The Perth Football League welcomes everyone to today's Toyota Women's Competition Grand Finals.

Launching in 2018 with 16 teams, the women's competition has soared to 72 teams in 2023 with multiple clubs now fielding two sides which makes the Toyota Women's League the largest senior community women's competition in Australia.

The League has reached new heights this season with 14,807 registered players, most of which has come from the rise in participation of female football with 3246 women playing across seven grades.

Seven Grand Finals will be played across three venues today and this year's deciders are set to showcase the rising standards of women's football with the influx of talent and rapid increase in participation in recent seasons.

Two new clubs who joined the women's competition this season are set to feature in Grand Finals with Koongamia in Toyota C4 after remaining undefeated all year and Carlisle in Toyota C5 after an outstanding first season.

The season has not been without its challenges, so we thank all clubs for cooperating to help us get to this point of the season. It would not be possible without the fantastic support of our club volunteers who continue to provide exceptional service to their community by helping to keep their local clubs running. We hope as this season draws to a close you look back with pride on what you have all achieved.

#### THE RISE OF WOMEN'S FOOTBALL

Commencing in 2018 with 16 inaugural teams, the Perth Football League women's competition has seen a rapid growth in participation over such a short period of time. In 2023, the total number of women's teams has soared to 72 with multiple clubs now fielding two sides across the seven grades.

in the competition's sixth season nine new teams joined including Brentwood Booragoon, Carlisle, Fremantle CBC, Koongamia, North Mandurah and Thornlie while Bayswater, Secret Harbour and Wembley all added a second side.

Curtin Uni Wesley Women's Coach Martin Edmunds has been there since the league's inception in 2018 and reflected on the beneficial impact that women's football has made at his club:

"The introduction of women's football has completely changed the dynamic of the club and the players have brought with them an amazing level of enthusiasm, energy and engagement," Edmunds said.

"From relatively humble beginnings at the formation of the league in 2018 to providing playing opportunities to over 75 female players in 2021, the engagement and growth of the women's teams at Curtin Uni Wesley has been surreal."

"The women's teams across the Perth Football League have been developing at a rapid rate and can now be seen playing some outstanding football every weekend with the players and teams having improved out of sight since the formation of the league."

## PERTH FOOTBALL LEAGUE VAFA (VICTORIA)

PFL put up an early fight, but the Victorian women showed their class and ran away in a comfortable 63-point win at Elsternwick Park on Saturday 15 July.

The match marked a historic occasion, being the first time the PFL Women's side got to test themselves against opposition outside of WA, and the test couldn't have come any bigger for coach Parris Laurie, facing the best of the VAFA Women's Competition on their own home deck.

After a tight contest in the opening quarter, Warnbro Swans captain Alyssa Smogavec opened the scoring for Perth with a major.

Victoria were able to take ascendancy in the second quarter, kicking four goals while keeping Perth scoreless to open up a 35-point lead at the main break.

Coming out after the main change, Perth lifted their intensity around the ball, and surged the footy forward at every opportunity but failed to capatilise on the scoreboard with the Vics taking a 56-point lead with a quarter to play.

Scarborough's Cheney Armstrong was able to capitalise on a mistake from the Victorian defence and booted home Perth's second goal of the day.

Sabreena McKinnon (Baldivis) and Caitlin Pears (Fremantle CBC) fought valiantly and were threatening around stoppages and running off half-back. Stefanie Wust (University) and Isabella Strnadica (Melville) also played a crucial role and impacted the game.

Samantha Fielder (Curtin Uni Wesley) had a power of work to do in the ruck against the Big V combination of Sarah Betts and Cat O'Bryne.

Caitlin Pears (Fremantle CBC) was awarded best on ground honours for the PFL.

# PERTH FOOTBALL LEAGUE VAFA (VICTORIA)

With nothing to split the two sides after four quarters and a period of extra time, Victoria overran the PFL in a 37-goal epic by 19 points at Elsternwick Park on Saturday 15 July.

Wind back the clock to 2003 and Perth were defeated by a margin of 170 points by the Vics in a fixture that ultimately put an end to senior state footy. 20 years on, our senior men's side got a shot at redemption, and they certainly did not disappoint.

After a 39-point comeback from Perth and a missed shot after the siren to win the game, Victoria kicked away in the second half of extra time to snatch a stirring win on home soil.

At the opening bounce, Perth were reacquainted with a familiar face in Ben Harding, who captained their side in 2021, this time donning the Big V. PFL stung their former teammate's side early with Kyle Hamersley kicking the opening goal after just 40 seconds.

Victoria piled on the next four goals before Nelson Waite took a courageous mark and slotted a second for Perth from beyond the 45-metre arc to go into the first change trailing by 21 points.

The Big V asserted their dominance in the second quarter, blowing the margin out to 39 points. PFL coach Craig White rallied his men together at the main break and although the scoreboard was not in their favour, there was a sense of belief in the group.

The game flipped completely on its head in the third quarter, with an inspired Perth side booting six goals to two, with Fremantle CBC's Matt Ward hitting the scoreboard first.

After the Vics replied with a goal through Luke Winter, it was the Kingsway boys from Perth who took control with five consecutive goals coming from Kyle Halligan, Trey Kennedy, Braydn Furmark and Tom Edwards-Baldwin to level the scores at 66 apiece.

A 32-minute final quarter followed, with Perth striking early in quick succession through Matt Young and Kyle Halligan to put the travelling side in front for the first time since the opening minute of the game. It was former teammate Ben Harding who delivered a damaging blow and regained the lead for the Vics with a brilliant roving goal.

Perth were able string together two goals in a row through Blake Borrett from right on the 45-metre arc, and Matt Young for his third goal to put the margin out to 11 points in favour of Perth.

Kyle Halligan showed why he has kicked 61 goals from 18 games for Kingsway, when he slotted his third goal to bring the margin back to one-point. Trey Kennedy kicked his third to give Perth a 5-point advantage at the 25-minute mark.

Not satisfied to play out the clock and restart for extra time, bodies crashed in and players willed themselves to every ball. Josh Branchi took a towering mark at centre half back with only seconds remaining on the clock and was awarded a 50-metre penalty. From centre half back to centre half forward, as the full-time siren sounded.

With scores level, to win the game for Perth, the Branchi kick fell short.

Victoria won the extra time coin-toss and stayed with the Glenhuntly Road end. In similar fashion to how the game started, Kyle Hamersley opened the scoring to give Perth the lead before the Vics eventually ran away with a 19-point win.

Matt Ward (Fremantle CBC) was awarded as Perth's best player with 26 disposals and a goal. Kyle Halligan (Kingsway), Trey Kennedy (Kingsway) and Matt Young (Mount Lawley) were influential up forward, all finishing the day with three goals. David Roche (Fremantle CBC) was critical off half back with 33 disposals, Josh Branchi (Baldivis), Chris Leonard (Curtin Uni Wesley), Nelson Waite (Trinity Aquinas) and Kyle Hamersley (Curtin Uni Wesley) were instrumental through the middle.



### TURNER RECOGNISED IN AFL VOLUNTEER AWARDS

Rob Turner is not a fan of the spotlight, he is much more comfortable talking about his players, teammates and fellow volunteers.

Turner has been awarded the National AFL Disability Inclusion Ambassador of the Year for displaying exceptional leadership in engaging people with disabilities in football.

Turner established the first All-Abilities Football team in the south-east corridor at Kelmscott Football Club, which has created unprecedented opportunities for individuals living with disabilities to participate.

Turner was announced the National winner prior to the WA All-Abilities Football Assocation's Draft Combine in front of 100 people, many who have played, trained or worked alongside the Kelmscott Integrated Team Coach.

"It's a true honour, as I truly know how much dedication and sacrifice many others are devoting to their own community football clubs, leagues and players as well as those who do so much for Disability and Inclusion in Football and our communities," Turner said.

"I am very grateful for the accolade and award. However, it's the participants who are the heroes and the real reason I and many others do this. Their aspiration and raw desire to play is the purest form of grass roots football."

Almost ten years ago Turner came up with the concept to create a Kelmscott team for the Integrated Competition, it wasn't easy, but he had support from the WA All Abilities Football Association.

"I had been following the competition in previous seasons and could see great benefit and a need for a team in our community," he said.

"My father Kim Turner was the president of the football club at the time, and we ran our first "Have A Go Day" for education support students at the Armadale Senior High School, where students with disability were given opportunity to wear a uniform and play in a match against each other, just like their AFL Heroes.

"I campaigned the City of Armadale and surrounding councils, engaging with every Disability service provider and Local Schools, as well as Inclusion Focused Groups and Events.

"It's been a wonderful and special journey, and I can't wait to see what more we can achieve for Inclusion in Football and Community.

"Despite the hardest days and difficulties in our lives, coming together at training or for a game, or in a social setting, everyone can be supported and share the joy that comes from community football clubs.


