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## Have your say on the future of the PFL!

Since commencing in this role, I have received a large amount of feedback, ideas and potential solutions to problems all with varying degrees of relevance. Now is the time to bring all of those ideas and feedback to a one stop shop which will help shape the future of the PFL.

In a slight deviation from previous years whereby normally by now you would have attended a mid-year Presidents forum/meeting, this year the meeting will be broken down into four club workshops broken down broadly by geographic location.

These workshops are each clubs opportunity to provide input into the shaping of the competition going forward. As a precursor to these workshops, a survey that has been built based largely of feedback that has been received to date will be sent in advance to these workshops. The responses to these surveys will help set the tone for the workshops.

Once the workshops are completed, based on the data collated from both the surveys and the workshops, a range of recommendations will be made. These recommendations will be presented back to you at the end of year presidents forum for further discussion.

Finally, after considering all feedback, the confirmed changes whether it be to By-Laws or other mediums will be communicated to all clubs prior to the commencement of next season. These changes will have had direct input from you, the clubs.

An external facilitator will guide you through the workshops which will work through the following themes:

1. Integrity of the Competition
2. Competition Structure
3. Club Development
4. Umpiring
5. Sustainable Growth of the Competition
