller won a fairest and best award with East Fremantle, three with South Fremantle, played for Western Australia and most significantly played in the Bulldogs' premiership of 2009.

Consistency, quality and longevity easily sum up his remarkable career as he joins Bill Dempsey, Mel Whinnen, Jack Sheedy, Bill Walker and Brian Peake as 300-game WAFL players.

Over 153 matches at East Fremantle that saw him earn life



membership, win a Lynn Medal and play in the 2000 grand final, he was one of the Sharks' best players the entire time no matter how the club was performing.

Remarkably, since arriving at South Fremantle in 2007 he has had an even better period of his career both in terms of individual accolades and team success.

A premiership was what he craved and he achieved that in 2009 while winning one of his three WJ Hughes Medals as South Fremantle fairest and best in the same year.

Miller was excited to reach the 300-game milestone in Round 2 of the 2014 season against Perth under lights on a Friday night at Fremantle Oval before his career then came to an end in his 150th game with the Bulldogs on WA Day.

"It was exciting to get to 300 games and obviously it has been a long time coming. I have been thinking about it for a while and at the end of last year I didn't know if I would be able to play on or not, so it was hovering around for six months. It was pretty exciting for me and my family," Miller said.

"If you look at the names of the players who have done it, they are in the upper echelon of the history of WA football. If I can't be anywhere near as good as them, at least my name is up there among those players for something with the games we've played.

"I think it's something that is pretty special and it probably means even more now that I have finished up and can always look back and say I got to 300 games."

Miller isn't sure what his secret to being so durable has been, but not having serious injuries to keep him sidelined has certainly helped as has the fact that his form was always strong over 300-plus matches that he was always a permanent league footballer.

"I'm not sure there is a secret to it. I suppose I've been lucky with injuries. Really I have got there because of a lot of luck and fortunately I have been able to play good enough footy where generally my head hasn't been on the chopping block. I try to pride myself on being a good, consistent player week in week out, year after year," he said.

"One of the proudest things with my career I have is that I like to think I have been really consistent the whole way through.

"Getting to your 100 or 150 or 200 or 250-game milestones is one thing, but I'm proud that I don't think I have been towed along to any of them and instead I've been partially doing the towing for whatever team I've played for. That sits more with me than anything that I know that I have been doing a good job for my team and earned my spot for 300 games now."

Miller was disappointed with what happened at the end of 2006 to see him end up departing East Fremantle prematurely, but the result for him personally has been the best thing to ever happen to his career.

He took no time fitting in at South Fremantle and will be remembered as a great of the Bulldogs as a life member,



three-time fairest and best winner and premiership player.

And when you consider he had a whole 153-game career under his belt when he arrived at Fremantle Oval, the Miller story is a remarkable one, will never be repeated and will see him always remembered now as an all-time great of WA football.

"What happened at East Fremantle happened but not in my wildest dreams at that point did I imagine I would still end up playing 300 games and earn life membership at Souths after doing the same thing at East Fremantle," Miller said.

"It's just funny how things turn out. I loved my majority of time at East Fremantle when I was there as well and things turned a bit sour, but that wasn't

through my decisions. Things happen and I wasn't interested in being part of the direction they were going.

"John Dimmer was down here and I liked the way he went about things and it was only another five minutes down the road so it was convenient as well for me.

"South Fremantle has embraced me since I arrived and I certainly have embraced South Fremantle so I am comfortable that I have got as much out of them as they have from me."

SCHLOITHE CAPS OFF YEAR WITH HUGHES MEDAL

Haiden Schloithe was recognised for his outstanding season on return from Fremantle with the South Fremantle Football Club awarding him the WJ Hughes Medal as its fairest and best winner for the 2014 WAFL season.

The WJ Hughes Medal night for 2014 was held in the Griff John Function Centre at Fremantle Oval and was a time to acknowledge the efforts of senior coach Paul Hasleby over the past three seasons and to look forward to a strong future that he has helped set up for incoming coach Todd Curley.

South Fremantle might have missed finals for the third straight season, but there were terrific signs with five straight wins to close out the season and with each and every player featured on the fairest and best leaderboard committed to being with the club in 2015, the future looks bright.

Schloithe received the WJ Hughes Medal for 2014 in recognition of a terrific season he delivered as an attacking, goalkicking midfielder in his first season back full time with the Bulldogs after two seasons on the Fremantle Dockers' rookie-list.

The 21-year-old was a colts premierships player with South Fremantle prior to being picked up by Fremantle and was quick to rejoin the Bulldogs for 2014, and put together a season that could very well lead him back into the AFL.

Schloithe kicked 25 goals in his 20 games this season including four in Round 6 against East Fremantle and he also averaged almost 24 possessions a game including 38 in Round 4 against Swan Districts, 37 in Round 5 against West Perth and 30 in Round 16 against Perth.

Schloithe finished the fairest and best count on 48 votes to be nine votes clear of the runner-up Tim Kelly with Ashton Hams finishing third a further vote back on 37.



Dylan Ross and Nick Borovac both took further strides in their careers as strong defenders in 2014 and that was reflected in the fairest and best voting with the pair finishing fourth and fifth respectively with Ross finishing with 32 votes and Borovac 30.

Adam Guglielmana began his season as a small forward but finished in defence and despite missing four games with a hamstring injury, was sixth in the voting with 29 votes while Toby Bairstow spent the first three weeks in the reserves, but had a terrific season after that in the midfield.

Bairstow ended up polling 28 votes for the season as did emerging and prolific ball-winning midfielder Brendan Verrier.

Captain, and former two-time Hughes Medal winner, Ryan Cook also ended up on 28 votes and would have been much higher up in the leaderboard had he not missed the final seven games through injury.

Further highlighting the depth that South Fremantle has for incoming coach Todd Curley to work with is the fact that the likes of Bernie Naylor Medallist Ben Saunders, Craig White, Brock Higgins, Jacob Martinez, Steven Verrier, Shaun Bewick and James Sellar are all key players not featured in the top nine in the vote count for the 2014 season.

Other league award winners on the night saw Ben Sokol take home the Shearer Family Trophy for the Best First Year player and Jarrod Parry receive the Culver Family Courage and Perseverance Award in recognition of his outstanding progression from a horror run of knee injuries.

MILESTONES 2014

BAIRSTOW TON HEADS LANDMARKS

A host of South Fremantle players celebrated significant milestones in 2014 with Kris Miller reaching his 300th WAFL game and 150th with the Bulldogs while Toby Bairstow brought up his century and another six players also reached 50.

As well as Miller's 150th club and 300th WAFL milestones, and Bairstow's 100th, Shaun Bewick, Brock Higgins, Dylan Ross and Ben Saunders all played their 50th games in the league in 2014 and Nick Borovac and Haiden Schloithe reached 50 with South Fremantle.

Miller played his 300th WAFL match in Round 2 against Perth at Fremantle Oval in a Friday night game where he became just the sixth player in league history to reach triple-figures.

He then reached 150 games with South Fremantle in the Foundation Derby on WA Day in what turned out to be the final match of his remarkable 303-game WAFL career.

Bairstow booked his name on the No. 4 locker at Fremantle Oval when he played his 100th match for South Fremantle against Claremont at the Showground in Round 15.

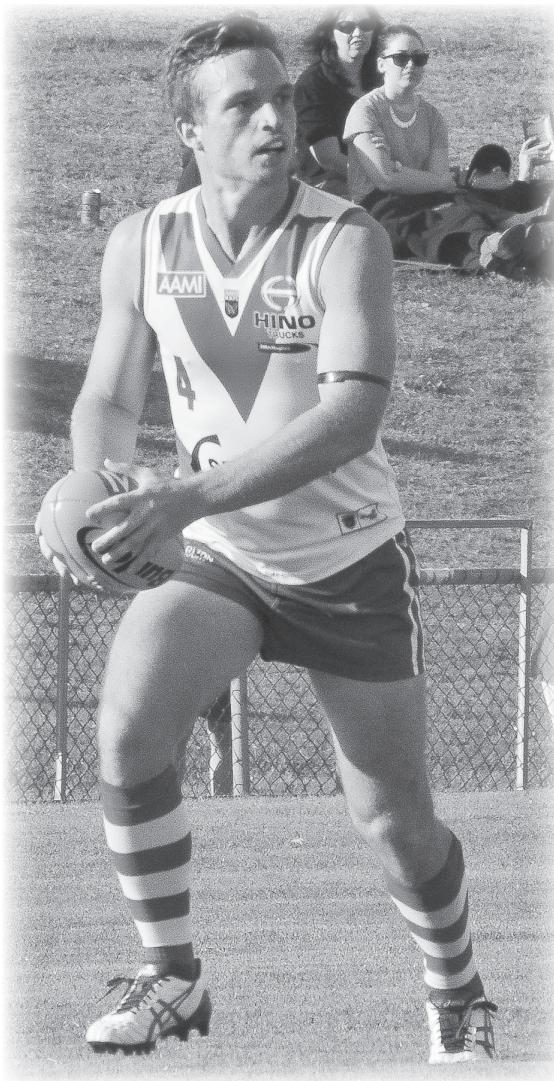
It wasn't always a smooth ride to 100 games since he graduated through the colts and reserves at South Fremantle after coming up from Bunbury to make his league debut in Round 6, 2008.

He played 16 games in the premiership year of 2009 including kicking the winning goal in an incredible Anzac Day derby against East Fremantle and playing well in the second semi-final win over Subiaco, but he and Hayden North made way for Jeff Farmer and Peter Bell in the grand final.

Bairstow shook off the disappointment of that to continue to develop his game further in 2010 as a permanent midfielder averaging over 25 possessions a game and then backing that up in 2011 averaging over 23.

The departure of John Dimmer as coach saw Paul Hasleby take over and give Bairstow a new role on the wing in 2012 and that's something he was doing tremendously until a hand injury saw his season end after 10 matches.

He was back as a strong contributor again for the first 17 games of 2013 before being dropped for the final three matches and



then also being asked to play reserves for the opening three games of 2014.

However, he put his head down and worked hard to get back into the league side where he has remained since starring in the Round 5 win over West Perth with him returning to playing as an inside midfielder.

Bairstow was proud to reach the 100-game mark at a club that means a lot to him and his family.

"It's huge to get to 100 games. To be honest it's a big part of why you continue to play football. To have played at Souths, to now be about to play 100 games and getting my name on the locker means a lot," Bairstow said.

"Over the years you start to understand how important it actually is for you as a person. I'm really excited to get there. It is something that is really special and it means a lot to me, and I've seen it mean a lot to other players."

Playing different roles over the years, missing the premiership (despite playing in the reserves flag) in 2009, having a season-ending injury in 2012 and now having to bounce back from being dropped all lead to the milestone meaning a lot.

"Under John, I started as a half-forward and played as an inside mid, but when Hase came I started to play a lot on the wing and this year I went back to being an inside mid. You have to be able to play a variety of roles and that's all part of it," he said.

"Over time you learn that everyone has their own opinions and that those opinions can change from year to year. To be honest, it is probably a good thing and it makes me appreciate playing back in the team again even more.

"It hasn't been the easiest thing this year to get back into the side, but you probably do get a bit carried away when you keep getting games week after week, year after year and it can tick over pretty quick, but once you miss out you really start to realise how important it is to you."

It has been impossible also for Bairstow to escape the endless comparisons and questions about his father – 1986 Sandover Medal winner with South Fremantle and 146-game AFL player and Geelong grand final captain, Mark.

He even inherited his father's nickname as his own first name, but he can't thank his parents enough for their dedicated support of his career over the years.

"I get asked a lot about my dad, but I didn't feel any pressure at all. All he has done is make my pathway a lot easier and he hasn't missed too many games," Bairstow said.

"He might have missed a couple because of the races on a Saturday, but we haven't got that many going that quick at the moment. Both mum and dad come to every game to support me. Having that surname has made it easier if anything."

Bewick began his WAFL career with West Perth in 2009 and played 30 games with the Falcons before joining South Fremantle in 2012, and having a tremendous first season with the Bulldogs.

However, injury meant he didn't make a league appearance in 2013 but he was back in 2014, playing 18 league matches, including reaching his 50th game milestone in Round 1 against Subiaco.

Borovac made his debut with South Fremantle in 2011 and over the last two years now has cemented himself as one of the best defenders in the WAFL, and he reached his 50th game in Round

12 against East Perth at Medibank Stadium.

Higgins was one player who was looking for a fresh start given the abundance of tall players East Perth was going to have with its West Coast-listed players added in, and the versatile big man arrived at South Fremantle in 2014 and had an outstanding season carrying the ruck.

Along the way, he reached his 50th WAFL game in Round 22 against Subiaco under lights at Fremantle Oval on a Friday night.

Ross began his career with Claremont at centre half-forward in 2009, but he moved to South Fremantle in 2011

looking for more opportunities and now over the last two years has settled into a key defensive role and is one of the very best in the WAFL.

He also reached his 50th WAFL game during 2014 in Round 12 against East Perth.

Saunders also began his career with Claremont before making the move to South Fremantle in 2012, and he has now played 47 games for 151 goals with the Bulldogs. He reached 50 WAFL games in Round 22 against Subiaco.

Schloithe made his league debut with South Fremantle in 2011 after a successful period in the colts and he reached his 50th game in Round 19 against East Fremantle.

FREMANTLE OVAL UPDATE

BULLDOGS, SHARKS CONSIDER CO-TENANCY

The City of Fremantle has approved to fund a business case to be put together to investigate the feasibility of the South Fremantle Football Club again sharing Fremantle Oval with the East Fremantle Football Club.

City of Fremantle mayor Brad Pettitt and his council agreed in October to fund the business case that is set to be delivered by the middle of 2015 investigating the co-tenancy with the objective to retain the sustainability of Fremantle Oval once the Fremantle Dockers leave its current premises.

The plan would see both South and East Fremantle share Fremantle Oval as a WAFL playing and training base while also keeping the venue as a sporting and community facility.

By joining forces it could also help Fremantle Oval be turned into a sustainable WAFL Centre of Excellence with the venue to be redeveloped into a modern facility.

Both the South and East Fremantle Football Clubs have a proud history in the Fremantle community and this investigation recognises the commitment of each club to the greater Fremantle community and to club members to assess whether co-tenancy is best for our long-term future.

This decision to create a business case is for the sustainability of both clubs as well as ensuring Fremantle Oval continues to be an important community hub.

The South Fremantle Football Club, apart from 1906, has played its home games at Fremantle Oval since being founded in 1900. From foundation in 1898 to the completion of the 1952 season and with the exception of 1906, East Fremantle played home games at Fremantle Oval.

The coming together of the two port clubs to investigate their facilities' future recognises the potential benefits of co-tenancy, including increased activity in the City of Fremantle, with the potential for a WAFL game being fixtured in Fremantle almost



every week of the WAFL season, along with the capital and operational cost efficiencies by sharing facilities.

South Fremantle Football Club chief executive Stuart Kemp stressed the importance of the business case.

“It would be negligent of SFFC to our members not to investigate all sustainability opportunities for the betterment of the organisation and its future, the process that will be

undertaken as part of the business case will assist the club in this regard,” Kemp said.

“This is a passionate topic for our members and fans and we will be doing everything possible to develop a business case that is one, financially and historically prudent and two, takes into account stakeholders’ concerns.

“I can’t stress enough that all key stakeholders will be part of this process and it is only early days, the finer details are yet to be determined and myself and the board feel it’s important to investigate all options to secure the future of the football club.”

The State Government, through the Department of Sport and Recreation, is helping facilitate the process of this investigation and the resultant business case. The City of Fremantle has also shown support for the project and naturally will be involved as a key stakeholder.

South Fremantle and East Fremantle both acknowledge the cooperation that will be required through this investigation and welcome the opportunity to work together through this process and acknowledge that the process will require the cooperation and goodwill of all stakeholders.

The success seen with the co-tenancy of Subiaco and East Perth at Leederville’s Medibank Stadium will be used as an example of how the proposal could work but being in the heart of Fremantle and with the prime position of Fremantle Oval it opens up endless opportunities with the two clubs and the City of Fremantle all working together.

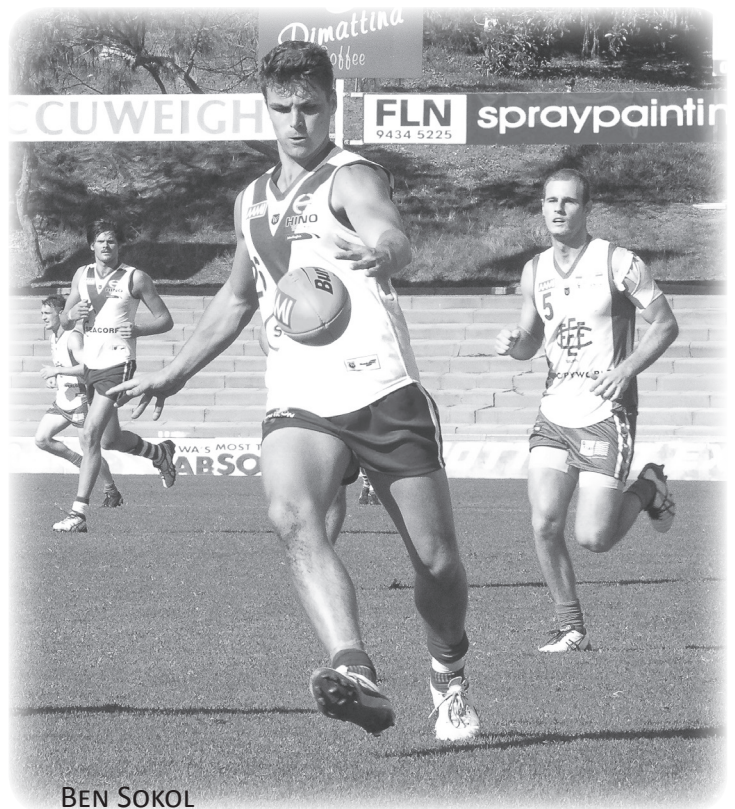

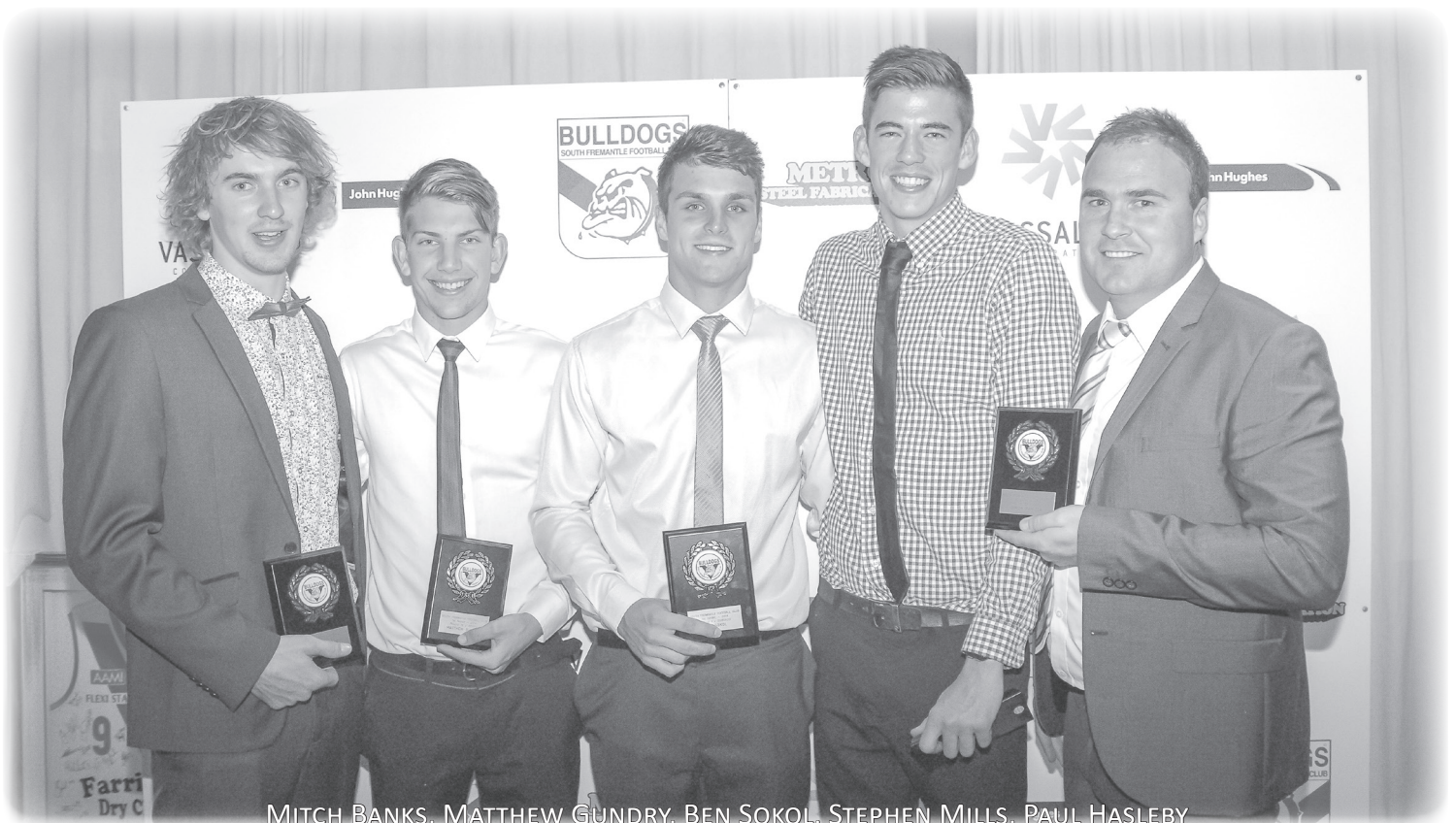
He played five straight matches between Rounds 16-21 and averaged over 13 possessions.

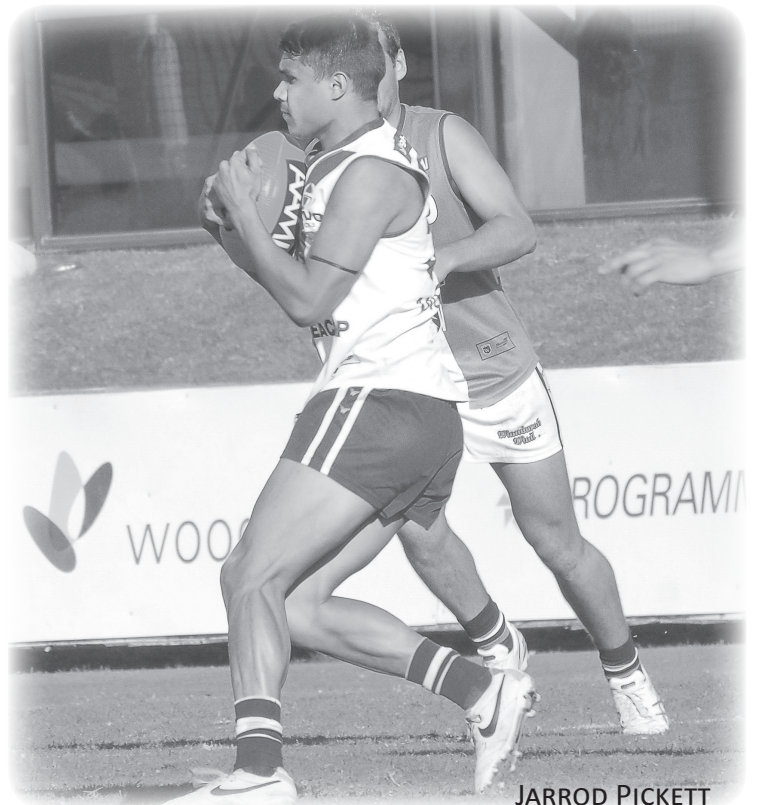

STATE REPRESENTATIVES 2014 BULLDOGS SHINE IN WA JUMPER

Four South Fremantle players starred in Western Australia's big State game win over the NEAFL during 2014 while another seven players were part of the WA State 18s team and four more in the State 16s line-up.

Ashton Hams, Haiden Schloithe, Ben Saunders and Ryan Cook all played in the WAFL's 85-point State game win over the NEAFL in Sydney on Saturday May 24 and each of them were among WA's very best at Blacktown International Sportspark.

Hams, Schloithe and Saunders all represented the WAFL for the first time while Cook played his third State game.

The four could very well have been the WAFL's four best players in the match as well in outstanding performances in the black and gold jumper.

Hams controlled the game across half-back all day long for WA and was allowed to virtually do as he pleased, and he tore the NEAFL apart.

He won the Simpson Medal and it's the second of his career after also receiving one following the Bulldogs' 2009 premiership.

Cook was his main rival for the Simpson Medal after his outstanding performance on the wing and across half-forward. He racked up plenty of the ball and kicked two goals.

Schloithe also kicked two goals while also winning plenty of the ball both as a midfielder and across half-forward.

Saunders earned his place in the team having kicked 15 goals in his previous four matches with the Bulldogs.

He again showed that he is the best pure full-forward in the WAFL with a five-goal performance in the State game victory.

The game was the first time that the WAFL has played a representative team from the North East Australian Football League featuring players from clubs based in New South Wales, the ACT, Queensland and the Northern Territory.

The WAFL kicked 19 of the last 23 goals to end up comprehensive winners, 19.18 (132) to 6.11 (47).

Meanwhile, Jacob Dragovich, Matthew Ah Siu, Jarrod Pickett, Bill Frampton, Kade Stewart, Jarrod Garlett and Brad McPhail made at least one appearance in the NAB U18 Championships.

WA's championships started against South Australia in Adelaide on May 24 with the Croweaters winning 14.8 (92) to 8.13 (61).

Ah Siu picked up 17 possessions, Pickett 15, Garlett 13 and Frampton six, five of which were contested.

Vic Metro then thrashed WA 15.20 (110) to 2.11 (23) at Leederville's Medibank Stadium with Dragovich finishing with 16 possessions, Ah Siu 14, Pickett 14, Frampton 11 and Stewart 11.

South Australia won 10.11 (71) to 9.12 (66) in a thriller with Pickett outstanding with 22 possessions and three goals. Stewart also had 19 disposals and eight tackles, Dragovich 14 touches and

nine tackles, McPhail 10 possessions and Frampton nine.

Vic Country then beat WA at Fremantle Oval by 62 points on June 15 with McPhail finishing with 14 possessions, Pickett 12 and Stewart 12.

Vic Metro beat WA 16.10 (106) to 7.6 (48) at Simonds Stadium on June 27 with Garlett having 12 kicks, Frampton nine possessions and Ah Siu eight, McPhail six and Pickett five.

WA's carnival ended with a two-point win over Vic Country at Etihad Stadium on July 2 with Garlett racking up 19 possessions, Pickett 15, Frampton 14, Stewart eight and McPhail six.

Mitchell Dzelebdzic, Luke Strnadica, Dylan Brown and Zane Sumich were all part of the WA team that played in the National 16s Championships on the Gold Coast.

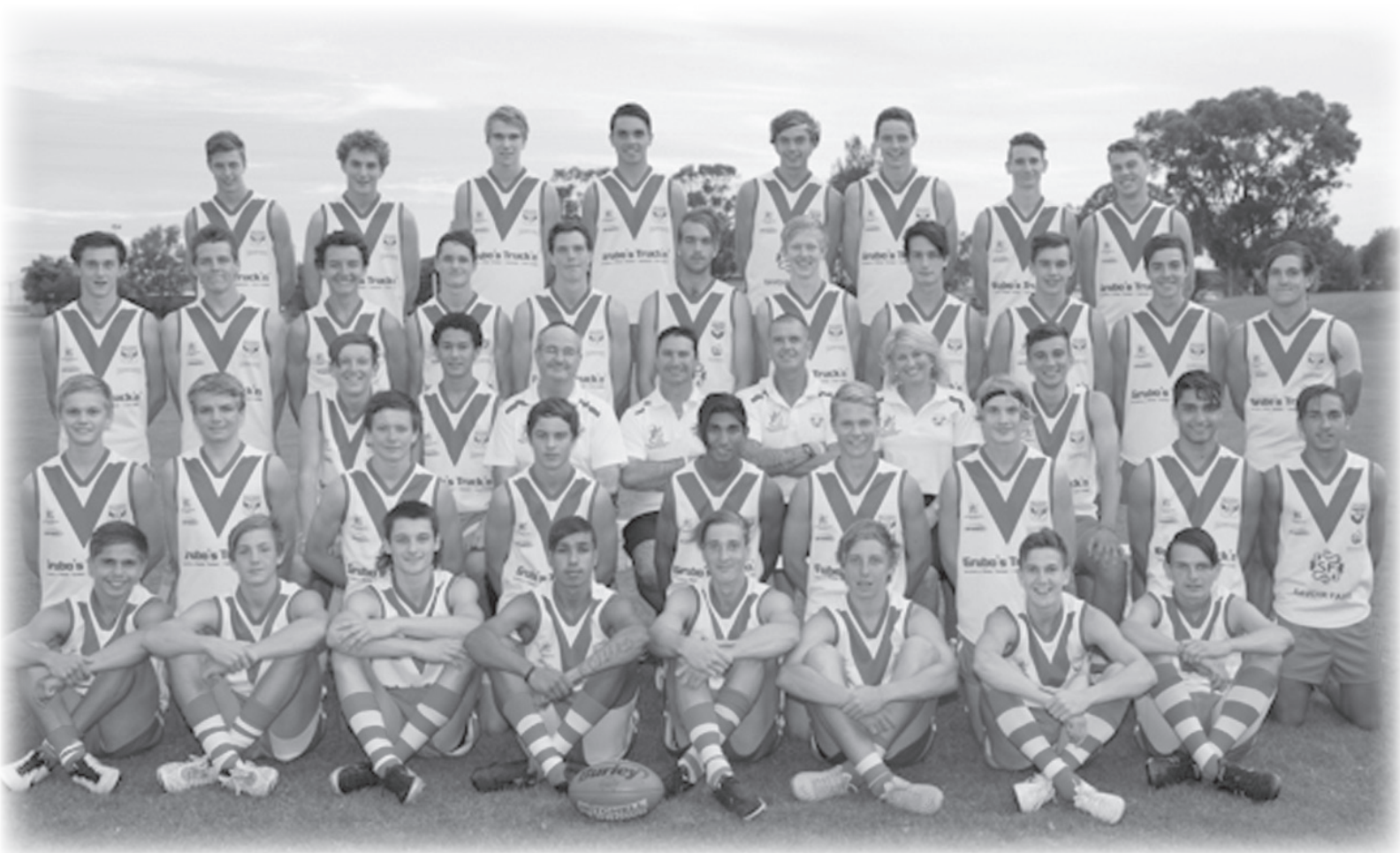

APPOINTMENTS SET UP BULLDOGS FUTURE CURLEY HEADS SOUTH FREMANTLE INTO NEW ERA

The South Fremantle Football Club is heading into an exciting new era in 2015 with a new league coach, colts coach, football operations manager, player management in an exciting time for the Bulldogs.

Todd Curley will take over from Paul Hasleby as league coach with Jason Ireland replacing Arthur Maskos after a successful stint as colts coach. David Depane steps into the football operations manager role with Jason Pedulla coming on board to take over his player development position.

After an extensive nation-wide search and with the coaching selection panel headed up by South Fremantle great and West Coast Eagles premiership captain and coach John Worsfold, and dual South Fremantle premiership player and premiership captain David Gault, Curley was appointed to lead the Bulldogs back to finals for the first time since 2011.

Curley arrives at South Fremantle with tremendous pedigree both as a player in the AFL and WAFL, and coach in both.

Curley's AFL career began in 1994 with Collingwood where he played three matches, but after returning to West Perth and having an outstanding 1995 including being a big part of the WAFL premiership, he was picked up by the Western Bulldogs.

He went on to play 115 games with the Bulldogs as a rock solid defender in teams that went close to a grand final appearance.

His time at the Whitten Oval ended at the end of 2001 and he returned to West Perth for four more seasons in the WAFL with the Falcons where he played in another premiership in 2003 and spent time as captain up until the end of 2005.

He was appointed coach to replace Darren Harris and spent three years at the helm finishing with a 31-31 (with one draw) win-loss record and making the finals two out of the three seasons.

Curley departed West Perth to become an assistant coach at Fremantle in the AFL in 2009 where he remained until 2012, and now he is ready to return to the coaching ranks after his first time out of top-level football in more than 20 years.

Curley is excited by the playing group he is inheriting at the Bulldogs and sees the potential there to be a strong unit in 2015, but is fully aware that nothing is guaranteed and that only hard work will bring about success.

"I think it's an exciting group with quite a large group of emerging young players who have had some success at lower levels together coming through, but also some experienced players who are still also pretty young relatively," Curley said.



"It's a pretty young list and pretty well balanced already. I'm looking forward to getting amongst it. There's certainly some talent there so we will put a program in place that we believe can get them to improve as quickly as we can.

"We will be focused on that improvement coming from within and if there is a potential player who can help us significantly that we could bring in, we would look at that but our focus will be on our own."

As a player, Curley played in the 1995 and 2003 premierships with West Perth while also leading the Falcons to two finals series as a coach and playing in four finals campaigns in the AFL with the Western Bulldogs including two preliminary finals in 1997 and 1998.

So Curley is well and truly accustomed to being part of finals bound teams

throughout his 20 years involved with top-level football, but over that time he also has seen things drastically improve, and fall off track, over pre-season campaigns and that's where his focus now lies for South Fremantle.

"My whole life as a player or coach I've never started a pre-season without the aim and belief that at the end of the season we will be playing at the end of September still, so nothing changes with that but there are no guarantees," he said.

"We'll be doing everything we can to try and improve, and the first thing is preparing for Round 1 now and trying to start in a positive manner."

When Curley coached West Perth between 2006 and 2008, he had only just retired as a player so it was all a learning and developing experience, but now with three years there under his belt and three years in the AFL system, he has learned a lot and will do some things differently this time around.

"What I have learnt along the journey is that man management is a big issue and that's probably my main focus," he said.

"If they aren't happy then it doesn't matter what game plan you have, you won't have success. We want a really happy vibrant group that wants to do something together as a team, and it will be all about the team. That's our focus and what I'll be trying to make happen before anything."

Having been involved in either the WAFL or VFL from 1991 up until 2012, Curley does feel that his break from the game at the top level has been good for him as well and he feels ready to return, and in a position to know exactly what needs to be done in order to coach well at the Bulldogs.

He also believes that it's the perfect time to get back involved with his children now having grown up a little compared to when he was at West Perth and even Fremantle. Before he had to leave them at home, but now they are at ages where they can enjoy coming to the football.

"I definitely feel recharged and I needed that break after those 20 years of being involved, and especially the last three at AFL level because that is pretty hectic," Curley said.

"It is only the last 12 months that it's probably become something that I discussed doing again at home. I then made the decision to pursue it if the opportunity came up so I'm now really looking forward to it a second time around.

"I'm obviously a bit older and more experienced, and I'm hoping to enjoy it all a bit more and the main thing is being a bit more relaxing. I was told in a really nice way that I am a happier person when I am involved in footy.

"The kids are a bit older now and they love going to the WAFL so they will be involved, and post-match I'll be able to spend it with them. I think it's a really good fit for where I'm at now with work and my family to be a senior WAFL coach at a really good club. It's a really good fit and I'm excited about it."

While Curley has been involved at AFL clubs Collingwood and the Bulldogs as a player, and Fremantle as a coach, he has never previously been involved with any other WAFL club aside from West Perth.

As a player, he racked up 148 games with the Falcons, played in the 1995 and 2003 premierships, was captain and then coached the club for another three seasons.

His brother Adam also is a premiership player and life member of West Perth so the red and blue blood runs deep in the Curley family, but he is simply looking forward to the challenge that awaits as coach of South Fremantle.

"There's no doubt that when you spend your whole life barracking, playing and coaching for one club it's going to be really different going to another WAFL club, but I'm at Souths now and that's now my team and club," Curley said.

"It probably will be a bit strange the first time we play them up at Joondalup, but hopefully we beat them, stay for awards and I can catch up with some old faces there as well."

The Bulldogs will also have a new colts coach in 2015

after the successful reign of Arthur Maskos that brought about premierships in 2011 and 2012, a grand final appearance in 2013 and reaching the preliminary final in 2014.

Jason Ireland will take over as the colts coach and his initial success with South Fremantle began with the Warriors development programs where he was coach of the teams in 14s, 15s and 16s age groups.

That also saw him acknowledged by the Department of Sport and Recreation when he was named the Community Coach of the Year in 2010 for his work as 16s development coach and the coaching co-ordinator with the South Fremantle Football Club.

Ireland then made the jump in 2012 to begin a two-year run under Maskos as an assistant coach in the colts team and in that time he was part of the 2012 premiership-winning team and the 2013 grand final side.

He then made the jump in 2014 to be a league assistant coach to Paul Hasleby where he was the forward-line coach.

David Depane joined South Fremantle full-time during 2014 replacing Daniel Vidovich as player development manager, and now will take on the role as football operations manager.

Depane's background has seen him be an assistant coach in South Fremantle's 14s, 15s and 16s development programs from 2010 up until this year while also being named Volunteer of the Year by the South Fremantle District Development Council in 2011 for his work with the Bibra Lake Junior Football Club.

Depane is also a Level 2 accredited coach and has previously done recruiting work for St Kilda before coming on board full-time with South Fremantle as player development manager in 2014.

The final piece to fall into place was the appointment of Jason Pedulla to replace Depane as player development manager.

Pedulla joins the South Fremantle Football Club as player development manager having previously been involved at the East Perth Football Club in a number of roles and having spent the last three years in roles with the West Australian Olympic Council and Australian Olympic Committee.

Pedulla now returns to a full-time role within WAFL football with the South Fremantle Football Club with a variety of experience that make him the perfect candidate for the broad nature of his role as player development manager.

SOUTH FREMANTLE'S AFL PLAYERS OUTSTANDING CAREERS FINISH, OTHERS BEGIN

It was a big year for South Fremantle players in the AFL system with Ashley McGrath retiring, Clint Jones leaving St Kilda, Paul Duffield reaching 150 games and last year's draftees Blaine Johnson and Cameron McCarthy making their debuts at the top level.

Of the 14 South Fremantle products on AFL lists in 2014, 10 of them played at least one match with Johnson and McCarthy making their debuts with Carlton and the GWS Giants respectively while Duffield and Brandon Matera continued to be stars with Fremantle and the Gold Coast Suns.

The season was also significant for it bringing to end the AFL career of premiership player McGrath with him announcing his retirement and then Jones also leaving St Kilda after 149 games with Adam Carter (West Coast), Leroy Jetta (Essendon), Cory Dell'Olio (Essendon) and Josh Bootsma (Carlton) departing their clubs.

The last of the Brisbane Lions premiership players has now retired with Ash McGrath calling time on his AFL career at the end of the 2014 season bringing an end also to the time of the three McGrath brothers playing at the top level.

The youngest of the McGrath brothers put together a stunning AFL career for himself after originally being drafted from WAFL club South Fremantle to the Brisbane Lions at the end of 2000.

He couldn't quite break into the premiership team of 2001 playing just one game in his debut season and then in 2002 he also missed the premiership without playing another game after Round 17, but he was a key part of the line-up by 2003.

While spending most of his time as a running defender, he was always dangerous as a pinch-hitting forward highlighted by his six goals in Round 22 of that 2003 season and then two crucial goals in the preliminary final win over Sydney.

He was then there to be part of the Lions' third straight premiership triumph and ever since has remained a strong contributor to the Brisbane team either as a forward or defender.

In the end, he finished his career in Round 22 of the 2014 season against Fremantle at the Gabba in what was his 214th game to go with 170 goals and the premiership.

It took almost five years of strong WAFL football with South Fremantle for Paul Duffield to prove that he could be a regular AFL player but he now certainly has done that as he brought up 150 games during 2014.

Duffield grew up in West Arthur before making the move for high school where he went to Aquinas and found his footballing feet before lobbing at the Bulldogs and ending up making his league debut in 2004 in his first year on Fremantle's rookie-list.

Duffield continued to develop at South Fremantle, including playing in the 2005 premiership, and by 2009 was an elite WAFL footballer and became a permanent member of Fremantle's team that played in last year's grand final, and again throughout 2014.

Meanwhile, Jones was delisted by St Kilda following the 2014 season after an outstanding career with the Saints that included 149 games, and being a key member of the grand final teams of 2009 and 2010.

Jones had a terrific career as a dual fairest and best winner, and premiership player with South Fremantle before arriving at St Kilda at the end of 2006.

His 2014 season started with a career-high 39 possessions in a win over Melbourne, he then had 26 disposals the next week in a win over the GWS Giants and he continued to show good form despite being delisted.

Jetta also found himself delisted at the end of 2014 following 93 games and 80 goals with the Bombers after being drafted from

South Fremantle in 2006. His best AFL season came back in 2011 when he played in 23 matches with the Bombers and kicked 27 goals.

Matera had another tremendous season with the Gold Coast Suns where he played 16 matches, kicked 27 goals and continued to emerge as one of the better small forwards emerging in the league. He has now played 55 games for 60 goals in four years with the Suns.

Carter added two more AFL games with West Coast to the five he played in 2013, and he showed some

encouraging signs as a small defender but the Eagles delisted him at the end of the season.

Meanwhile, Dell'Olio played another five games with Essendon in 2014 to take his career tally to 16 games and 16 goals before being delisted by the Bombers at the end of the season.

Shane Kersten played nine matches with Geelong for 10 goals, McCarthy made his debut for the GWS Giants in Round 23 and Johnson played five games with Carlton.

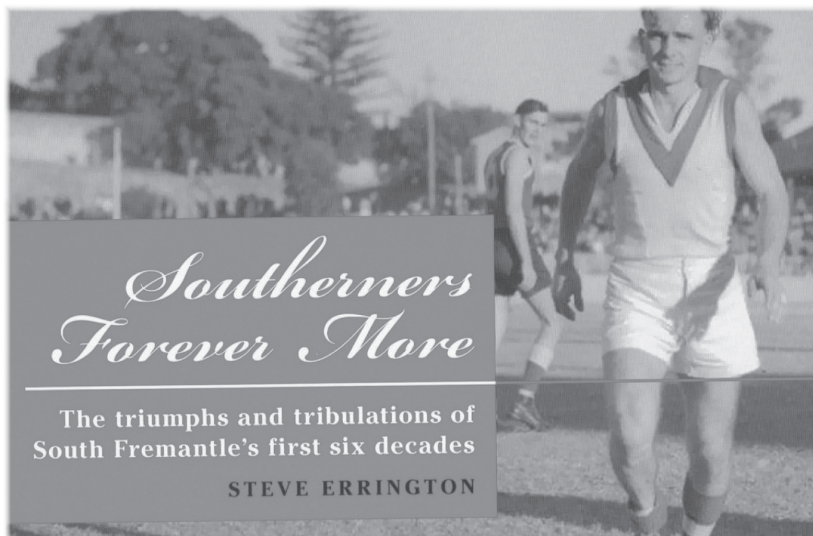
The 'Southerners Forever More' history book was researched and written by noted West Australian historian – and lifelong South Fremantle supporter - Dr Steve Errington.

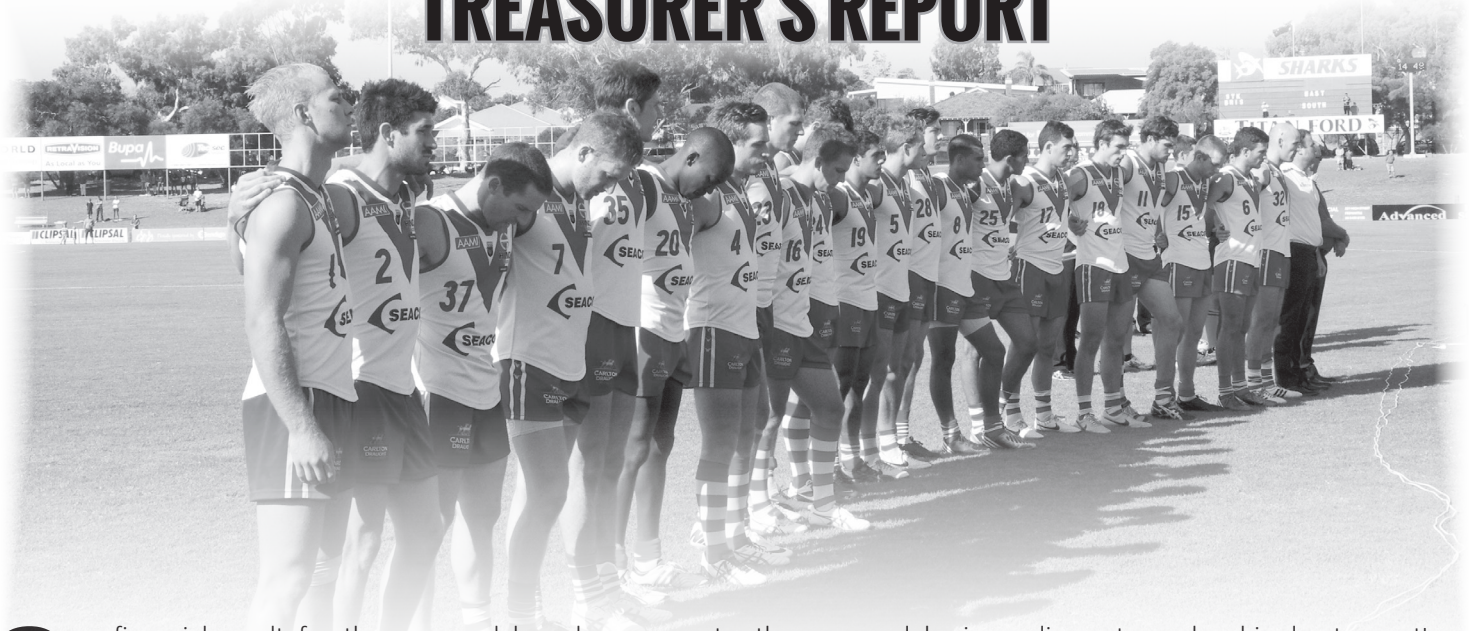

TREASURER'S REPORT



Our financial result for the year end has shown a vast improvement from 2013.

The Net Loss of \$88,857 is inclusive of \$94,733 in depreciation and amortisation charges.

The net effect of this is the organisation has made a cash profit of \$5,876 for 2014, a turnaround of approximately \$205,000 from 2013.

The Subsidies and Special Grants revenue via the West Australian Football Commission has increased by \$140,000 which is inclusive of the special arrangement for the aligned clubs.

Overall football expenses has decreased by approximately \$15,000 and it is expected some further cost reductions will happen in this area.

Expenditure in our Football Development which includes Colts, Warriors and Zones has decreased slightly to last year's figure, at \$163,000.

Marketing and fundraising revenue showed a net overall decrease of approximately \$40,000 which can be contributed to major functions such as the club auction being held off until 2015 and the last minute withdrawal of a sponsorship deal for the 2014 year that was part of our revenue in 2013.

Also a bad debt of \$16,000 was written off in this year.

However in saying this there were other positives such as the commencement of the advertising screen, sundry donations, lucky lottery and Corporate Classic which helped soften the impact.

Membership revenue for the year 2014 is \$89,913; this is an increase of \$33,000 from 2013. I mentioned in last year's report

there was a delay in sending out membership due to an attempt in new packages becoming available, this has come to fruition, hence the increase.

There is always an urgency to try and get new members on board as well as trying to sign up new ones.

Bar sales did fall during the year as would happen when lower game attendance and less functions occur, however, in saying this there were some significant cost savings which netted a positive result of \$58,200 and overall improvement of approximately \$23,000 from 2013.

Decrease in wage and general bar cost were the main contributing factor in this result.

Some of the cost mentioned in our administration expenses in 2013 such as fringe benefits and payroll tax that accounted for previous years has now become central to the current year with a reduction of \$21,000, also insurance costs have fallen by \$16,000.

Overall our administration expenses have fallen by approximately \$65,000.

The focus on 2015 is once again to increase our revenue stream and simply maintain or reduce our cost.

There are challenges in particular the mention of the reduction in future transfer fees received being reduced to \$25,000 per player from \$35,000 and other unknowns the WAFC may have up its sleeve.

Here's to 2015 being a successful year for all and thanks to our members for their support in 2014!
