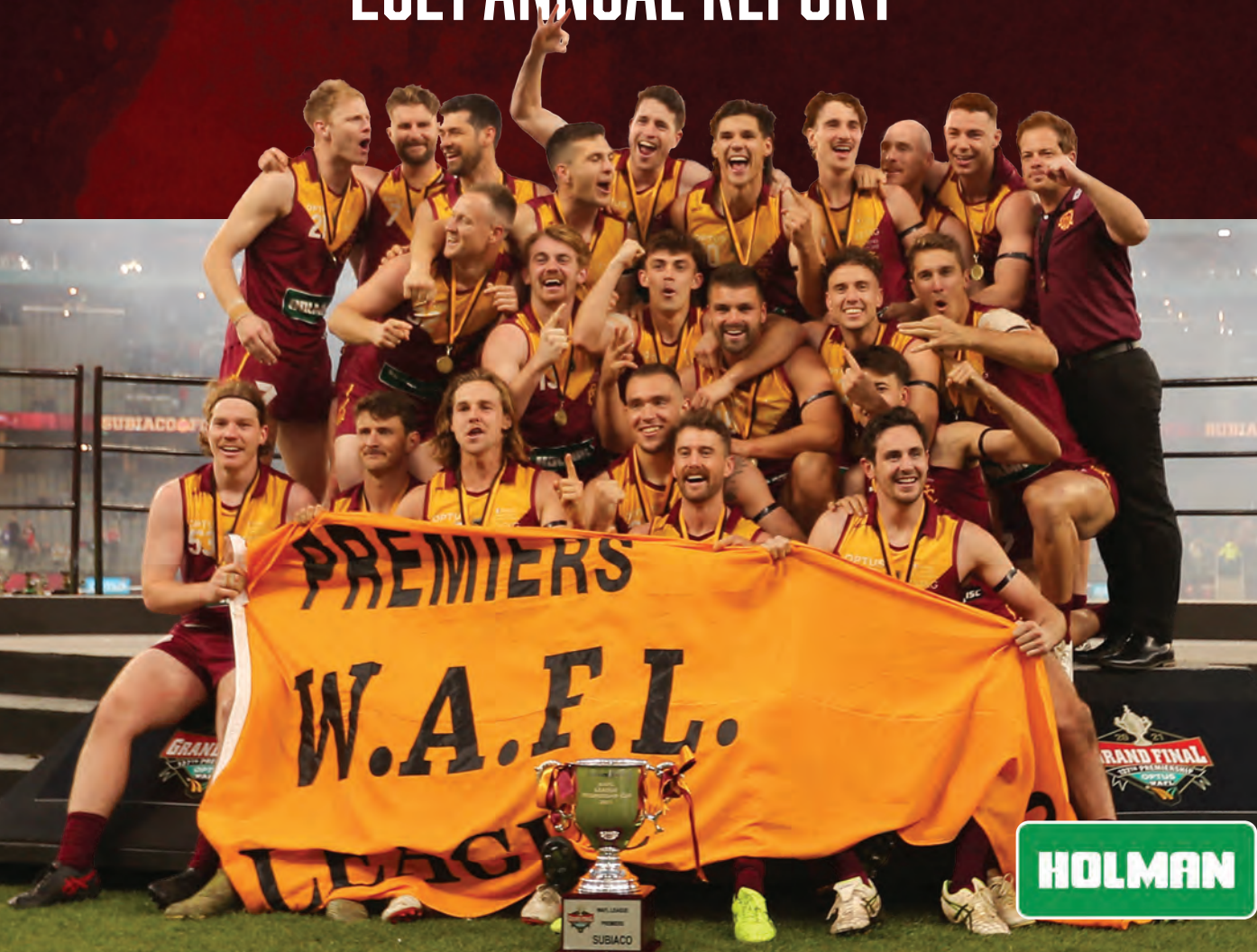

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

On behalf of the Board of Directors, I have great pleasure in presenting my 10th report as President to the members of this great Club.

What a rollercoaster we have been on over the last two years. After the magnificent premiership in 2019 the WAFC imposed recruiting and other restrictions designed to drag us back to the field. Did it work? In the COVID impacted eight game season "lightning carnival" of 2020 it was hard to tell, however clearly our players, coaches, staff, board, and supporters all felt badly disrespected after 2019 and that distraction was felt widely through the Club.

Bring on 2021, and we again faced similar points and recruiting rules to the other top teams; we entered the year in the race for the premiership along with 2020 premiers South Fremantle, 2020 grand finalists Claremont and annual contender West Perth.

It was a great WAFL season, there were a number of upsets, the top-five teams regularly beat each other and to show the evenness of the competition, the eventual premiers lost to bottom team West Coast (even if they had Luke Shuey and number of other useful mates that game) lost some form in the last three rounds being thumped by the 6th placed finisher by 44 points and then just fell over the line in our last game against lowly Peel Thunder to just hold on to the Minor Premiership.

From that shaky season finish, Beau and senior group took all before them. The Reserves were magnificent and must take some kudos for making everyone believe again, taking the Club and entire senior group to new competitive heights that drove the group to the 16th Premiership in our 125th anniversary year.

COVID did impact the competition, and everyone involved with it – business and the community faced challenges or business boomed. The second season to be disrupted meant plans changed regularly and opportunities had to be grabbed as they presented.

One of those opportunities was grabbed at an all of football meeting in July. The meeting was called to understand the risks with playing a full season and an extended grand final date or to play less games and hold the season's decider as early as possible. In what was a great outcome, the majority agreed (with us) that the AFL uncertainty provided WA football a unique opportunity to hold the public's attention over the WAFL finals series.

How good was the WA football festival that delivered AFL finals and the AFL Grand final in Perth and then fantastic interest in the lead up to the WAFL grand final and excellent crowd of nearly 30,000 that day. Well done to the WAFC, Wayne Martin, Scott Baker and the rest of the team.

John Townsend's article on October 4th "Subiaco Culture A Thing of Beauty" is an excellent commentary on our success and the work we all do the keep driving the Club to success. Well done John for your support of the WAFL, that article has been included in this annual report on page 43 in full and I commend it to you to read.

Every year we must improve our Club to stay the benchmark, bringing in coaches, developing players and making sure all our people love being here and that makes Subi better. After a hiccup in 2020, the recovery to play both senior teams in a grand final and to win again is a great reflection on everyone here.

We have only won sixteen (16) premierships in our one hundred and twenty-five years of existence, think about that! To win five in the last eight years, seven grand finals in that time just reinforces this era as our most successful in history.

Our coaching group led by Beau Wardman have been very impressive again, Chayce Creedy continues to be pivotal developing young players as have several others. I have no doubt that Beau is the right man to continue to drive results at the Lions, well done Beau!



ONGOING SUSTAINABILITY OF THE CLUB

After several years post Subiaco Oval straining our finances, the last two years have been important in reversing that trend and setting us up for a very positive future. Plenty still needs to be done, our plans are to continually look for new opportunities and non-football income streams and my thanks to our team of Peter Capes, Zac Acott and others for making that possible.

We still need your help, be ambassadors for the Club, grab a chance to involve others please get the message to your business contacts, get people to join as members and grow the Subiaco family.

To Wally Edwards and Holman Industries thanks for your support as our principal partner and we are excited at the three-year extension recently announced. Likewise, to Nick Catania and Bendigo North Perth Community Bank our community partners thanks for your support.

Our coterie groups - The Golds, thanks Ross Lockhart and Gary and the PP&S committee.

CEO REPORT

This season was once again a challenging one for nearly all Clubs, players and the WAFC given the uncertainty created by ongoing reports of COVID outbreaks, lockdowns, reduced capacity & cancellations. Quick decision making and the ability to move and amend plans was vital to survive. I'm pleased to report that our people were able to navigate what was thrown at them and to not only survive but prosper, resulting in our

16th League premiership.

I think we all know that this success cannot continue. Winning five league premierships in the last eight years is unprecedented in the history of the WAFL when combined with two Colts flags and Reserves teams getting into finals most years and winning two flags as well. I hope all our Subi people recognise how magnificent this era has been, applaud the success and lap it all up.

Rules to equalise the competition as well as other Clubs hunting us and doing whatever they can to topple our dominance will eventually take a toll. However, we will continue to innovate, work harder for longer and take nothing for granted as we strive for more and more success.

125TH YEAR CELEBRATIONS

Established in 1896, the Club has deep history and roots within WA football and is one of the most recognisable brands/ Clubs in WA.

A special logo was created that featured a shield surrounded by 15 laurel leaves on each side of the crest to represent the 15 premierships achieved in those 125 years. The logo appeared on all our playing jumpers, uniforms & merchandise was very popular with members and has been widely supported – thanks to everyone for that. Incidentally, Basil has been here to see nearly all those victories.

The season's launch unveiled the special jumper created for the game that listed every premiership player in those 15 victories and was a great way to celebrate and start the year.

GREAT CALL

For the second season, fixtures have been cancelled and rescheduled due to state government virus scare lockdowns.

The WAFL Clubs and WAFC made some really good decisions in late July. The options presented were to cut and run with an early season finish or play all games and extend the season. Everyone understood the risks facing us, but the majority supported a full season and moving the WAFL GF to the week after the AFL GF.

A gutsy move in the face of obvious risks, however it was a master stroke and enabled us to take advantage of the footy buzz of what then became the WA Football Festival, that included an AFL preliminary final and then better still the AFL Grand Final. Well led by the WAFC.

SFC OPERATIONS

Every one of our departments in the Club have either met or performed better than their budgeted outcome and I would like to thank everyone for their contribution, they have done a great job.

Particular thanks to Zac Acott who has driven our AFL hospitality and Club sponsorship to new levels. He also delivers our high priority communication with members and supporters, the website, Lions eNews, and social media channels that provide up to date information and stories about the people within the Club.

Debbie King who has been a very important cog in our small team for 20 years has called time on her career at the Lions and will retire unfortunately. I cannot thank Debbie enough for her dedication to the role but probably more importantly, for the additional game day involvement, willingness to help others and always a Club first attitude and support of the members. I know she has been nominated as a prospective life member; I hope that is awarded because I cannot think of someone more deserving. Well done Deb.

Well done also to Mack Sheppard. The 'Weapon' is all business, and he has bought in new business, several new events and functions that have boosted our turnover in bar and functions. He leads a very good hospitality team including long time staff in Paul and Susie.

Rounding out our key staff is Brodie Riach, our very good district officer who unfortunately has taken another role outside football, and Teigan who continues to look after our membership and merchandise areas well.

We are determined to be a one Club model by next year. Our WAFL Women are already an important part of our Club, and they will be a positive part of our future. There will be many benefits from a much closer relationship so let's get on with that.

SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

Some of the game day and event highlights during the year included;

- Good Friday season launch and special 125th Playing Jumper.
- Junior members packs for the first 1000 junior registrations in our district – thanks to the WAFC and KC Australia
- A rescheduled Diehards Function where Kevan Sparks, Jarrad Schofield, John Martin, Darren Rumble and President Mark Lawrence were inducted into the Hall of Fame.
- Life Members Ben Randall and Rodney 'Rocket' Reynolds were also inducted.
- NAIDOC round events including the special Kevin Bynder/ Des Headland designed jumpers.
- The sold out WAFL Pre-game Grand Final function was fantastic, featuring MC Tim Gossage and speakers Justin Langer, Matt Priddis, Marc Webb and Beau Wardman
- The WAFL Grand Final played at Optus Stadium, after a COVID interruption, and with the biggest crowd (29,879) since EP beat WP in 2002.



KEY CLUB STRATEGY

Strategies change and must address our most significant challenges. The future for us means we must address all the following key issues during next year and beyond.

- Leederville Oval Master Plan with EP and the City of Vincent
- Hopefully by the time this is published, a grant of \$1.3M for new floodlights at Leederville has been announced.
- Lions Foundation growth and funding sources and then an ongoing strong link and benefit stream for the SFC then incorporating a strong community engagement activation.
- A “One Club” model for the Subiaco men’s and women’s teams and a center of excellence to house both programs.
- Fan engagement and game day experiences to continue to grow our support base.

FOOTBALL OPERATIONS

The core function of our Club is football, the staff, coaches, and players that continue to set high goals, challenge each other, and never take things for granted.

Our list management remains critical given our Club direction to develop our players promoted from successful Colts and Reserves pathways. Its very pleasing to have a number of new faces in the premiership team however when we look at the next group coming through, we should be excited by that as well. I cannot pass without congratulating Chad Harris on his year and the energy and enthusiasm he brings to the group. With COVID and some other issues he may have never made it here but Chad we are pleased you did.

We hope to have minimal player retirements from this year, however targeted recruiting by our now dynamic team of Dicko and Beau will drive us to more success in 2022.

TALENT & DEVELOPMENT PATHWAY

Chayce Creedy continues to be a benchmark talent coach developing our young players. With the addition of Stuart Berryman this season, both men showed they have a bright future that will provide our senior program with a flow of quality players in the coming years.

LIONS IN THE COMMUNITY

ENGAGEMENT & SOCIAL INCLUSION PROGRAMS

- Prostate Cancer group PROST – the ninth year this fitness program has been run in our gym for those men battling prostate cancer. The program assists over 30 men a week.
- The Club joined in the 45 Sit Up Challenge which was about the 45 Men diagnosed with prostate cancer every day.
- Mental Health Mixed Charity fundraiser game on 16th October
- Basil’s Community Raffle – provides over \$25,000 to participating junior football women’s football and netball Clubs.
- Wheelchair AFL team in the inaugural WAWheelchair Football League (WAWFL). Proudly supporting inclusion.
- Country coaching and development – the Goldfields is important and thanks to both Kristian and Stuart for their regular links and support of our country areas to develop young players.
- Home game day events have been improved and again welcome Junior Clubs, kids’ zones, activations, little league games and the Kevin Hill experience. Except Hilly had a year off and we missed him– next year then Hilly!!

We must be more relevant to our community, and this is a major focus area for the Club and under Director Kristi Annear. The Lions Foundation will be the start of some very important community initiatives and be a great step forward for our Club.

RESERVES COACH REPORT

Our 2021 Development season was challenging, not only for the players but also the coaches. We were a much younger and inexperienced team than last season, in fact, we were the youngest reserves team in the WAFL.

We played 56 players overall this season, including 16 current or graduated Colts. I was very impressed with the maturity and eagerness of many of these boys

who really embraced the challenge of the big step-up into a senior program. Connor Patterson was selected into our future leader's program during pre-season and was captain of our team for a few games in the first half of the year, a huge achievement for his first season as a development player. We also had 11 players play their first game for the Club. The strong approach towards development from Beau Wardman will set the Club up perfectly in 2022.

The challenge for the coaches was to bring this young group together and build an environment that was filled with respect and care for each other as well as passion and commitment for the game. At the beginning of the year, we spoke as a group about how we can make their teammates better. I believe it took the boys about half the season to buy into this mindset and when we did; the whole team got better, and they started to play for each other rather than for themselves. This showed on the field winning the last three games of the season with the highlight beating Peel in the last game of the home-and-away season by 133 points and just missing out on finishing third on the ladder by 1.2%, finishing 9-7 win-loss record, a huge result for such a young group. Playing finals didn't seem possible at the mid-season bye, with many personnel changes, but to the players credit and willingness to learn, we set ourselves some challenges and playing finals was a box we wanted to tick.

Nick Menegola did a great job captaining for the first half of the year but sadly suffered a season-ending knee injury, the captaincy was then handed over to McKenzie Lawrence for the remainder of the season; Macca led the team with energy and did an outstanding job.



We won the first final against West Perth and you could see a change in body language. With confidence growing, the belief grew stronger and that if they all played their role anything was possible. Swan Districts was our next opponent to defeat in the first Semi-Final, and we did just that by 24 points. Matthew Johnson and Corey Robinson took control of the midfield with Jack Beverley showing his usual hardness with nine tackles.

Playing Claremont in a Preliminary final was a daunting task. Claremont had only lost one game during the home-and-away season and beat us comfortably twice throughout the year. This was the best game we played all season, kicking against the breeze and down by 14 points the boys responded in the last quarter. We isolated Aaron Breman deep forward and asked Lewis Putt our young ruckman to get us going. Putty got on top in the ruck, our mids got some clean ball and Aaron Breman kicked the first two goals of the final quarter. We won by eight points and earned a spot in the Grand Final, what an achievement! I cannot thank the senior players who supported the boys from behind the goals and I truly believe you played a massive part of this victory.

In a year where our young development group showed a lot of fight and resilience, we just fell short on the biggest game of the year against a very strong opponent Perth. After the raw emotion of the result and reflecting on the playing year, we made some major steps forward in a year where we had to overcome significant hurdles.

I could not be prouder of the Development group and they have made me very happy with the final outcome during my first season as Head Coach. Galen Savigni had a tremendous season in winning our fairest and best award in his first season coming up from the Colts, his composure and decision making is remarkable.

A huge thanks to my three assistants, Jamie Battigelli (Backs), Daniel Vidovich (Mids) and Brent McPherson (Fwds) for your great work and help through the season. Having such a great support network in the box makes game day much easier.

Thanks to Steve Lind (Manager), Jason O'Malley (Runner), Chaddy (Rotations), Jemma and Maddie (Medical), Kelly Properjohn for keeping the coaches calm, and Dicko (our hard-working Footy Manager).

To the players for your commitment each week to the program and for believing in me to help get the best result we possibly could.

Finally, I thank Beau Wardman on his support and mentorship. His valuable feedback and advice will continue to help me develop as a coach.



WOMEN'S REPORT

After an interrupted and delayed 2020 season, news of the 2021 WAFLW season being brought forward had the Lions back on the training track shortly after the culmination of the finals series. Aside from adjustments for playing in summer, the new season start date also brought challenges, with League Coach Amy Lavell unable to continue in the role due to her AFLW commitments. The preseason was initially driven by the existing playing group, with feelings still raw from the League Grand Final loss, but were soon joined by a vast number of new faces, particularly in the Rogers Cup age bracket. Lauren Stammers and Pia Faletti again committed to coaching the Reserves and Rogers Cup sides, respectively, and were then joined by new appointments in Michael Farmer (League Coach), Scott Stanton (League Assistant), Jenny Wallace (Reserves Assistant), Bea Devlyn (Strength and Conditioning) and Luke Richardson (Rogers Cup Assistant).

After some significant losses and looking well out of finals contention, the League side did their homework and flipped their season around, storming home with crucial wins against Claremont and Peel to cement their spot in the top four. Unfortunately, Swan Districts were a hurdle they couldn't overcome late in the season. Despite getting tantalisingly close with one point loss in Round 12 which gave the side confidence to dispatch Claremont in the first week of finals, Swan Districts proved far too strong in the Preliminary Final ending the Lions' season a week earlier than they would have liked. The League side will take the resilience and grit they proved this season, to strive for greater success in 2022.

I wrote this in last year's report

"Winning a colt's premiership is not the culmination of a life's work and it's not necessarily a group of men who have toiled and toiled for

a long period of time to achieve ultimate success. The turnover and transition rate does not allow for long periods of continuity within a team, SO what is it??"

It is a sign.....A sign that the underpinning development of a Club is strong, a sign that a successful standard has been met and success has followed and perhaps it's a sign that we have much to look forward to if and when a majority side of locally produced and developed talent perhaps reach the ultimate success of A WAFL league premiership. For Subiaco a Club that has only won four colts' premierships in its entire history of which two have come in the last three years maybe it is a sign perhaps that reality is not as far away as we once might of thought."

To celebrate the Club's rich history and the contribution and legacy of all people who have played a part in the Club's amazing story, a new 125-year brand was designed to appropriately mark the milestone during the 2021 season. The brand's dominant feature was the shield surrounded by 15 laurel leaves on each side of the crest to represent the 15 premierships achieved in the Clubs history; and to signify the strength of the Club on and off the field.

MATCH DAYS

Subiaco played host to Good Friday, NAIDOC Round, Family Fun Day and Men's Health Round fixtures during the 2021 Optus WAFL Premiership Season. The Club recorded a total of 15,603 spectators across the ten (10) WAFL home games played at Leederville Oval during the home-and-away season; highlighted by the 2,905 attendance at the Good Friday match sponsored by the City of Vincent.

Gate Takings (\$) over the year increased by a staggering 47.9% compared to the 2019 season. This is a fantastic outcome, with the Club ensuring that game day environments are of the highest standard and appeal to a wider demographic of fans.

The season concluded with the 2021 WAFL Grand Final; with over 32,000 tickets distributed for the game. An astounding 29,879 spectators scanned-in at Optus Stadium on Grand Final day to record the highest attendance for a WAFL Grand Final in 18 years.

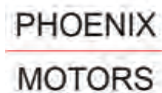

The competition is an opportunity for people with and without disabilities to play in a unified competition. Local City of Vincent resident and Club volunteer, Rob Divincenzo has given his time weekly throughout the year and has been a key supporter of the competition launch.

Subiaco, East Perth and Swan Districts signed up to be the first to compete in this inclusive and skilful game with Subiaco a dominant force in the competition.

CAREER GUIDANCE

We were proud to offer work experience positions again to SEDA in 2021. We hosted two Fremantle Dockers Sports Development Programs at our facility and had a student commence work experience one day per week during the school year. 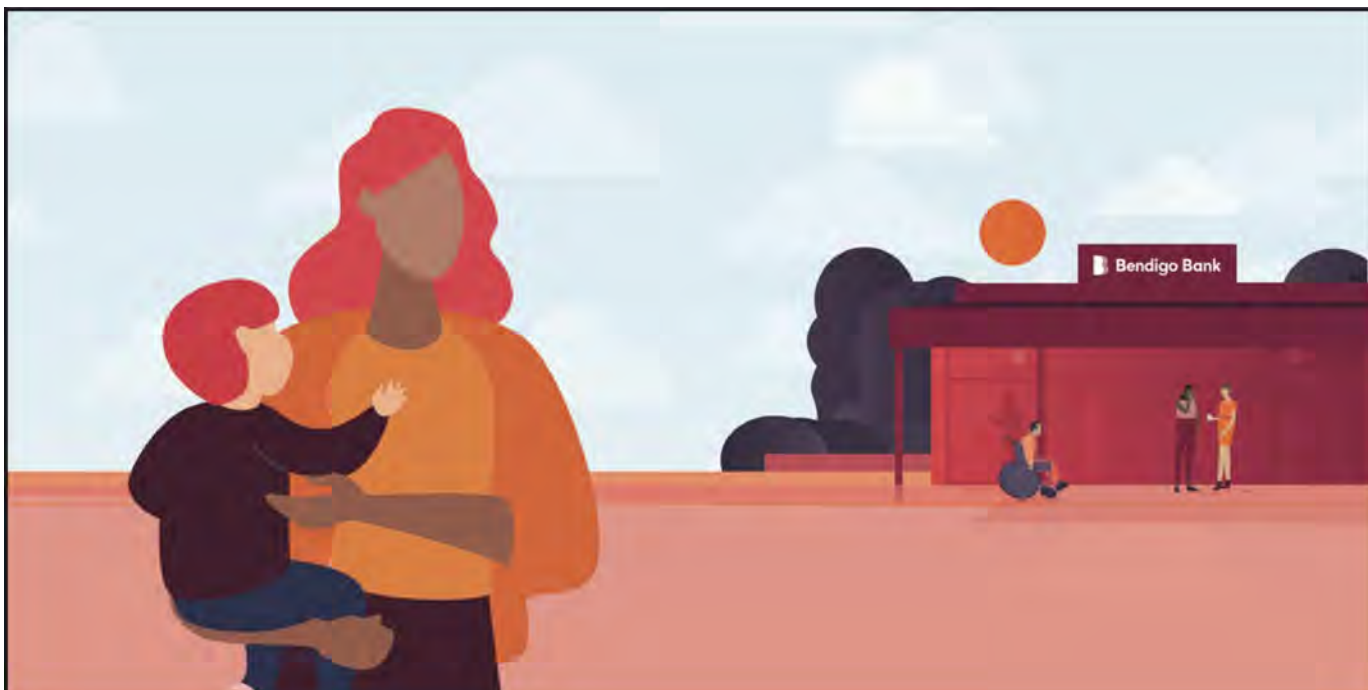
NAIDOC ROUND

Powell looks forward to continuing his professional career in Finance and focusing on spending more time with friends and family.

"Most likely finding some other way to exert my competitive energy whether that's triathlons or marathons etc. Of course, still being a part of the Club in whatever capacity I can."

"I may be hanging up the boots but I won't be a stranger around the Club" said Powell.

MICK BAILEY

ARTHUR LIVINGSTONE

Arthur was much loved around the Club in his 45-year tenure as a timekeeper for Subiaco, doing the Reserves from 1970 to 1986 and the League from 1987 to 2016, Arthur was also a long-time member of the GOLDS.

Arthur was inducted as a Life Member of Subiaco in 1985 and was an original diehard in 2000.

PETER AMARANTI

Amaranti was a consistent player who often dominated the centre position and frequently beat players touted as champions, playing 169 league games between years 1955-1963.

He was Subiaco's fairest-and-best winner in 1955 and remained one of the Club's finest players throughout the late 1950's and early 1960's.

He coached the Club's seconds team and was elected to Life Membership in 1973.

Amaranti was also inducted as an original Diehard in 2000.

DAVE CUZENS

Dave grew up in Bassendean and established himself as a footballer of the highest quality with Kalgoorlie City, playing in the Club's 1953 and 1954 premiership teams and winning the 1955 fairest and best award.

Cuzens was recruited by Richmond and played 69 games for the Tigers winning their Best and Fairest in 1958 and 1959 and serving as the Club Vice-Captain in 1960 & 1961.

Cuzens returned to WA to take up the role of captain-coach of the Subiaco Football Club in 1962, playing 13 league games for the Club before retiring as a player, and continuing to coach the Club in 1963.

DICK ROBINSON

Dick (Richard Thomas) Robinson was recruited from Kalgoorlie as a full forward following some great form in the GFL.

Dick played 15 league games for Subiaco from 1975 to 1977.

MYLES FITZGERALD

Myles played 11 league games between 1961-1962 and was considered a well-respected team member with an Irish background humour.

TREVOR HEATH

After arriving in Western Australia from Victoria, Trevor played at West Perth before joining Subiaco between 1976-1978, playing 17 league games for the Lions.

SAM RANDALL

Sam was very often here at Subi games, a proud supporter from the time he could talk, he always maintained a passionate interest in the Lions.

Sam had Subiaco Football Club in his blood, father Neil and brother Ben are both premiership players and life members.

SUBIACO CULTURE A THING OF BEAUTY

The Lions set the bar high and reach it, thanks to selfless attitude of players, coaches, officials and staff.

Subiaco's march to the 2021 premiership was inspired by the stumble the Club experienced last season when they missed the finals for the first time in seven years.

The Lions' fifth flag in eight seasons was dedicated to long time Club trainer Mick Bailey, an ever-smiling face amid an often serious Club, who died on the eve of the grand final and whose spirit hovered over the premiership celebrations.

Subiaco's success this century has been built on a Club culture unmatched in WAFL ranks, the rivers of gold that flowed from their lucrative Subiaco Oval arrangements and the most astute recruiting in the league.

But it took the opportunity provided by last year's adversity to refresh the personnel required to stay ahead of the pack when the competition returned to normal.

Subiaco won only half their matches in the shortened 2020 season while first-choice players and State regulars Kyal Horsley, Jordan Lockyer, Gus Dewar, Aaron Heal, Hayden Kennedy and Harry Marsh were injured for big chunks of the year.

Yet captain Leigh Kitchin identified the opportunities provided by the absence of those multiple premiership players for the development of second tier replacements whose contributions were critical in the Club's resurgence this year.

"We were unlucky last year and while you do not want to make excuses, you need to find a balance between the things you can control and the things that don't go your way," Kitchin said.

"Because of what happened last year, we got the opportunity to play blokes who might not have got an opportunity because more experienced players were holding their positions. We are better off this year because of what we could do last year."

There was small defender Kyle Stainsby who was a surprise winner of the 2020 fairest and-best medal last year and shut down the dangerous Cody Ninyette so effectively in the grand final that the State forward managed only two hurried behinds and did not touch the ball in the second half.

There was Liam Hickmott who made three appearances last year and built on that foundation by becoming one of the league's most effective stoppers. He has notched Sandover medallists Jye Bolton and Haiden Schloithe on his belt and blanketed the classy Bulldog again on Saturday.

There was Wil Hickmott who is a year younger than his brother but played a couple more games in 2020 before cementing his place on a wing this year. He opened the scoring in the second quarter on Saturday with an opportunist snap and then regained the lead for his team just before half-time with an ice cold set shot. Four votes in the Simpson Medal tally underlined his value.

There were Jakob Atkinson and Nick Martin and Bailey Matera, all fringe players until last year when they played every game and established themselves as regular if unheralded contributors.

The reality for Subiaco is that their remarkable recent success — nine flags from 14 grand finals this century — raises the internal and external expectations on them beyond those of any other Club.

The presence of numerous Subiaco heavyweights in the Optus Stadium changerooms after the grand final not only emphasised the Club's ability to attract match-winners at every level of its operations but reminded the players of the performances anticipated from them.

Jarrad Schofield is Subiaco royalty after winning three flags as a player and another three as coach.

He will be an influential coach at West Coast next year but was simply a delighted Subiaco man on Saturday.

His premiership hat-trick captain Marc Webb was there, as was Geelong star Sam Menegola who has never forgotten that his AFL rebirth would not have occurred without his stunning 2015 Lions season.

Horsley, the WAFL player of the century and now an assistant coach at West Coast, was talking to Darren Rumble. They have won 11 premierships between them and welcomed Lachlan Delahunty to the five flag Club.

They want to induct Kitchin, Lockyer, Heal and Kennedy next year.

Dwayne Lamb is on the Subiaco board after a glittering 350-game career that included flags at West Coast and the Lions.

He was close to Wally Edwards who was once Cricket Australia chairman and is now the Club's major sponsor.

Premiership-winning captains, coaches, players and presidents were present, all basking in the knowledge that they had helped Subiaco become the powerhouse Club it is today.

Yes, Subiaco have a powerful foundation laid by the financial legacy of Subiaco Oval, but money itself will not buy success.

That success relies on the commitment, contribution and smarts of the people invested in the Club.

It is why Mick Bailey's impact is as significant as that of any other individual at the Club during its golden reign this century.

Bailey's last act at the Club was to help load the property van after the reserves preliminary final a week ago before he succumbed to a long-time illness that he was trying to keep at bay long enough to witness yet another premiership.

"It is hard to explain how loved Mick Bailey was at our Club," Kitchin said.

"He and (veteran trainer) Alby Hawkins were always the first two people you saw when you walked through the doors at the Club.

"They made all your worries melt away and just loved us and the footy Club unconditionally.

"I think Mick had been sick for a few weeks but he was holding on and given how unselfish he was, he wanted to be at every game and every training session to do whatever he could for the Club.

"We took some motivation out of his life.

"We didn't want to put pressure on by trying to win for Mick but we got a beautiful message from Kyal Horsley about playing with Mick's unselfishness.

"Horse is still leading the Club even when he is not here anymore."

That is Subiaco's reality. The Club aims high and it has people willing and able to hit the target.

With 2021 bringing so much uncertainty to the community football landscape, I think it is certainly fair to say that seeing our great game return to somewhat of its original format following on from COVID, brought plenty of joy to the people of the Subiaco district. Our highly committed Club presidents and their fabulous committees remained agile whilst operating in at times, unexpected circumstances navigating COVID to get the season underway. These
