The West Australian Football Commission (WAFC) is the caretaker of football throughout the State and responsible for the overall development of the game.

An important component of this is the WAFL Talent Pathway and associated WAFL 14's, WAFL 15's and WAFL 16's Talent carnivals. Over 1500 players from 48 teams were given the opportunity to represent their zoned WAFL club last year and develop their skills throughout the course of the event.

The carnivals provide a unique opportunity for players, coaches and umpires to be exposed to an enhanced level of competition and training, which plays a vital role in their development.

The new WA Talent model has been designed following extensive consultation with key stakeholders, strong analysis of data and trends along with significant input from key partners such as the AFL and WAFL clubs.

The aim of the new WA Talent model is to provide a more consistent approach to player development in WA whilst providing enhanced levels of resources, capability and support to our players. The model will be clearly aligned to the AFL and national best practice and will be strategically and financially driven by the WAFC, whilst the actual delivery of the program underpinned by a strong partnership between the WAFL clubs and the WAFC.

This will result in a significant social benefit and the creation of better communities through the active promotion of the sport and its associated values of teamwork, responsibility, respect, leadership, commitment and community participation.

- For all players to be enriched by the experience and encouraged to continue their involvement in the game commensurate to their ability

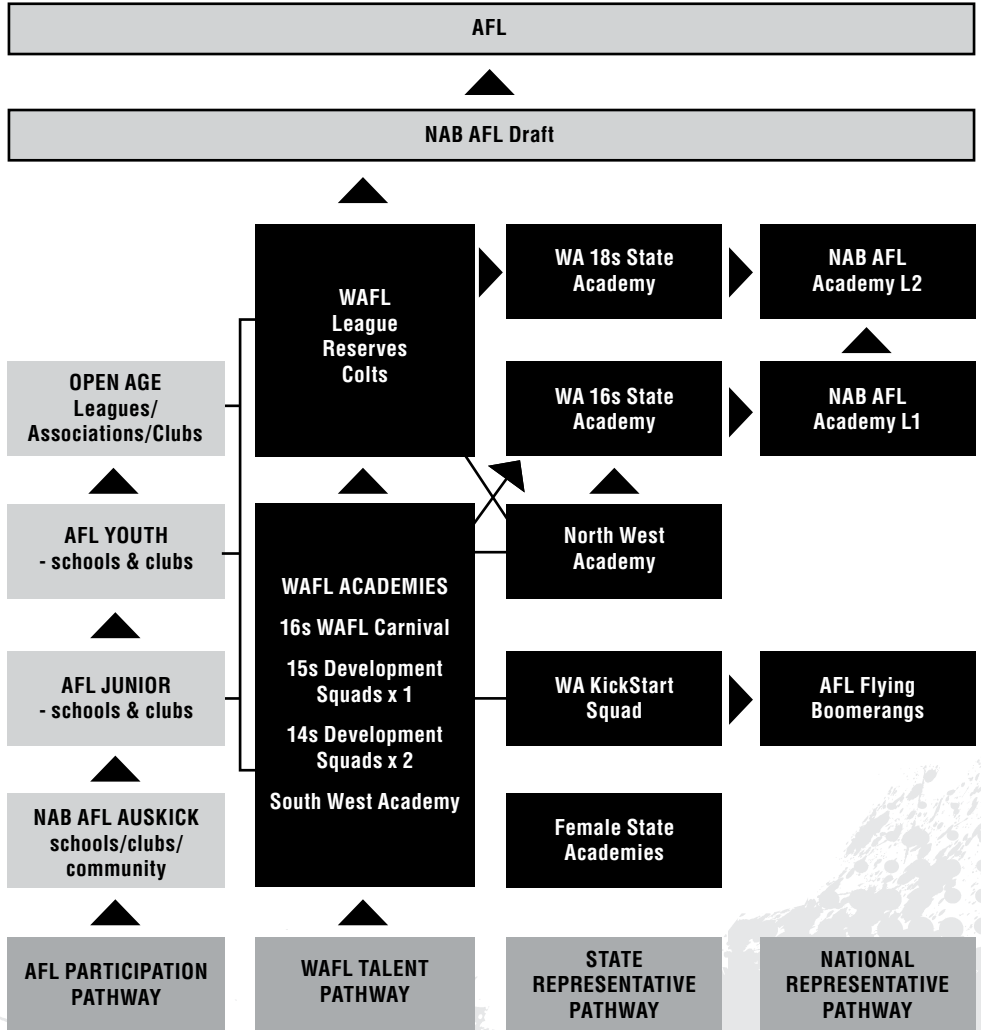

## CODE OF ETHICS

Each Team and Team Member shall:-

- (a) participate in the Carnival in the spirit of true sportsmanship so that the Carnival will be a credit to the game of Australian football and those who participate in it; and
- (b) not engage in conduct which is unbecoming or prejudicial to the interests of the WAFL or the Carnival.

The Carnival is conducted under the control and Rules & Regulations (where applicable) of the West Australian Football League. It is the responsibility of each Club to ensure that all appointed officials are fully conversant with the contents of the match arrangements and regulations.

## CONDUCT UNBECOMING OR PREJUDICIAL

Where the Carnival Manager is of the opinion that a Team or Team Member has engaged in conduct which is unbecoming or prejudicial to the interest of the WAFL or the Carnival, whether on the basis of an investigation, complaint or otherwise, the Carnival Manager may deal with any such matter in such manner as the Carnival Manager in his or her absolute discretion thinks fit.

## PLAYER ELIGIBILITY

The West Australian Football League (WAFL) operates under a zoning agreement that outlines WAFL Club geographical recruitment zones. A player may only represent his zoned WAFL club, except in the instance of the Father/Son, Brother/Brother or Grandfather/Grandson rule as per the WAFL Rules & Regulations. Clubs must lodge the appropriate paperwork with the WAFL Operations Coordinator prior to the commencement of the carnival to determine a player's eligibility. A player is considered a zoned player of their respective WAFL club until they turn 19 years of age. Zoned players under 19 years of age are not permitted to train and/or play with another WAFL Club unless there has been an agreement in writing between the two Clubs and a copy of the agreement forwarded to WAFL Operations Coordinator.

**Clubs found to be in breach of the above will be penalised as per the WAFL Rules and Regulations.**

The Carnival will be for players turning 16 in the 2018 calendar year. A player's age grouping is determined by the age he turns in the year of play, from 1st January to 31st December inclusive. Players younger than this age bracket may participate at the discretion of their parents and the WAFL club and must be confirmed with the WAFL Talent Programs Coordinator.

A player under suspension in that player's local competition during the period of the Carnival shall be ineligible for selection or to participate in the Carnival.

Exceptions to the above rules may be granted by the WAFL Talent Programs Coordinator upon request by Clubs prior to the submission of team lists.



## COACHES

All coaches will be held accountable under the AFL Coaches Code of Conduct as well as the Carnival Regulations and Policies. The Head Coach is required to shake the umpires hand prior to the start of all games and must have a Level 2 AFL accreditation, or be currently working towards this standard.

As part of the enhancing the professional development of coaches and the professional conduct of the Carnival, all coaches must use the allocated coach's boxes. It is the responsibility of the Home Club to ensure that all phones between the coach's boxes and interchange bench are in place and in working order.

If a coach is reported and subsequently found guilty, they may receive a citation with the possibility of having their accreditation cancelled by the WAFC Manager Club Development and Coaching at the WAFC.

All coaching appointments must be confirmed with the WAFL Talent Programs Coordinator.

## UMPIRES

The WAFL 16's Carnival is an integral part of the umpire talent pathway, assisting umpires who are striving to further develop their craft and hopefully one day reach the AFL list. Field umpires from the Hendrie/Margetts development squad and WAAFL umpire groups will be appointed via the WAFC Umpire Development Manager. Boundary and goal umpires are appointed via the umpires coordinator of each participating club in their district in consultation with the Talent Manager. The importance of positive relationships with umpires is paramount to the success of the game. Head Coaches are required to shake the umpires hand prior to the start of all games and will at all times encourage a positive attitude towards umpiring by players and support staff.

## DURATION OF MATCHES

Matches will be played over 4 quarters of 20 minutes duration (no time on). Time on shall only be added in the event of a stretcher (except for games played as curtain raisers).

The breaks between quarters will be:

Quarter Time - 5 minutes

Half Time - 15 minutes

Three Quarter Time - 5 minutes

If any team fails to be in position to recommence play after the breaks between quarters, the umpire is at liberty to recommence the game without those players being in position.

## OFFICIALS / SPECTATORS

The only officials permitted on the playing arena during the course of a match shall be the runners, trainers and water stewards from each team. Team coaches and officials only are permitted on the ground during breaks. The home team shall be responsible to ensure that no spectators encroach onto the playing arena during the course of a match.

## **WAFL STATE 16'S ACADEMY**

At the conclusion of the Carnival, the WAFL State 16's Academy will be selected. The Academy will train over a 10-week period before a traveling party of 23 players is selected to represent Western Australia at the NAB AFL Under 16 Championships to be held in Adelaide on June 24 and on the Gold Coast from July 9-13, 2018 State Academy coaching staff will be in attendance throughout the WAFL 16's Carnival, as part of the selection process. Also contributing to the selection process will be the input of Talent Development Managers and Head Coaches.

(EAST FREMANTLE/ BULLCREEK LEEMING JUNIOR FOOTBALL CLUB)

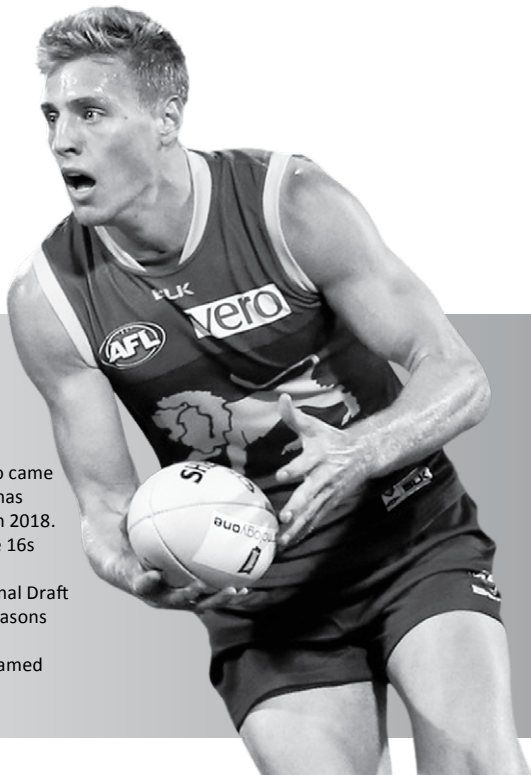
Former Geelong and Brisbane tough inside player, who came through East Fremantle's prestigious Talent Academy has returned home and set to play in the Blue and White in 2018.

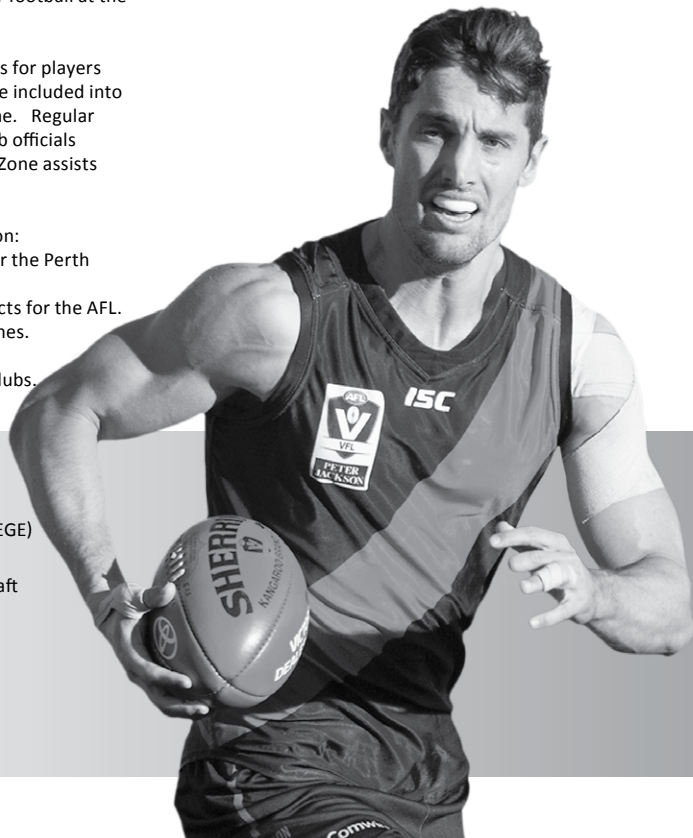

# SOUTH FREMANTLE FOOTBALL CLUB

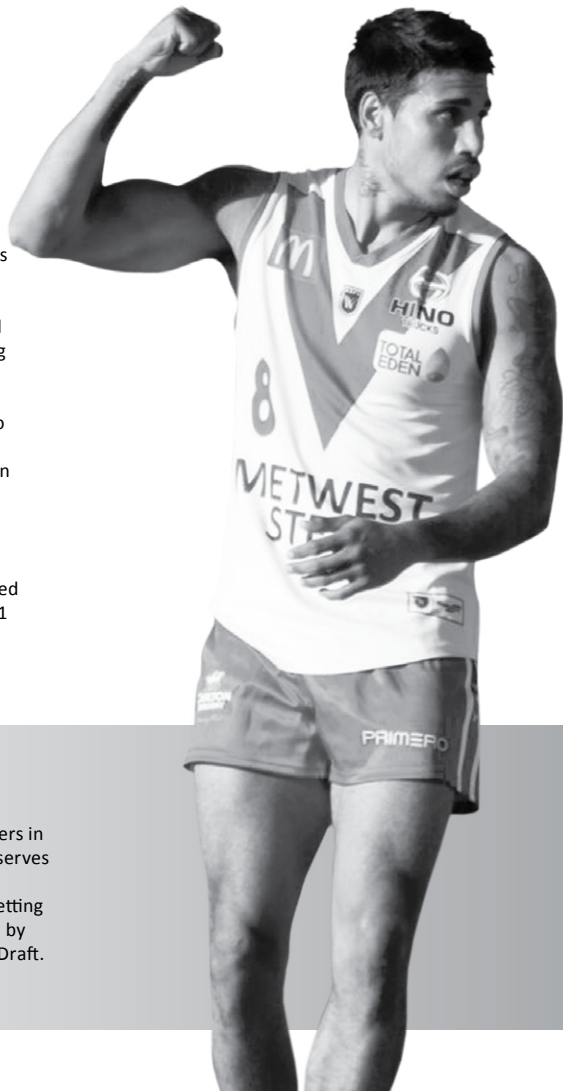

## OSCAR ALLEN

(SORRENTO DUNCRAIG JFC)

Oscar Allen's stunning 2017 season was rewarded when the West Coast Eagles selected him with Pick 21 at the 2017 AFL National Draft. Originating from Whitford JFC, Oscar was involved with West Perth Football Club from the age of 14, participating in the club's development programs before later earning selection in the 2016 WAFL Colts squad.

Despite no previous involvement with Western Australian representative sides or the AFL Academy, Oscar's first season with West Perth Colts projected him into the eyes of state selectors. After a significant growth spurt in early 2016, Allen moved away from his familiar inside midfield role and became a versatile swingman, playing in defence, ruck and up forward throughout the season. As a result of his strong season, he was named at centre half forward in the 2016 Colts Team of the Year.

Oscar is renowned for his high work ethic, strong hands and versatility, playing a number of different roles throughout his development at West Perth and with the WA Under 18's.

Allen starred for Western Australia throughout the 2017 NAB AFL Under 18 Championships, resulting in being named Larke Medallist, the best player of the Championships. Oscar kicked three goals and was named best-on-ground in a thrilling one-point win against South Australia. Allen collected 19 disposals, eight marks and kicked two goals in a strong 40-point victory over the Allies. His performance across the championships cemented him as one to watch for AFL recruiters, being named at full forward in the Under 18's All Australian side.

The club's 2017 Colts captain played 29 games across two seasons, including four senior matches in late 2017. Throughout his two seasons with the Colts side, Oscar averaged 14.1 disposals, 4.8 marks and 3.2 tackles per game. He made his league debut for the club in Round 20, 2017, capping off a highly successful year that saw his draft stocks significantly rise in the lead up to the AFL Draft.

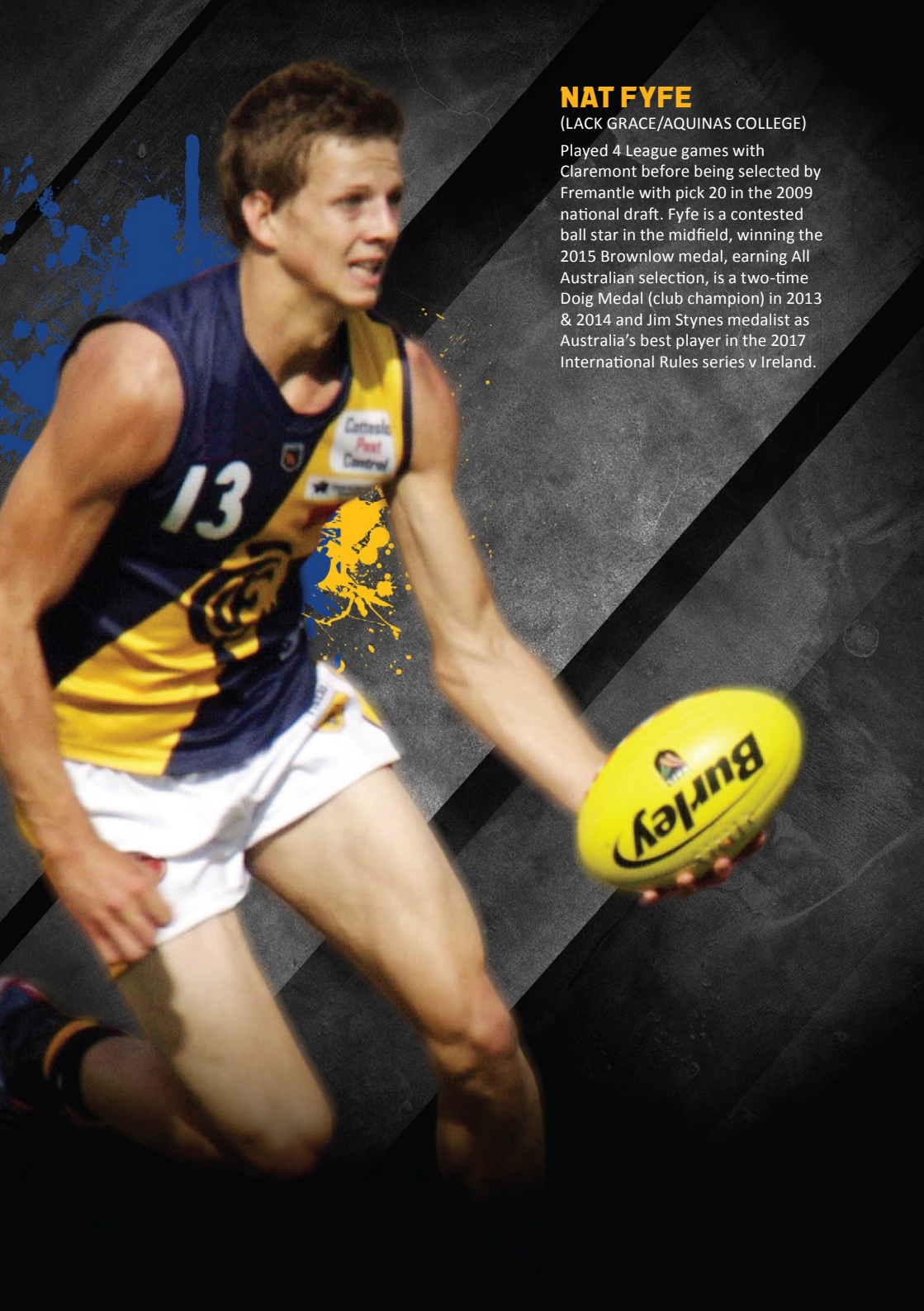


## JESSE HOGAN
