- Bendigo Bank NAIDOC Round and support of WestAuz Mining for the special jumpers worn on the day.
- Members Appreciation Round v Claremont went over a treat with our members – thanks for all the great feedback.

KEY CLUB STRATEGY

In last year's annual report, I wrote that the future for us means we must address all the following key issues during 2024 and beyond. We have made strong progress to deliver all.

- The Des Penman Reserve helps achieve the goal of co-location of talent and our women's programs. Installation of floodlights and a partnership with the WAFC and City of Stirling to deliver a Northeast Engagement Strategy to reinvigorate football in that area are vital objectives. This is largely achieved with floodlights being installed this summer and a long-term building lease agreed.
- The Leederville Oval Master Plan with EP and the City of Vincent is now on the table for discussion after the delivery of Stage 1 & 2 below. Stage 3 remains a key club strategy.
- Sullivan Logistics Stadium upgrades to the oval surface and surrounds and LED 1000 lux floodlights are being installed as I write this from my office. Its very exciting and a game changer for the club.
- Fan engagement and game day experiences to continue to grow our support base.
- SFC facility improvements at Leederville Oval have included a sauna for our players, and Mick Hoskins is working through the extended members deck to link with members grandstand area, continue to open up the bar/function room.
- Goldfields football, SFC's vision is to expand our football academy to assist local volunteers & football in the region, to better integrate participation programs and support coaching and GFL clubs.
- The only real miss so far, is the Lions Foundation growth and funding sources and then an ongoing strong link and benefit stream for the SFC then incorporating a strong community engagement activation. The SFC Board has this in their sights for 2025.

SFC OPERATIONS

Our club operates on a very small staff of just 7 full-time people that are supported by part-time and volunteer resources that do an excellent job.

Dicko, Stuart and Stef are our football department and as a group lead our coaches, a whole range of volunteers and medical staff to deliver outstanding programs and support the playing groups.

Joe Georgiades is our Commercial Manager and responsible to drive our key revenues of sponsorship, events and AFL Hospitality. Mia Contessi was appointed as the Marketing Co-Ordinator during the season to assist Joe in driving growth in membership, game day attendance and audiences. This will be through social media and other communication channels with a high priority to continue communication with members and supporters.

Karen South manages our financial area with support from Board member Luka Zivkovic and well done to both. Karen's a great team player and adds value to the club supporting games days, admission gates, functions and whatever else is needed.

BAR & FUNCTIONS

Well done also to Mack Sheppard, Pauli and the rest of the hospitality team. They do a wonderful job on game days as is recognised by the membership of the club. To again achieve the budgeted bar turnover is a credit to the Weapon or profit center as Mack is also known!

Some of the notable functions and events included the AFL W Derby in October with an over 6000 crowd in attendance and the Con Regan Memorial Game that supports Police Legacy. Add a number of quiz nights, fundraisers, celebrations and meeting means our facility is well used.

- The jumper is a symbolic representation of the stories that our Indigenous players were creating in their time at the Club.
- The major theme of the design was that the Club was about "Community" and "Family" as represented by the large circle in the middle of the jumper.
- Petal type symbols around this circle show the other WAFL Clubs as part of a broader football community / family.
- The vertical lines represent the players journey to the club.
- The bottom of the jumper represents the "Mia Mia" which is the players homes from where they started their journey.
- Stars represent all players for applying themselves to achieving their goals in their time at the Club.

Well done to all involved in creating an amazing jumper that our players were excited to wear, and the club was proud to support.

This commitment to improvement is what made 2024 a successful season and will drive the future of the club.

Colts

Success at the colts level is defined by the preparedness of players to step up into senior football. Driven by the coaching team of John Mansbridge, Tom Lowndes, Dave Hay, and Steve Gough, this year’s graduating group is ready for the challenge and should form an exciting youthful team in 2025, with last year’s colts graduates performing well across the board in reserves and league.

Back at Des Penman for preseason, the group was able to build a strong foundation for the 2024 season. The club is excited to permanently move the Talent and Women’s programs to the reserve in 2025, with the addition of new floodlighting and access to educational facilities as we grow our presence in the area.

Although the season was disappointing in terms of not making it to the grand final, it was still a success, finishing 3rd on the ladder. The team had 4 players in the State 18s Academy and 4 in the colts team of the year, including coach John Mansbridge. Well done to those players, and good luck with what comes next.

We welcomed some new additions to our rehab team, with Cayden Baker and Ben Gregson joining his team of trainers to strengthen our S&C group. However, we must say goodbye to Tom Lowndes as he moves up to coach in the senior ranks. Well done and best of luck, Tom—you will be missed.

Futures and Development Squads

The future continues to look bright, with our youth programs competing well across the three squads. Led by new head coach John Simmons, the Futures exceeded expectations in the new format 9-game season. Our main squad of 27 Perth-based boys had the opportunity to play at least 4 games, and the group stayed competitive, featuring 3 under-agers, 12 regional players, and 14 over-agers, finishing with 8 wins out of 9 games.

John, along with assistant coaches Mark Sandwell, Ant Detata, Lachie Davis, and Dave Durham, did well to hone the craft of the group, preparing them for colts in 2025. Out of this talented group, 10 were invited to continue training with the Colts, and 5 were invited to the state Academy—well done to Angus, Ant, Corbin, Harry, and Thatcher.

Linking our 15s program into Futures proved to be a successful strategy for the 2023/2024 season as we look to replicate this success moving forward. Experienced talent coach John Simmons ran the 15s Development Program, which provided a professionally run format and familiarized the boys transitioning into Futures for the 2025 season. Joining him were Corey Dullard, Dave Durham, Josh Merrett, and



Brad Hearn, who played a key role in strengthening a group that struggled in 2023 but became much more competitive in games against West Perth, Claremont, and Swans.

We were fortunate to have League player Kyron Hayden back on board to run the 14s Development Program again for 2024. This group is full of superstars, both based in Perth and regionally, and will be one to watch for the future. The program was run professionally and supported by boys in our pathway through seniors and colts, with Tyler Senge, Dylan Cordier, Hayden Windsor, and Av Drewett donning their coaching clipboards.

Regional Football – Goldfields Football League and Esperance District Football Association

The link between our regional zone and the pathway for talented players to have opportunities at WAFL level has continued to strengthen throughout 2024. This is a testament to the strength of competition in the GFL and EDFA, as well as the hard work of league administrators, clubs, and volunteers in Kalgoorlie and Esperance. Congratulations to the new Chair, Eshe Christie, on the season; it’s great to see footy in Kalgoorlie flourish under your leadership. Congratulations also to Stu Tholstrup for another successful season and on your life membership to the EDFA, and to Kate Ainsworth for all the behind-the-scenes work.

Our Lions Pride academies continue to strengthen, with Kal Williams in Esperance and the outgoing, sorely missed Rhett Forster in Kalgoorlie. The numbers and quality of the programs are growing, as evidenced by performances in the Great Southern Colts Carnival and the preparedness of regional players in our talent programs. This season, we had 12 regional-based players, 9 who relocated to Perth who played colts games, 11 Futures players, and 19 development squad players coming from the regional zones. One of the biggest events for Subiaco FC in the regional zone was the Zone Carnival, which was a great success. The games were competitive and topped off with a training session with the Youth Girls, with Rogers coaches Dane Edwards and Brad Haseldine. The club hosted a Members Match Day pregame function for the final home game of 2024, which was a great initiative and greatly attended so is something we will look to do more of next season.

The Home Collective partnership helped provide free memberships to all Little League players who represented the club from our junior districts including a providing them Lion's giftbag.

We again ran our Player Sponsorship Program this year with all Men's, Women's, Colts and Rogers Cup players asked to find a local business to sponsor them. This year 129 businesses supported one of our players and their support was greatly appreciated by the players as it covers a number of their costs such as uniform, insurance, best and fairest ticket and membership. 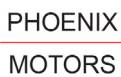

New Life Members

Wayne Loxley

Wayne made a significant impact at Subiaco with 19 Senior games and many Reserves and Colts appearances throughout the 1970s. In 1978, he took home the Reserves Best and Fairest award. Later, he coached the Reserves team for six seasons while doubling as the League Assistant Coach from 1986 to 1989. Wayne's dedication didn't stop there—he served as the club's second-ever Football Manager from 1989 to 1996, followed by two seasons on the Subiaco Board from 1997 to 1998.

Aaron Heal

Aaron wrapped up his Subiaco career in 2023 with 160 League games and 30 Reserves games, securing his Life Member status. Joining the club in 2014, he was soon regarded as one of WAFL's top key backs. Aaron represented WA in two state games (2016 and 2018) and was a crucial part of Subiaco's 2015, 2018, 2019, and 2021 Premiership victories. His automatic qualification makes him a natural fit for the Life Members List.

Lachlan Delahunty

Della joined Subiaco from Victoria in 2014 and became a cornerstone of the team. Over 141 games, he won four Premierships, earned the Sandover Medal in 2019, and represented WA four times. Though he retired in 2022 just nine games short of automatic Life Member status, his contribution was undeniable, making him a well-deserved addition to the Life Members List.



Mike Fitzpatrick

Mike's legacy at Subiaco includes 97 games between 1970 and 1974, a grand final win over West Perth in 1973, and two Outridge Medals. After leaving Subiaco, he played 150 games for Carlton, where he won three Premierships and captained the team for two. He also claimed Carlton's Best and Fairest award in 1979 – much of this was achieved while studying at Oxford as the 1975 WA Rhodes Scholar. Later, Mike served a decade-long term as AFL Chairman starting in 2007. Honoured in both Subiaco and Carlton's Teams of the Century (captain for Subiaco), he was inducted into the WA Football Hall of Fame in 2004.

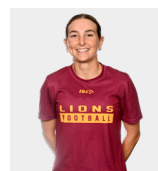

Remembering Club Legend Basil Fuller

On March 22nd we lost club legend, Basil Fuller, just one week shy of his 88th birthday.

Basil had been involved at Subi since 1961. Loved by everyone involved with the club, he continued to volunteer at the Lions until his dying days.

Our thoughts remain with his wife Jennifer and the Fuller Family who have supported the club through thick and thin.

Basil was a legend of the Subiaco Football Club, he was an office holder for nearly 60 years and was the first paid employee of the club in 1966 as the Club Secretary, promoted from his 5 years already on the committee.

Although he left club employment in the late 70's, he maintained an unbroken link around the club until he rejoined the committee in 1987 and served as a Director and Vice President until his death. Basil was awarded Life Membership, was an Inaugural SFC Diehard, awarded Life Membership of both the WAFL and WAFC, and was awarded an Order of Australia Medal for Services to Sport.

He came to the club every day, cheerful and with unwavering support for anything Subiaco. He loved the Club and his passing leaves a massive void that can never be filled.

We remember his tireless work, his leadership organising countless raffles and club events and his humour, he was the face of the club for many members and supporters.

Put simply, Basil Fuller made a greater contribution over a longer time than anyone else – well played Basil.

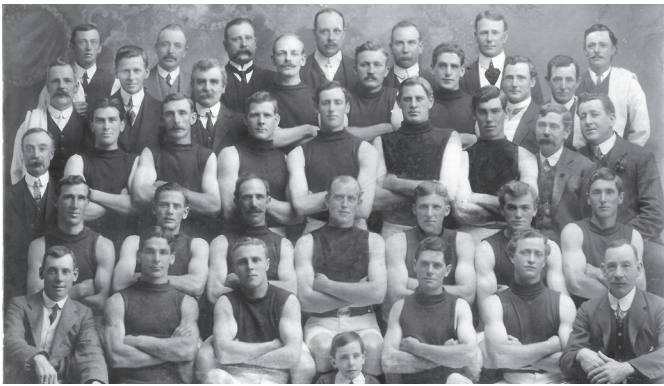

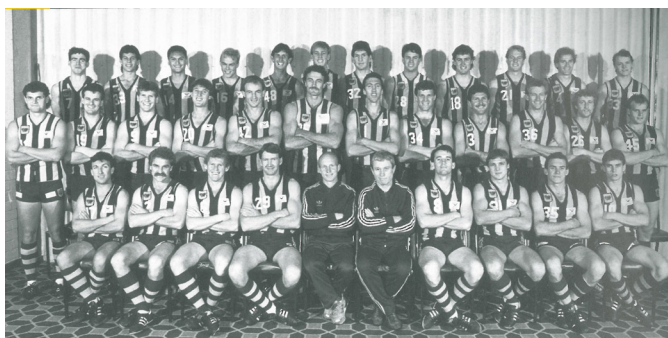
