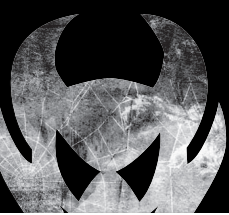

Members may also rest assured that all new appointees understand the heavy burden they bear to do their jobs professionally and diligently, to work as part of a team and to focus unrelentingly on achieving success.

The good news story of the year for the Club must surely be the outstanding season of our Butcher Medallist Tendai Mzungu, and his subsequent recruitment into the AFL by the Fremantle Football Club. Tendai, of course, did all the work and the Club is just happy that we could be there to help him on his way. You could not meet a finer young man and every young player coming through the system should look to Tendai to see what can be achieved at this Club with the right attitude.

As one Perth favourite takes the next step in his football career we farewell another favourite, who ended his playing days in 2010. Troy Cook is one of the greatest players to ever pull on the red and black. He is admired by all in football for his character as a player and a person and it was a proud day when we were able to send him off with a resounding win. Thank you Cookie for all you have done for the Club as a player and ambassador and thank you again for deciding to continue your association with the Demons as an assistant coach in 2011.

A notable achievement through the year was the opening of the Redlegs to Demons History Centre. This was a project 5 years in the making and in the end only happened due to the efforts of the PFC Past Players and Officials Association, led by President Dennis

Thomas. I have heaped praise on this group in the past and all of it is well deserved. They are the best PPOA in the WAFL.

Other positives for the Club in 2010 were the continued success of the District under the leadership of Neil Darby and new JCC Chairman Ross Leipold and the growing strength of junior clubs in the District with numerous volunteers, too many to mention, deserving of thanks and praise. The Club was also well represented in State Squads in the various age competitions, as we have been for some years now, a testament to the success of our programmes and a beacon of light for the future.

There were, however, unfortunately many sad times for the Club in 2010. In the year we celebrated 55 years since the 55 grand final win we lost one of the heroes of that game and a true legend of Australian Rules football in Merv McIntosh. Pride in the achievements of Merv McIntosh is, and always will be, a part of the soul of every Perth Football Club supporter. Gone but never forgotten, rest in peace Big Merv.

Len Waldock's record of volunteer service to the Club is unsurpassed and unlikely to ever be repeated. Len filled a variety of roles with the Club but will be best remembered for over 60 continuous years as our league timekeeper. Len's departure left us all saddened and humbled by his selflessness and loyalty. There will never be another like you Len.

The Club was also saddened by the loss of George Spalding during the year, one of the great characters to have left his mark with us. George was a past player and past President, a rare combination in the history of the Club.

As this is my last report to you as members, I set out my views on where I believe the Club is at and where it is headed. Financially, the Club is sound. We have had good continuity and quality of representation at Board and Finance Committee levels for several years now. This means that we are able to set sensible budgets, informed by our knowledge of past performance and our capability to meet income and expenditure levels set. There are always surprises, and more often than not they are nasty ones, such as our deplorable on field performance in 2010 and its impact on attendances and catering, but we now have the energy and ability to recognise threats early and respond to them appropriately. This has meant that the Club's financial performance has been steady in recent years and we have avoided the crises that have plagued us in the past.

But I need to sound a strong note of caution in relation to our financial future. Like all elite sporting clubs we have high set expenditures such as player payments, ground maintenance, insurance, the list goes on, but unlike some clubs the meeting of those expenditures is done purely by revenue raising on a year by year, dollar by dollar basis, a tough process which fully tests the skills and dedication of all involved.

We rely extremely heavily on volunteers to keep the expenditure as low as we possibly can. If the spirit of volunteerism that has sustained our Club for so long was to wane we would soon be in trouble. If you think you can help out in some capacity please put your hand up.

Further, we rely extremely heavily on ongoing financial support from members to stay afloat. I encourage all members to make renewing their memberships, coming to games and attending fundraising events an accepted and welcomed part of life whether the side is winning or losing. A small increase in support would produce a big benefit, any drop off could prove fatal.

The Club is now certainly a comfortable and happy place to spend time and money. The facilities have improved significantly over the last decade, as has the quality of fundraising events. Even though too often spoiled by the result, the match day experience at EFTel Oval remains, in my opinion, second to none in the WAFL. The Club is full of interesting and passionate people who it is a pleasure to spend time with.

Football success continues to be elusive with rare bright spots only provided recently by several years of good performances at colts and junior representative levels and some outstanding individual achievements. It is taking a long time for the hard work of the District to flow through to our senior squad but that is starting to happen now. We need to remind ourselves of just how far off the pace we were in elite development in our zone when the District model began to operate.

I am confident that the benefits of the work in the District will be felt increasingly but I cannot leave this subject without commenting on the Commission's last minute decision in 2010 to strip the emerging suburb of Southern River from us (after initially deciding to leave it with us) to accommodate the 'needs' of another WAFL club. It was an extremely disappointing decision and one which fails to understand

## Rick Curtis, Reserves Coach

**Overview:** Season 2010 was my first as coach of the Development Squad after serving 3 years as an assistant under Paul Maher. I had worked under two Senior Coaches in Simon Eastaugh and Andrew Jarman. Both of whom afforded me a great learning experience from 2 very different coaching styles.

In the 3 years I had been at PFC the Development Squad had never won more than 5 games in any season. It had promoted young players into the League side but never really stood up on its own two feet. I aimed to change that.

I went into the role knowing that my core function was to develop our young brigade to take the next step into League football. My main focus as strange as it seemed to me was not about winning the game but identifying correct position for our personnel in line with the Senior Coach's requirements from them at League level and then developing them in that role. This took precedence to actually winning the game.

I found the more I stuck to my guns and followed this focus the more score board success the team had ultimately winning more games than we lost. Developing players in correct position playing to a template will achieve far more success than a team of great players doing their own thing. We proved that to be correct this year.

2010 saw us achieve 12 wins and 8 losses finishing 5th on the ladder, had we beaten a loaded West Perth outfit in the last round we would have played finals football.

More importantly we promoted 31 players into the League side, 15 had played less than 10 games and 8 of those made their debuts in Burn, Della Bosca, Eades, Florio, Horner, Mather, Rogers and Smith.

My personal opinion is that we could have promoted more or at least more regularly if senior players out of form were sent back to the Development Squad to find form instead persisting with them at League level trying to play them into form. It clearly didn't work and the football club paid the price because of it.

**Philosophy:** My method revolved around a mindset of Respect, Discipline and Mental Fitness. Many of my players are young boys who had not yet grasped the importance of those 3 elements. Football is a man's game played by men; we had some work to do. Without these 3 core attributes you will not play team football nor will you be accountable for your opposition. Our template this year was based on winning the hard ball and supporting the ball carrier. When it's your turn to put your head over the ball for your team mate you do it without reservation. If you don't respect each other or possess discipline and mental fitness then you will hesitate or not commit at all. Selfless commitment to the team is what I demand and I was very pleased with the end result. Mentally fit people stand tall above the rest and for a majority of the season we stood tall.

**Expectations:** What did I expect from this season; I expected to see boys become men, to develop in those 3 core elements and achieve their goal to play League football. I expected to win more games than we lost. I expected massive improvement from seasons past. I expected personal growth as a coach. We exceeded my expectations. This just means the bar gets set higher for season 2011.

**Highlight:** No one game was my highlight – although we played some awesome football. My highlight was the mental strength, camaraderie and hunger shown by the group during the last 6

rounds when finals football was in our sights. They were inspiring to watch, leaders stepping up from every corner, a genuine mateship from youngest to oldest. A real sense of pride in the red and black.

**Lowlight:** My inability to enable Cameron Kickett to achieve and the friction caused by some players not wanting to play League at the end of the season in lieu of playing development football. Football is a very enjoyable game when you have success but can be tormenting without it.

**Finals:** After beating West Perth at Eftel late in the year we became legitimate finals contenders. We had some big games ahead but we had our destiny in our own hands. Should we keep winning it was likely to come down to the last game against West Perth for the #4 spot. In any other season 12 wins would get you in the 4 but with Swans only winning their last game and Peel not many more it meant the top sides won more games creating a bottle neck at the top of the ladder. We disposed of West Perth, East Freo, and East Perth in the final 6 rounds with all of them making the 4.

Perth Development Squad were the big improvers and feared by the competition, had we made the finals I have no doubt would have played in a grand final. The last round saw us take on West Perth at Joondalup Arena, we

copped injuries from the week prior and debut colts boys to fill the sides. West Perth ones had Lynch and Bradley drop back from AFL which loaded their reserves side with Darling, Stockley and Andrews. Quality talks that in the end we couldn't match.

We had some young players drop the ball a bit in the first quarter which gave them a 7 goal lead. We fought back well but went down by 4 goals. It was a big game and the build up was finals like. The experience will benefit the group going forward into season 2011. It was very clear that the group is hungry for finals football; we know it is achievable and very close to being reality.

**Conclusion:** The Development Squad has grown hugely this year having embraced Respect, Discipline and Mental Fitness. We will only get better in season 2011 knowing what we are capable of. Our template will continue to demand selfless players who will always win the hard ball and support the ball carrier.

Under a new Senior Coach I know players will play League football on their merits and if they are not performing they will find form in the Development Squad. This will give a clear pathway for the youth of our club to see their goal of league football become reality. Reward for hard work and consistent performance will send a very positive message.

Bring on season 2011, the resurgence of Perth Football Club.



## Damien Mc Mahon, Colts Coach's

After a very solid pre season with a high number of invitees competing for a spot on our final list of 50, the coaching group could see that there was another talented group of young footballers emerging within the Perth Colts.

Although we had lost a lot of experience from a high number of 2009 players moving up to the senior program we now had to focus on developing a new crop of young players and educate them to play the style of football that the Perth Colts have become known for.

With the youngest list we've had in the past 3 years it was evident that the process was going to be a little slower than in the past. The coaching group had agreed that this season there would be a stronger focus on individual development of the players more so than the overall result of trying to win every game. The purpose of this was to try to fast track players to play league football and hopefully have more players drafted.

The in season programme got off to a good start with a settled line up and a well drill unit, we managed to string some good wins together in the first half of the year. Unfortunately the second half of the season finished moderately due to a unsettled side and a lack of experience as a result of injuries, a number of player heading off to state duties and then later on moving up to play League football. Although the Perth Colts did not managed to achieve their goal of playing finals there were a number of positives to come from the season 2010 in particular:

- Squad of 45 players plus 5 development players
- 19 country players - 31 metro
- 42 players had the opportunity to play in the red and black at colt level
- 3 state 18s representatives Reese Conca, Gerald Ugle and Fraser Mc Innes
- Reese Conca, Haydn Busher, Rowan Garlett, Joel Leeson, Gerald Ugle and Michael Edwards all made their league debut during the season. In addition three players were named in the WAFL Colts team of the year Dylan Warner, Reese Conca, and Haydn Busher.
- Three players represented the PFC at the national draft camp in Canberra - Reese Conca, Gerald Ugle and Simon Tunbridge. Michael Edwards attended the WA state screening.
- The Colts team included 11 indigenous players

During the year 22 players had the opportunity to tour Melbourne and visit the MCG and Etihad stadium. They also had dinner and caught up with a number of Perth's AFL stars and spend an unbelievable experience with one another. To see the excitement on their faces and the comradely of the group made me proud to be the coach of such an outstanding group of young men.

A total of 14 Players have debut in our League team from 2009 and 2010 which is evidence that our colts program is have a flow on effect. In round 22 our League team was made up of 11 players that played colts football in 2008.

Colts Football is about development and helping young men become good footballers and outstanding citizens that will go on and represent this club at senior level and hopefully some at AFL level. In

2010 the Colts program has unearthed some outstanding talent that will become future league players at this football club.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the hard working colts team. Leading from the front with his heart and soul was Steve Ranstead, our team manager. Assistant coaches, Kevin McArthur, Adrian Bland, Joel Foresight and Brent Davis provided great assistance. I would also like to thank our Colts physio, Anna Fisher and head trainer, Kim Lovet, along with their medical team. They have done an outstanding job all year.

Special thanks to our player's parents for the massive support and sacrifice that they put in to making their sons available to train and

play on a weekly basis especially the country parents who traveled long distances.

I would also like to thank the Perth Football Club for the opportunity to coach the future players of this proud football club.

To Rod Bassell & Andrew Jarman - I appreciate the support that you have given me all year. It has been a hard road at times, but we have always managed to get by. I wish both good luck in the future and hope to see you around the club in years to come.

At the Annual General Meeting held in February, Sandy Bayne retired after 18 years of service and was duly thanked for his long years of service to the PP&OA. Pam Davies and Darryn Reid also did not stand for re-election. Denis Thomas became President, Greg Dart was elevated to a Vice President position and Keith Chapman came on to the Committee. During the year Keiran O'Neill resigned, with Brett Webster subsequently being co-opted to fill one of the Committee vacancies. Two vacancies currently exist, with the Committee hopeful of having these positions taken up by keen members interested in continuing on with our good work.

The Association's major sponsorship of the Robert Wiley Foundation continued, with funds being set aside to assist junior football development in agreed projects. During 2010 we met further costs of a video coaching programme, together with assisting three junior development coaches to attend a national coaching seminar in Adelaide.

In addition to the Robert Wiley Foundation sponsorship we also continue to support the Club's Colts squad. We provided a weekly cash award to one of the best Colts players on the day and once again were proud to present the Past Players and Officials Association medal to the Colts fairest and best player for 2010. Also, we contributed directly and indirectly close to \$2,000 towards a trip to Melbourne undertaken by the Colts during the season.

A major income source is the regular match day gate raffle which again was highly successful. Apart from members of the Committee carrying out the ticket selling duties we were also fortunate to have a large band of helpers who volunteered their services. Many thanks are extended to all of these people for their assistance.

The 100 club was again well supported, resulting in a guaranteed income source. It was very pleasing to note that a recently-retired player, Bryce Willday, a new member of the Association, took out the \$500 major prize. Congratulations Bryce!

Chairman Neil Darby and his DFDC, Ross Leipold, Mick Richardson, Paul Rothnie and Sharon Murray

with their band of dedicated JCC volunteers ensure that the foundation of our focus areas are beginning to blossom. In conjunction with the District development office, with a lot of hard work the future looks bright.

2010 and moving forward the Perth District is focused on the games core objectives to uphold WA Football Development's mission to "grow the game". To enhance and promote Australian Rules Football throughout our community, encouraging greater levels of participation, enjoyment and commitment by individuals, community groups and business and government. Those core objectives are:

- Participation: to develop and support appropriate pathways for all segments from AFL Auskick to open age that maximise participation.
- Community: to motivate volunteers, umpires, coaches, spectators & sports trainers for all levels of Australian football to promote quality environments and competitions.
- WAFL Talent Pathway: to develop the talented player pathway and enhance the WAFL competition to capture and develop talented players.
- Facilities: to collaborate on facility development for the community football network of leagues & clubs
- Engagement: to utilise Australian football as a vehicle to promote social inclusion, participation, education and employment initiatives, particularly in Female, Indigenous and Multicultural communities.
- Fans: To build the relationship with community and school players, coaches, umpires and volunteers to develop them as fans of the AFL /WAFL Competition and AFL /WAFL Clubs.

Touching on a few important areas from the District in 2010.

### NAB Auskick

2010 was another very successful year for the Perth district NAB Auskick program. Participants over the last three years have gradually been on the increase and this year was no different with 2061 participant, 65 up from 2009. These figures are a representation of the mountain of work done by the Auskick co-ordinators in our junior clubs, along with the clinic co-ordinators and Junior Development Officer James Crabtree who work overtime in our school based centres. The major reason for the increase in participants this year was due to a greater emphasis being put on providing a quality program and the introduction of Auskick centres in our emerging market areas of female football and multicultural football.

In 2011 we look forward to another increase in participants with the major resources being put into increasing numbers at some of our junior football clubs. This will be achieved by following on from the hard work done in 2010 and developing better child management and coach education programs, along with the better structuring of volunteer rewards to give more incentive to the parents working with our Auskick centres.

### School Football Programs

Creating a better link between local district schools and our junior clubs has been a major goal of the Perth Demons District in 2010. This year we had some great success in our school football programs with the highest number of secondary schools (12) joining a new recreational program called Freo House Footy and a record number of primary schools (36), playing in lightning carnivals throughout the year. The AFL School ambassador program is growing each year in the district will another 11 Ambassadors joining in 2010, the challenge for the district is to ensure that these ambassadors are delivering quality football programs at our schools. The hard work of AFL school ambassadors such as Vicki Keys, Steven Miller and Clinton Issard has not gone unnoticed and these teachers were rewarded for their great work in 2010.

To better develop the relationship between junior clubs and the allocated school in their zone the Perth District has piloted a promotional program, where a teacher from each school wears the affiliated junior clubs polo or colours for a day throughout the football season. In 2011 we hope that this will develop and become stronger and increase the awareness our junior clubs.

### Junior Competition Council

This year brought about the introduction of a few new names to the JCC. Led by Ross Leipold in his first year as Competition Director, Ross was assisted by Paul Rothnie and Mick Richardson as Assistant Competition Directors, while the usual suspects Sharon Murray & Simon Gilbert along with many volunteers laid a strong foundation for a successful season. The Perth Demons district would like to commend Ross for his great work as competition director and look forward to continuing the strong relationship that has been built over 2010 and taking it into 2011.

The JCC is working very hard to take steps in the right direction in terms of better coach education, volunteer support, spectator behaviour and umpire appreciation. The introduction of the cross-district competition with East Perth brought about some administrative problems but was overall seen as a successful promotional tool for the players and increase the youth player numbers by 75 in the Perth district. With a better administrative structure in place in 2011 things will run far more smoothly and the importance of player retention will be the number one issue.

### Coach Education

The Perth Demons Development Council is in its third year of making a concerted effort to improve the standard of coaching across the District through its coach education program. Through the support of all coaching stakeholders in the District, coach education and in turn coaching is improving through forums such as: Perth District Coaching Seminars  
Perth District Coaching Coordinator and mentors, mentoring newly accredited coaches  
Perth District NAB Auskick coach mentoring system  
Perth District modified and youth mentoring system  
Perth FC and WAFL game day experiences for Perth community coaches  
Robert Wiley Foundation Coaching Seminars

### Perth District Coaches 'rub shoulders' with the WAFL

Season 2010 has again seen community coaches interacting and learning from Perth Football Club (WAFL club) coaches. Level 2 participants have taken part in game day experiences with Senior Coach Andrew Jarman and Colts and Senior Assistant Coach Damien McMahon.

Both McMahon and Jarman have also been heavily involved in the District's coach education program by presenting at seminars and level 1 courses, giving back to community coaches!

### Perth District and Robert Wiley Foundation Coaching Seminars

In collaboration with Steve Armstrong (RWF) and Beau Wardman District Coach Coordinator the Perth District coordinated kicking seminars throughout 2010. The seminars were taken out to the District coaches with a good response from supporter clubs. The seminars were also apart of 2010 level 1 and 2 accreditation criteria. The seminars will continue in 2011 encompassing another core objective of the RWF for example sprint work or core strength.

### Senior Community

In 2010 our priority was to continue to improve relationships with all of our senior community clubs and ensure they were able to utilise the District office in areas such as coach education, facilities and club development. In most cases this was achieved however we want to keep developing this portfolio in 2011. Highlights this year was three Senior Community Friday night games at EFTel Oval. Perth District Senior community clubs are planning a colt's carnival at EFTel Oval in early 2011, this is one of the actions in partnership with the development office to find ways to ensure senior community football is sustainable in the Demons District.

### Facilities

Following on from the facility audit in 2007 the District has started to form a working relationship with all of its local governments and is striving to be the link between Demon District clubs and local government when it comes to facilities. This year we have continued a working group involving our 5 local governments to ensure we are keeping lines of communication open. Moving forward it is a priority to update the District facility audit, imputing up to date works and creating prioritised job lists.

### District

James Crabtree (Smarter than Smoking Junior Development Officer) continued his good work this year, mainly in the areas of grass roots and promotion of the game. Thanks also to "Smarter than Smoking" Development Officer Joseph Brierty who achieved great results in the District in a variety of portfolios.
