DARYLE MANN PRESIDENT



This was a report I never expected to write at the beginning of the year and is a sad reminder of one of the two significant events that occurred during 2016.

First was the shattering loss of our President and Life member; Vince Pandal. Vince passed away in August after a short illness. He held the post since 2011, this being his second term as President the first being from 1988 to 1990. Vince was a man of great foresight and drive. He was never one to let grass grow under his feet nor let negative thinking influence his vision. He provided the Board and staff with a challenging agenda aimed at ensuring our focus was on improvement. The large contingent of people from all walks of Football and Business life at his funeral was testimony to the high regard in which he was held. Vince will be greatly missed by all, especially his enthusiastic and vocal presence on match days. His Leadership and legacy demands we move forward.

Perth Football Club have been attempting to achieve improvement and some form of appropriate redevelopment for many years at our home (since 1959) at Lathlain Park and has been a frustration to previous Presidents, Boards and CEO's. Vince's foresight in encouraging the West Coast Eagles to look at Lathlain as a new home base leads us to our second significant event, the commencement of the Lathlain Park redevelopment. A redevelopment that will provide two new ovals, a new community area, a new headquarters and training facility for the West Coast Eagles, new building and headquarters for the Perth Football Club but most importantly security of tenure. Something that was far from certain in previous redevelopment plans. Vince, on behalf of the club, signed an MOU with the West Coast Eagles and the Town of Victoria Park setting out our rights and obligations. At the time of writing, the West Coast Eagles General Manager of Projects, Digby Moullin expects the reconfigured Oval in front of our Grandstand to be ready for football by Round 3 of the 2017 season. An oval that promises to be world class. The level of support from the West Coast Eagles to date has been greatly appreciated.

The Club's thanks go to the Town of Victoria Park Mayor, Trevor Vaughan for his enthusiasm and support for the project and also his foresight in seeing the positive improvement it brings to Community facilities, not only for the Town but our State. The Club's thanks and appreciation also goes to the Town's CEO, Anthony Vuleta and Project Manager, Warren Bow.

We should never forget that we are a Football Club competing in a very strong State level competition. A competition that has been evolving and serving the State since 1885. A competition the whole state can be proud of. To be successful requires a lot of high level input from many people.

I commence my thanks to our members and the many, many Volunteers we have who continue to support the club through good times and bad. You are the true believers and supporters to whom we owe so much thanks. I can only encourage all supporters and members who may be interested in getting involved, no matter how small, to contact Marty Atkins as it can be rewarding and you do make a difference. The more spokes in a wheel the stronger it becomes.

A special group of Volunteers are those in our Past Players and Officials Association. Once again this year, under the leadership of President Wayne Koch, they have made a significant contribution, both in time and money, to many projects especially our History Centre and our Colts program.

To my fellow Board members Neil Darby, Mark Treasure, Steve Kargotich, John Dorazio, Wayne Smith, Mat Bateman and Cathy Vanderweide, the club owes you a vote of thanks for the many unseen hours you put in to keeping the club alive and moving forward. The skill set contained in the Board would be the envy of many clubs. Regrettably Steve and Mat are not continuing on the Board next year: Steve because of time issues as he spends a lot of time in Melbourne and Mat to increase his focus on District football. Fortunately both are remaining involved in the club. We will welcome their replacements at the AGM.

My thanks go to our very hard working CEO, Marty Atkins. We all know Marty had a very successful football career and it is pleasing to see him bringing the same determination and work ethic he showed on the football field to the CEO role as he strives for success and to create a culture that attracts and retains footballers and supporters.

My thanks to all our staff: Tyson Beattie (Football Operations), Peter Brear (Talent Pathways Officer), Kelli Bott (Sponsorship Administrator), Ryan Keatley (Bar & Functions Manager), John Matthews (Finance Officer) and a special thank you to multi skilled and talented Kerrie-Ann Pandal (General Manager of anything) who left us in November to recommence her Professional career. We sincerely appreciated everything you did and we look forward to seeing you regularly "on the other side of the fence" in the future.

The Football Operations and CEO's reports will cover Football in more detail, however I must congratulate first year Colts Coach Andrew Ruck and his team for the excellent program they ran during the year, resulting in many Colts boys getting a taste of Senior football as well as finishing as minor premiers. The encouraging thing is many of the boys can play Colts again next year.

The Club is fortunate to have a number of valued Sponsors who continue to see the important role sport plays in our community and also the entertainment value. On behalf of the Board I sincerely thank every one of our Sponsors for their support and I look forward to your continued support during the coming years. League Coach Earl Spalding heads into his third year in charge in 2017 and we are optimistic that the improvement shown by the League squad in terms of improved culture, commitment and performance will continue.

In closing I can confirm to all Members that your Board is determined to continue to improve the Club both on and off the field. We look forward to your continued support.

VINCE PENDAL: PASSIONATE DEMON AND VISIONARY

VINCE PENDAL, whose death on Saturday August 13 came as a shock to all Perth Football Club members and supporters, was the driving force behind the multi-million redevelopment of Lathlain Park, not only for Perth but also the West Coast Eagles.

Since 2011, in his second stint as Perth President, he had worked tirelessly to encourage the Eagles and the Town of Victoria Park to back the project which will revolutionise facilities at the ground for both football and community activities.

Vince also lobbied the Federal and State Governments to help finance the project. He lived to see the contracts for the ambitious plan signed, and died only days before the first earthworks began.

How Vince found the time to take on the Perth presidency in 1989 and 1990, given his business and family commitments, is a mystery. But it was a measure of his love for the club that he assumed the role which requires a massive commitment in time, let alone achieving the over arching goal of ensuring everyone is moving in the right direction, both on and off the field.

When Damian Matthews stepped down in 2010 after six years at the helm, Vince was persuaded to take on a second stint as club leader. He had a clear idea of what he wanted. Although he couldn't kick the goals on the field, he was adamant that Perth had to perform better across all grades.

And when board vacancies occurred he head hunted replacements with particular skills.

He also formalised a Nominations Committee which Damian Matthews had initiated. With club greats such as Allan Stiles and the late Jack Ensor on the initial panel, its job is to ensure that members with a strong track record of contributing to the club in particular, and football in general, get appropriate recognition.

Over the past six years Vince became a larger than life figure at the club. He presided over the popular home game President's Lunches, which often attract 150 or more guests. They have become a great vehicle for the club to acknowledge the generous contribution of sponsors and officials from our junior groups.

And he didn't hold back in his addresses at the lunches. Often the WA Football Commission was a target for some "constructive" criticism. The WAFC's fixtures committee was frequently mentioned, especially the fact that there would be a four week mid-season home game gap. That was not appreciated by the passionate President.

Vince was an enthusiastic supporter of the club's Hall of Fame, launched at a gala dinner on the oval in 2015, and also found the time to generously back the formation of the Australian Prospectors' and Miners' Hall of Fame in Kalgoorlie.

He was an uninhibited barracker, so much so that the television station broadcasting home games had to be careful where the "effects" microphone was placed to pick up crowd reactions.

His friend of more than 50 years, Terry Strapp explained the position in his eulogy at Vince's funeral.

"What we had with Vince was a rare individual liked by all and enjoyable company to be with," he said. "The one exception was to sit alongside him at a Perth match where earplugs were obligatory and still not enough at times. I am sure the umpire on the field could hear his not always helpful advice."

Younger brother Allan Pandal, a Kalgoorlie-Boulder City Councillor (another brother, the late Phillip Pandal, was a State MP for 25 years) noted in his eulogy that Vince was very generous, both financially and with his time.

"He was kind, considerate and thoughtful," Allan said. "As an institution, there was no greater beneficiary than his beloved Perth Football Club."

Vince's death was noted in State Parliament. Victoria Park MP and club Vice Patron, Ben Wyatt, said: "Vince was an extraordinarily strong leader of our club and brought a strong sense of business acumen to his role." He added: "Vince has left the club's balance sheet in a very strong position," noting he had always been "incredibly welcoming" at Lathlain.

Vincent Harold Pandal was born in Bunbury on 27 October 1945. His link with the club was forged in 1959 when his family moved to the city and he attended Xavier College in East Victoria Park, the heart of Demons' territory. It was to be a lifelong association, which only became more intense over time. His extensive and successful business career provided the perfect backdrop for the Lathlain plan.

Vince started his working career at the ANZ Bank. Later he moved into stockbroking when he joined leading Perth firm D.J. Carmichael. The experience came in handy when he moved again, this time to the Parry Group as Group Investment Manager.

Then it was into property development at the Herdsman Park Estate, which now accommodates the successful business park adjoining the Mitchell Freeway. In the mid 1980s he became managing director of the Pennant Group, and oversaw many substantial building projects throughout Australia. Vince kept on the move and joined a small investment bank called Fincorp, taking on many Board commitments.

Terry Strapp, told hundreds of mourners at the funeral of another aspect of Vince's activities.

"Vince also played a very important role mentoring many individuals within his business and sporting involvements," Terry said, "always giving his time and wise counsel, coupled with the wisdom earned over his considerable business life. He gave this freely without the expectation of anything in return."

Vince was diagnosed with lung cancer earlier this year. The initial results from his treatment were encouraging, and he continued to host the home game lunches. Then the cancer began to spread rapidly. But Vince retained his optimistic and cheerful attitude right to the end.

The club extends its sincere sympathy to the Pandal family, especially his wife Vicki and children, including daughter Kerrie-Ann, who continued as the club's very effective Business Operations Manager until November 2016.

His family's loss is immense. And our club has lost a passionate President and visionary. The exciting redevelopment of Lathlain Park will be his legacy.

MARTY ATKINS CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

Added to this was support from Trevor Williams (PFC Coaching Academy) and Callum Walley (Aboriginal Engagement Officer) - 2 new positions that the club identified as key appointments to assist with improving the standard of coaching in the district, as well as player welfare and support for our increasing number of indigenous players representing the club across all grades.

We will continue to challenge all areas of our football operations, but the commitment and dedication shown by our football staff can't be challenged. They commit hours well over and above those expected and whilst not recognised on many occasions, it is certainly appreciated.

Throughout the year the club again supported many of the WAFL themed rounds, fortunate enough to show our own appreciation and respect to ANZAC Day, NAIDOC celebrations, 'Know Your Score' message on behalf of the WA Prostate Cancer Foundation, as well as the important roles fathers play in the family structure (Fathering Project).

Engaging in our community has been a focus for the club for many years, so our promotion of these key community events/messages, not only supports the WAFC/WAFL in their efforts to engage, but also connects us with many different community members across our metro and country zones.

Connection with our community also delivers some special relationships, those being our all-important sponsors who again have been wonderful in their support of club/district programs, our players, medical team, coaches and of course support of the club itself.

Special mention to be made of Gavin Caudle (Provident Capital Partners) who's support of the club has been unbelievable. As many would know Gavin is based overseas, but if he does not attend match day in person, he always makes contact to get a summary of the day.

Gavin always offers to help out in other areas of the club, especially recruiting and securing of employment - many thanks to Gavin for not only his support, but also his friendship.

I would also like to thank Daniel Davies and the team at 'Southside Mitsubishi & Southside Volkswagon' - fantastic in their support of the club, along with new club sponsors Bill Richardson and staff at 'The Lucky Shag' and Lisa Cuthbert and team at 'New Life Solar' who have both had a significant impact on the club in 2016.

Thankfully during meetings to discuss 'Hall of Fame' inductees, I got to listen and he would have had many more players inducted if it was up to him, such was his respect for many of the Demons he had an influence on and there were many.

As for Vince, the club lost a great President and benefactor, I lost a good friend. I was lucky enough to have shared many an hour with Vince over the last four and a half years and I can't say there was a negative moment shared. He loved to share his experiences, he loved to give his opinion, he loved the club and he certainly loved his family. He didn't like losing and at times he certainly expressed his thoughts on umpiring but that was Vince. A larger than life character, whose legacy will be remembered in many ways, including his influence on bringing the WCE to Lathlain.

I need to thank and acknowledge all members of the PFC Board, who again supported me, as well as offering me advice and encouragement in managing this great club. Our Past Players and Officials also need to be acknowledged as they again have been terrific in their support across various areas of the club.

To my team in Kerrie-Ann, Kelli, John, Ryan, Kylie and bar staff, Lance, the Monday volunteers and Kerry a big thank you for your efforts. Very few people see the hours and hours of work you put in behind the scenes to ensure this club remains an active, positive and respected club off field.

I am proud of all your efforts especially knowing the stress it has caused at times. But together we have met the challenges and I look forward to a new season and although Kerrie-Ann is moving on and I wish her the very best in the new chapter of her life, I believe that 2017 will be a season to be remembered.

TYSON BEATTIE FOOTBALL OPERATIONS MANAGER

For the Perth Football Club, season 2016 was a critical step in our progression to the club's goal of being a squad capable of beating any team and establishing long term success in our program by developing quality players and people. The stride in making this football department a well-organised unit that fosters the development both athletically and personally is a big achievement this year. The league squad won seven out of twenty games, which is the ultimate measure of our success. However, to truly understand our progression it is essential to view the improvement in process driven objectives.

The first move the Perth Football Club made last offseason was the appointment of a new Colts Coach and the construction of a new role, titled the Director of Coaching, Colts and Development. In order to foster the development of young players from our zone into genuine league footballers, a new approach was needed to focus on individual development plans, coaching development and a direction to retain our quality talent. The Colts role was taken up by Andrew Ruck, a talented young coach who had spent two years as an Assistant Coach at senior level. In order to assist his development, the Coaching Co-ordinator would also be a mentor and that position was filled by Trevor Williams. Trevor was the perfect man to provide the coaching education, talent identification and overall support to both the Colts program and the development squads.

The restructure provided a platform from which the Colts program won 12 consecutive games to start the season, finished the year on top of the ladder as minor premier and reaching a preliminary final. While the team didn't obtain its ultimate goal of a premiership, five players made the WAFL Colts team of the year and critical development provides a pathway to senior football for many players in the future.

The Reserves squad led by returning coach Andrew Panetta benefited from several Colts players making their debut but also played an important role in the development of current players and those which had been invited into the program. Matthew Thompson from Boyup Brook, Brayden Piggott from South Bunbury and Fraser Millar who eventually won the Greg Brehaut medal as the best and fairest player in the Reserves this season.

The League squad in turn benefited from a systematic approach to improvement. Lennon Marlin, Matt Taylor, Brent Edmonds and Sam Garstone all demonstrated tremendous progression in their own individual performances and showed they are a core part of our future success at the Perth Football Club.

Recruiting was also a success with the introduction of Spencer White, a key forward from St.Kilda, Angus Graham a big ruckman who played 48 games with Richmond and 149 game Saints midfielder Clinton Jones who went on to finish second in the Sandover Medal.

The season had its ups and downs but generally its story could be told in thirds.

The first third was disappointing, in that we didn't take more opportunities and we won only one game, the second third we saw that things started to come together particularly as injuries dissipated and consistency developed. The final leg of the year was a wasted opportunity which left us wondering, what if? There are great lessons to be learned from this. We must be well prepared and well drilled with our training plan in order to succeed early in the year. This preseason will involve tremendous dedication and repetition of our game plan as well as adjustments in our strength and conditioning to compliment the elements of that game style. The final leg of the season and its results reflected more on the mental than the physical. Our injury list wasn't significant and our conditioning was strong but our commitment to improving and continuing on the building blocks from three consecutive wins was lacking. A focus on developing leadership and the structures that surround that group will improve.

I would like to thank the volunteers, including team managers Kevin Dack, Paul Biggs and Steve Ransted for their outstanding contribution this year. Property men Arthur and Doug Ransted are always invaluable around the club. Thanks to Wayne Koch and the Past Players and Officials who helped the team throughout the year including assisting in a number of team dinners and functions.

Our Physiotherapist Mike Neill was fantastic as well as the club Doctor Anthony Henderson. Unfortunately our tireless Head Trainer Lesley Hug will be standing down this year. She has been tremendous and in 2015 we honoured her with the Vince Pental award. Her entire medical team and all of the Trainers were sensational in helping prepare the squad every training session and game.

Dennis "Boo" Marshall and Malcom "Spud" Harris were again outstanding in their statistical work throughout the season and a big thanks to Mark Grogan and Simon Jenkins for running for the league team. "Jenks," in particular was excellent with his boxing work at training.

Thanks to Strength and Conditioning Coach Frank Rodriguez, who will be stepping down this year due to work and family commitments. Thanks also to his assistants Ben Teune and Scott Andrews.

How will history judge our 2016 season? If we can continue to build on the solid foundation we have set over the last couple of years by individually and collectively working hard on all aspects of our game, especially our deficiencies, then I'm sure it will be viewed as a pivotal year in the rebirth of the footy club. However if we become complacent, as we have on several occasions when in the same position over the last 38 years and wait for someone else to do the hard work for us, it will just be another promising year that turned into one of false hope.

Of the 44 players that played league football in 2014, only 11 remain at the club and I am cautiously optimistic that the current playing group has the talent, drive and desire to be successful. They certainly showed on a number of occasions that they are more than capable of matching it with the best teams in the comp. Unfortunately though, at this stage of their development, they couldn't sustain that effort when a number of games were up for grabs in the last quarter. To rub salt into the wounds we often leaked soft goals late to turn a 1 or 2 goal game into a 6 or 7 goal defeat. We did manage to improve from 2 wins in 2015 to 7 wins in 2016, mainly on the back of our defensive effort. Our points against this year were the best since 2002 and that was an 18 game season. Whilst the wettest winter for quite a while played a part in this result, we certainly showed a vastly improved defensive mindset in all parts of the ground. We also managed to turn around a minus 11 inside 50 average from last year into a minus 1 average this year, which is another indicator of our improved standing.

The obvious highlight of the year for me was the 3 game winning streak we had in the middle of the season. All the wins were notable for different reasons with the first one against East Fremantle, producing our best 4 quarter ball movement for the season. While they were missing arguably their best 3 midfielders, the final margin flattered them as we completely dominated parts of the game without putting them away. The next week we backed this up with arguably our best half of footy for the year, especially our pressure skills, away against a full strength Claremont. We again were wasteful in front of goal which left them in the game and we showed enormous courage to hang on in a tense last quarter. The final game in this run was against defending premiers and eventual grand finalists, Subiaco. In atrocious conditions, where an enormous effort was required just to be competitive, we were able to lay 115 tackles and strangle them out of the contest.

The other highlight for me was the enormous individual improvement we saw from Lennon Marlin, Sam Garstone, Brent Edmonds, Cody Leggett & Matt Taylor. All 5 showed, if they're prepared to work hard, they have the potential to raise their game to be genuine "A" grade WAFL players in the near future, like newly crowned Butcher Medallist, Michael Sinclair has done this year. When this occurs, I believe we will become bona fide contenders!!

We only had 7 first game players this year, down from the 15 of last year, but the competition for spots was a lot keener and as a consequence they really had to earn their opportunities. This should hold them and the club in good stead going forward.

I was extremely fortunate to have had the support of a fantastic bunch of Assistant Coaches this year. Chance Bateman (defence), Michal Pratt (forwards) and Kade Lang (midfield) are a dedicated and knowledgeable team and we are very lucky to have people of this calibre imparting their wisdom on our playing group. They all have different and distinctive personalities, which ended up being a great mix to work within. Unfortunately due to work commitments, Kade Lang will not be continuing on in 2017, we thank him for his efforts and wish him well.

Similarly our Development group in Coach Andrew Panetta and able assistants Craig, Kim and Neil worked harmoniously together to deliver the same themes and messages to their charges. They are a great bunch of blokes whose motivation is nothing more than to see Perth climb the ladder and have some well overdue success. We also wish Barrie Smith a speedy recovery from a serious illness which cut short his season as Forward Coach and thank Neil for stepping up in his absence.

Our conditioning staff of Frank, Scott & Ben also worked tirelessly to ensure the players were as fit and healthy as they possibly could be and we had great results with our soft tissue injury prevention. Due to his work load as a Cray fisherman and increasing demands of a young family, Frank has indicated he won't be able to continue next season. We sincerely thank him for his efforts over the last 2 years and know he has been an integral part of our rapid improvement.

A big congratulation is due to Andrew Ruck in his first year as Colts Coach. With the help of his assistants Glenn, Dave & Paul and under the experienced guidance of Trevor Williams, they managed to get their very talented group to finish the home and away season on top of the ladder. Whilst it was disappointing to bow out in straight sets, injuries to key players certainly didn't help their cause. The bigger picture however is how many of these boys will transition into league players at this club and Rucky has given them every chance, by instilling a good work ethic, a respect for team values and a game understanding that was evident when they were given an opportunity at development level.

To all the support staff, a big thank you for your efforts and support during the year. From our dynamic stats duo of Boo and Spud, our Team Manager Dacky, our runners Jenks & Groges, Lidds the Boardman through to our resident doctor Anthony, Mike the Physio and Lesley and her team of Trainers. We have great people at our disposal and I look forward to hopefully celebrating with them the success we all crave. Sadly, Lesley has advised that due to family commitments she will also not be returning in 2017.

I'd also like to thank Tyson, Marty and the board, for the continued faith they have shown in me in a promising, yet sometimes frustrating year. I am absolutely convinced we are on the right track and while we will continue to try and recruit quality players and people into our club (especially returning 1 point AFL players), I know the majority of our future improvement will come from the current playing group.

Finally it would be remiss of me not to acknowledge the contribution Vince Pental has made to this club and the enormous grief his tragic passing has left. He was many things to many people, but I will remember him as a loyal friend and supporter, who would go to great lengths to see his beloved Demons once again become a powerhouse of the competition. We all owe it to him to ensure his vision is fulfilled.

ANDREW RUCK COLTS COACH



Firstly, I would like to thank the Perth Football Club, the PFC Board, Marty Atkins (CEO) and Tyson Beattie (Football Manager) for the opportunity to coach Colts football at the Perth Football Club in 2016. After spending two years as a Senior Assistant I am sincerely grateful for being allowed to transition to the Colts program where I was able to implore some of my philosophies and experiences onto the colts group.

We started pre-season training in November and had 100+ players attend training to gain selection into our squad. We had a strong focus on skills and contested football from the opening session and after a number of sessions over Summer, settled on a squad of 45 players, with 20 of those Indigenous. The Perth Football Club has a rich tradition with Indigenous talent and we were excited to continue that tradition, with 19 of those boys experiencing Colts football throughout the season. During the season an additional 8 players were added to the Rookie Squad after a number of long-term injuries and the 16's carnival had concluded. Of those 8, five players were rewarded with at least one game with Luke English playing in both finals.

Highlights throughout the season:

- 47 players played colts football
- 6 players selected in the state 18's squad – John Levien, Anton Scotney, Kristian Morisey, Quinton Narkle, Gordon Narrier and Zac Fisher
- 5 players selected in the WAFL Colts 'Team of the year' – Kristian Morisey, Quinton Narkle, Cody Kickett, Jayden Johnston and Chris Leonard
- James Bereyne winning the Colts 'Leading Goal kicking' award
- One player playing League football – Cody Ninnette and another 12 players experiencing Senior Football
- Winning the Minor Premiership
- Zac Fisher winning 'All-Australian' selection and MVP for WA at the national championships

The Pre-season phase finished with the SAS conducting a session for the entire squad at Lathlain Oval in early March, where players worked through different activities under fatigue to foster stronger relationships and teamwork. The squad then selected their team values for season 2016, which were Pride, Accountability, Competitiveness and Relentlessness. After starting the season with a 9-0 win:loss record it was clear that the entire squad had adopted these values and our strong season resulted in a 16-4 win:loss record and the minor premiership.

There were many highlights throughout the season including come from behind wins against Claremont, when Gordon Narrier calmly snapped the winning goal with 30 sec to play, West Perth, after being 6 goals down at quarter time and East Perth after Franky James reeled in a pack mark and kicked truly to take the win, with a minute left to play. At times our style of play and ball movement was breathtaking, frequently moving the ball with speed and accuracy from defence into attack.

Our pressure around the football was manic and our players consistently played selfless football, constantly tackling, chasing and providing blocks for teammates to evade opposition.

In the back end of the season a number of players transitioned to the senior squad to play senior football and the depth of our squad was tested after a number of serious injuries to numerous players. To the credit of our entire squad almost every player in our squad experienced Colts football and although sometimes outsized by opposition players, we managed to finish the season on top of the ladder and claim the minor Premiership.

This resulted in a week off during the first week of the finals and a double opportunity to play for a spot in the Grand Final. Unfortunately we were unable to win either finals game and our season finished in the Preliminary Final against East Perth at Fremantle Oval, a six goal loss. It was a disappointing way to finish the season, however with 12 players from that side eligible for colts football in 2017, a number of injured players returning and a talented 16's squad coming through the future looks bright for next season.

To all of the players who are transitioning through to senior football next season, I thank you for all of your efforts throughout the season and wish you all the best in your future. I hope you have enjoyed the season and learnt valuable training and playing habits that will assist with your development into senior football. If you are overlooked for the next level, I implore you to stick at it, work hard on your deficiencies during pre-season and continue to strive to play League football.

It is with great fondness I reflect on our beloved President who passed away during the year. Whilst only knowing Vince for a few years it was not hard to see his passion and commitment to the Perth Football Club and the legacy he leaves. He was heavily involved with the colts, sponsoring an award and constantly asking after the boys. I will never forget his effort to climb the stairs at the showgrounds for post game celebrations. He would not accept any help on his journey up those stairs and even though his health was poor at the time, he wouldn't miss it. I hope his spirit and pride rubbed off on our playing group.

I feel our program provided a fantastic environment for players to improve their deficiencies and I would not have been so successful without the support and expertise of several people I would like to formally acknowledge. Most of them sacrificed many hours throughout the season to support, guide and educate our young players and I am appreciative of all of their efforts.

With another exciting year of district junior football over that contained many highlights, I would like first to take this opportunity to answer the most common question that I have been asked this season in my new role - what does the Demons District Football Development Council (DFDC) actually do?

Well, the DFDC is a constituted organisation that works with the Western Australian Football Commission (WAFC) and the Perth Football Club (PFC), to put in place a governance structure to allow participation in junior football across a range of formats including junior clubs, schools, talent squads and a range of specialist programs that support multiculturalism, females and coaching.

Of course that is what we do, but what does the DFDC seek to achieve – put simply to grow the greatest game in the world within our junior district that stretches from South Perth in the north to Gosnells in the south and from Thornlie in the west to Redcliffe in the east.

Growing the game at junior level is at times very complex, but extremely rewarding. Participation in junior football whether at a club or at a school gives children the opportunity to become better people through developing both physical and life skills.

It also gives participants an opportunity to develop across a range of pathways. One of these is of course player development, but it is not just about finding the next AFL or WAFL player, but developing a lifelong association with the great game, so no matter what their ability is that they find their niche and go on to participate in some form in community football.

But our great game also allows for development pathways for Umpires, Administrators, Coaches, Teachers, WAFC staff and of course the backbone of any successful sporting group, VOLUNTEERS.

This season the DFDC has continued to promote a wide variety of pathways for all our participants and I was fortunate enough to attend many of these in 2016 with the highlights including:

- The Auskick Gala day at Curtin University that was well supported by players from the PFC.
- The District successfully introduced Auskick Plus to enhance the nurturing and enjoyment of players whilst maximising the use of valuable resources and volunteers time.
- The District Gala Day, hosted by the PFC at Lathlain Park, was again a success and demonstrated the passion in all of our junior football clubs.
- The Nicky Winmar Carnival continues to grow in significance in developing our indigenous players.
- The ongoing success and expansion of our School Ambassador Program to now include the Bulldog Kids at Cannington Community College.
- Junior players, from a range of clubs, playing for our district development teams and successfully competing against other district sides.
- Junior female football expanding with our teams playing other districts at Lightning Park, Noranda.
- Expansion of junior coaching pathways with the introduction of the Demons Coaching Academy that was developed with the PFC.
- The annual Coaching Road Shows continued and proved to be very popular for those coaches and parents dedicated to improving the development of our players.

- Umpiring continued to thrive and develop through the Perth District Junior Football Umpires Association and full credit to those participants who both juggle playing and umpiring junior football.
- The District Gala Night was an outstanding success in the beautiful surrounds of the Gosnells Golf Course and was superbly hosted by ABC and Perth diehard fan, Clint Wheeldon. This celebration recognised all the hard work our volunteers do and was well supported by PFC Board members John Dorazio, Mat Batman and Wayne Smith and PFC Football Operations Manager Tyson Beattie.
- The recognition of the importance of volunteers continued with the Sunday Times Volunteer of the Year Ceremony at the Convention Centre with our District nominee from Thornlie JFC Jenny Farrell.
- Multicultural Day at Tom Bateman Thornlie was sensational. The importance of this day cannot be underestimated as for many students this is their first introduction to football. Chatting to students who come from countries such as Iraq, Afghanistan, China and Indonesia gives an insight into the importance of days like this to promote football to the next generation. The support of West Coast Eagles players was also appreciated as for many children this was one of the day's highlights.
- School based competitions continue such as the Dockers Cup, which was played at Coker Park, Cannington, and won for the second time in three years by East Maddington Primary School.

Our new District Chairperson – Sean Collingwood and his District Football Development Council members who have made a huge impact in such a short period. Outgoing Junior Competition Council Director Justin Sambell, who guided the JCC through a period of change with some hard decisions to be made, the Competition Director's role isn't always a popular job and Justin's diligence and commitment to Junior Football is very much appreciated. Competitions Officer Maree Power, who is the glue of our team and who without we wouldn't be able to achieve our high goals on a yearly basis. Alison Moore, Kristy Geuer and Gerry O'Dea at the Perth Angels, the amount of hard work and dedication they have put in over the first 2 seasons - which was rewarded with both the Youth Girls and Seniors qualifying for finals in 2016 has been amazing. Finally thank you to the parents, coaches, and thousands of volunteers out in club land that make the game of AFL so fantastic. Without you – the Volunteer, the game could not be what it is today and we thank you for that.

Auskick

The Auskick program aimed at children aged between 5-7 years saw some big changes in 2016. The Demons District introduced the "Auskick Plus" program as an additional product for centres looking to further enhance the Auskick Experience. The basis of Auskick plus was to regionalise and combine multiple centres together to allow for more resources, varied training and grid games while keeping kids excited about Auskick and the ability to meet and make new friends. We had 2 Auskick Plus centres roll out in the inaugural season – The South Division (Thornlie JFC, Huntingdale JFC, Gosnells JFC & Lynwood/Ferndale JFC) and the East Division (Kenwick JFC, Maddington JFC, Queens Park JFC & Victoria Park JFC). I would like to personally thank the coordinators from the participating clubs on their efforts to help roll out a brand new program and all the extra work they put into making it a great success.

The Auskick Gala Day moved to a new home at South Oval Curtin Uni with over 60 teams and 19 fields it was a phenomenal showcase of young footballers in our district. We also hosted a WAFC Metro Central Region Gala Day (Demons, Swans and Royals Districts) at Langley Park as a further opportunity to expand the Auskick Product.

Footy Fundamentals, the program for 1.5-5 year olds which acts as a precursor to Auskick entered its second year with a big growth in numbers with upwards of 50 kids over the 3 programs hosted at South Perth JFC. This program is critical to helping continue to grow our Auskick numbers which is our top priority in the district moving forward.

Finally, the "Demons Kids" after school Auskick transition program launched in 2016. Aimed at linking local community clubs to after school Auskick Centres. The kids receive local junior club t shirts and staff assist linking those kids into the community football pathway. We can't wait to expand these programs next season with the introduction of our Community Development Officer in 2017.

School Football Programs

In 2016 we saw many new school initiatives and solid gains across the board. We continued to expand on programs such as Bulldogs Kids at Cannington Community College, Diversity Umpiring and Coaching at Clontarf Aboriginal College and Yule Brook College, Introducing the inaugural Bachar Houli WA Academy at Australian Islamic College Kewdale, continued support of the Learn AFL programs at Cloverdale Education Support Centre and the brand new SEPEP Coaching and Umpiring Program at Aquinas College with Brendan Chapman. We introduced the inaugural WAFC Champions league which served as a preseason round robin, pitting PSA Schools Vs State Schools Vs Community Clubs. With some new rules added in to make the game fun and unique. Teams of 16, Power Plays and Super goals were some of the great new additions that allowed all of our major markets (Schools vs Clubs) to face off against each other, head to head. The Dockers Cup Metro Central Youth Girls League grew by a further 3 teams thanks to the impact of the new AFL Women's League and we expect these numbers to climb even higher in 2017. We also ran 3 junior girls Dockers Cups throughout the region in 2016 with close to 40 teams in total. The district continued its partnership with Central TAFE and worked closely with their students completing a Diploma in Sport Development. Consequently, students were then provided with a practical experience and delivered many school based programs within Demons District schools. We also founded a new partnership with UWA Sports Science students who helped assist and deliver community based and school programs this year. To all our casual helpers – Lennon Marlin, Cody Leggett, Sam McGillivray, Chris Lloyd, Tayla Clark, Dan Maree, Daniel Rechichi and Jayde Hardstaff you have been sensational all year, thank you for your hard work. A key highlight of our school programs is the fantastic School Ambassadors who work tirelessly throughout the year to promote football. Five of our teachers were finalists for the 2016 Ambassador of the Year Awards. These included our District Ambassador of the year Simon Nimmo (Yule Brook College), Rob Thomson (Clontarf Aboriginal College), Brendan Chapman (Aquinas College), Nuria Ushoroff (Australian Islamic College Kewdale) and Vicki Bramwell-Keys (Cannington Community College). Simon took out the award for "Best Indigenous Program 2016" and we congratulate him for all his dedication and hard work. Finally, to our thousands of students within the 81 schools that reside in the boundaries of the Perth District, thanks for having a kick with us this year!

Junior Competition Council

The Junior Competition Council drives our junior competition and is one of the most important parts of our district. The team, led by Justin Sambell as Competition Director, has had a tough but successful year and one that came with many challenges - including the expansion of Central Conference play to Year 8. The support given to Justin has been superb, and that also includes Maree Power and Joanne Warner. The competition is the lifeblood of our district, and without a viable competition it makes it difficult to direct participants to it. Strong administration, strong support of umpires, continual education of coaches and parents to the appropriate behaviours and an even competition are paramount to the sustainability of junior footy. I would like to acknowledge the work of the DDFUA (umpire's association) and in particular Daniel Gibbons and Scott Thompson for providing our competition with excellent umpires week in week out. Without umpires the competition doesn't happen, and we are not lost to that. The Year 7 football program expanded to Year 6s as well in 2016. Between the 2 groups we had upwards of 50 talented young footballers looking to further develop their skills at a high performance level.



With specialised training from district staff and the West Coast Eagles Football Club, the 2 programs culminated with a round robin competition in the school holidays vs East Perth and Swans Districts. We wish the Year 7 boys all the best as they move into Development Squads next season, and we can't wait to continue working with the Year 6's to further improve their skills in 2017. Finally, the Girls Competition moved to a standalone timeslot on Friday nights up at Noranda. Run by WAFC staff the Junior Girls comp saw the addition of Redcliffe and Gosnells on top of established clubs Queens Park and Thornlie, while the inaugural U15's Youth Girls comp saw Queens Park and Gosnells each enter a team into the Central Conference. The Junior Girls is a modified format while the Youth Girls play for points. Midvale JFC took out the very first flag in a tightly contested Grand Final at Steel Blue Oval. We can't wait to further expand on the female competition again next season.

Coach Education

Coach education continues to be a huge priority for the district as it strives to improve the overall standard of coaching. The District and Perth Football Club came together in late 2015 and launched the inaugural Demons Coach Academy. Myself, Scott Faulkner, Trevor Williams and Peter Brear put together a 6 session academy program for 10 Junior Coaches looking to further develop as a coach. From visits and sessions with Earl Spalding, Andrew Ruck and Andrew Panetta, to film review sessions with the development team, and sports science work with Brock Fleay, all coaches graduated with flying colours, many landing assistant roles with the Development Squads. We can't wait to expand on this program again in 2017. Peter and I also visited 10 of the 12 clubs for the annual coaching roadshows, expanded from 3 sessions in 2015. By spending a full training session at individual clubs, we are able to hands on train and up skill our community coaches which not only helps them, but the kids coming through the pathway as well.

Senior Community

Another successful year for our senior clubs. Congratulations to Trinity Aquinas AFC for winning their first ever A Grade Amateurs flag. Also to Maddington for winning the C1 Premiership and Thornlie for taking out the C2 flag. We look forward to working closely with our Senior Clubs again in 2017.

2017 and beyond.....

Firstly, we say goodbye and thank you to Justin Sambell, who is stepping down as Competition Director. It is a very challenging and time consuming job and we appreciate all the work and hours you have put in over the past 2 seasons. We wish him all the best. We welcomed in Susan Chuot this year as the WAFC Metro Central Community Engagement Officer. Susie has been a great addition to our team and we would also like to recognise her efforts on being drafted by the Fremantle Dockers in the inaugural AFL Women's League. We are pleased to announce a new Community Development Officer will join the team on a part time role in the coming months with a big focus on club transition going forward. This position will be a huge asset for the district.

On the programs front we look to expand further on the Footy Fundamentals program, Auskick, Demons Kids and the Bakari Redlegs Multicultural program. We will continue to be innovative, which is one of our main pillars in the WAFC Metro Central region, and under the guidance of CDM Isaac Stewart and DOM Scott Faulkner work hard on developing new and exciting participation and competition programs within the zone. We will continue to work with our 12 junior clubs to make sure their future is strong and participation continues to grow. Our most exciting space for 2017 will be female football. With the market growing at such a rapid rate and with the launch of the AFL Women's League, it stands to be a huge area of emphasis moving forward. Finally, we are very excited about the new Demons facility currently being built at Lathlain Park. As the new ovals edge closer to competition every day, we can't wait to utilize them both by having a space to bring and showcase the community back into our centre of excellence at Lathlain on a more regular basis.

Finally, on behalf of the West Australian Football Commission and the Demons District, I would like to make a special acknowledgement to Perth FC President Vince Pental. Vince was an outstanding man who lived and breathed the Perth FC and supported our work in the district very strongly. We will all miss seeing his happy face around the club every day but his legacy will live on forever within the walls of our new facility, which wouldn't have been possible without him. While 2016 was a great year for us it's just another stepping stone in the process, and like the mighty red legs we will continue to improve on these results above and beyond in 2017. PETER KENNEDY

JACK ENSOR: FOOTBALL COACH AND EDUCATOR
BORN: GERALDTON 9 FEBRUARY 1928
DIED: PERTH 25 MAY 2016

Jack Ensor, the football Coach and Physical Education Teacher who died in May aged 88, was never known to blow his own trumpet. But his natural modesty underscored a formidable record of success.

It was a record which came as a total surprise to his new neighbour in Shelley, back in 1987.

Bob Cronin had quit the editorship of the mass circulation Melbourne Sun newspaper to take control of Robert Holmes a'Court's Perth weekly, the Western Mail, which the entrepreneur was using as a stalking horse in his ultimately successful strategy to acquire The West Australian.

Cronin, who is now The West's editor-in-chief, was living in Shelley waiting for his family to arrive from Melbourne, and found his neighbour to be welcoming and generous. So he invited him to a lunch organised by the Carbine Club, which has strong sporting links.

When the members were asked to introduce their guests, Cronin stood and said: "My guest is my neighbour, Jack Ensor." What happened next astonished him.

"All the members rose to their feet and started applauding. I had no idea Jack had a sporting background, let alone such a formidable record as a football Coach. He hadn't said anything about it."

Jack Ensor had a very formidable coaching record indeed. He initially played for Perth's seconds at the WACA ground in 1948. But his leadership skills started to emerge when, as Captain-Coach, he led South Perth to an A grade amateur Premiership in the early 1950s.

He also played a key role in the formation of Perth's junior council in 1952, and became the council's Director of umpiring the following year. He cajoled many former league players, including star full forward Ron Tucker, to take up umpiring, much to the delight of the youngsters.

When the WANFL launched an underage thirds competition in 1957, Perth invited Ensor to coach the club's inaugural team. It was a smart move. He took his players to six premierships over the next nine years, helping lay the groundwork for the most successful era in the club's history.

After rugged defender Malcolm Atwell was lured from East Perth as Captain-Coach of Perth's league team for the 1966 season, Ensor was appointed his assistant. It was a winning combination.

With champion rover Barry Cable promoted to Vice-Captain, Perth swept all before them with three successive Premierships. The trio proved to be the most formidable leadership team in the WA competition.

While Atwell was immersed in the on-field action, it was Ensor observing from the sidelines who was able to give the Coach strategic feedback which proved so crucial to the club's success.

"It was a pleasure to work with you (Ensor) during our premiership years 1966 to 1968," Atwell said in a tribute in The West. "We were a good team and you made a large contribution towards our success. I have always treasured your friendship and loyalty."

And many of Ensor's proteges from the thirds were part of that success. They included Frank Pyke (father of Adelaide Crows coach and former Eagle, Don Pyke), Sandover Medallists Pat Dalton and Ian Miller, Pat Astone, Greg Brehaut, Ray Lawrence, Graham Jenzen, Ross Millson, Ray Mills, Bob Shields, Greg Bennett and Graham Ramshaw.

Former Perth player Allan Stiles told more than 200 mourners at Ensor's funeral that he was eloquent, articulate, and a great communicator. But he could also be tough, asking his players to do nothing more than he could do himself.

Naturally Ensor was keen to try out as Senior Coach, but his opportunities at Perth were limited. He was snapped up when a vacancy occurred at Swan Districts, and took the club into two preliminary finals. In 1976 he was appointed Director of Coaching at Subiaco.

He also had stints as a panellist on Channel 7's popular Sunday morning program, the World of Football, and as a commentator on 6PR.

In addition Ensor was guiding the careers - both in football and the wider world - of thousands of teenagers through the State Schoolboys teams. He was a selector from 1960 to 1996, as well as being the Coach for ten years. John Francis Ensor was born in Geraldton to Eugene - a World War 1 veteran and schoolteacher - and Eileen in 1928. He was the second of seven children and enrolled at the Claremont Teachers College after his Leaving Certificate year at Aquinas College.

Following National Service training in the psychology corps in Melbourne, he took up a teaching appointment at the Kalgoorlie Central School. Later he helped establish the Duke of Edinburgh Award program in WA before taking up the first of several high school appointments in 1981.

Ensor married physical education teacher Eleanor Richardson in 1963. They had three sons Rhys, Shaun and Brett, and have five grandchildren. But the marriage did not last, and he did not remarry.

He served on the Australian Press Council for nine years, and was a life member of the Perth Football Club, the WA Football Commission, School Sport Australia and School Sport WA. He was also an inaugural inductee last year in Perth's Hall of Fame.

Ensor remained an active member of the club's nominations committee, recommending honours for players and members. His last visit to Perth's home ground at Lathlain Park was in April for a reunion of the 1960s premiership teams.
