


PRESIDENTS REPORT

After the turmoil of 2020, 2021 saw things get back to some form of normality. This enabled the Swansmen to have a very busy and successful 2021 and once again provide many opportunities for our members to enjoy good fellowship and help raise some very valuable money for the Club at the same time.

It was an exciting year on field, with the Men's League, Reserves and Colts sides along with the Women's League and Reserves sides reaching the finals, culminating in the Men's Colts and Women's League teams reaching the Grand Final. Unfortunately, the Women's League team could not bring the flag back to Steel Blue but the Men's Colts side was successful. We congratulate the whole football department and the Men's and Women's teams on their outstanding seasons and the continuing effort to develop home grown players for the future. The Swansmen appreciate the support received from Phil Smart and the coaching staff, both male and female, and to the players for making themselves available to speak at our dinner meetings. We look forward to the 2022 season.

The year commenced as normal with the Annual Planning Seminar in February followed by the Lounge Busy Bee. The first of the Swansmen monthly dinners kicked off in March as did the fundraising for 2021.

The monthly dinner meetings were successful with approximately 30 in attendance each month. We heard from coaches, players and a diverse range of entertaining guest speakers including Adam Pickering, Phil Narkle, Tony Lewis (CEO of the Western Force), Darren Klemm AFSM (Fire and Emergency Services Commissioner), Scott Mitchell (Curator at the WA Museum) and Noelle Martin (WA Young Australian of the Year 2019).

We have had an exceptionally successful fundraising year. Over \$97,000 net was raised through:

- the Thursday Members Night, Chase the Ace, raffle and wheel - \$12,150.
- Cash Bonanza Raffle - \$12,000 (thanks to Peter Snow for coordinating).
- Auction - **\$47,000** (thanks to the Committee, Ross Leipold and the Club staff and all the donors).
- Home Game Winning Margins - \$2,400 (thanks to George van der Meulen).
- Swansmen Lounge Home Game Bar - \$5,200 (thanks to 'bar manager' Peter Bacon).
- Plus, our Membership subs, Sponsor-A-Picket, monthly dinner meetings and fines.

This amount was returned to the Club through the annual sponsorship of a Count-Me-In table; a payment towards the new memorabilia room; the Women's League Best Player Awards; the Men's League Leading Goal Kicking Award; a new projector and screen in the P.P.&O.A. room and an end of season cash donation to the Club of \$47,000.

The support of the Thursday Members' night has been outstanding on all fronts. To the members who support us every week, the ticket sellers Mark and Ray McNair, Tim Outred and Andrew Holmes, the raffle prize shoppers, Ken Ball, Andrew Holmes and Peter Hodyl, the lotto ticket donator Darryl Crotty and all other helpers, we have created something special.

We continue to work with and welcome our Judda Bee members and look forward to strengthening the networking opportunities and mutual benefits that may arise. We ask all members to support and consider all the Club and Auction sponsors when in the market for appropriate goods and services.

I would like to sincerely thank your Committee for their support and strong contribution this year and to all the Club staff for their assistance and catering. I also acknowledge the interaction and cooperation we have with the Board, Club Staff and the Past Players & Officials Association.

We welcome new members to the Swansmen group. It is a great way to support the Club and get to experience it from the inside. Good luck to everyone for season 2022.

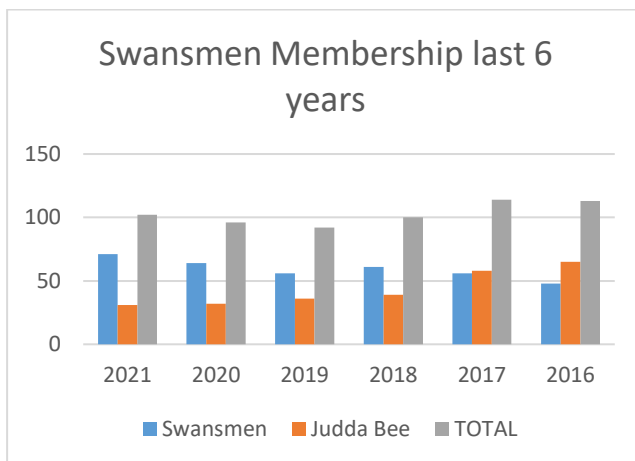



NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1: Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements under the Associations Incorporation Act 2015 (WA). To comply with the new Act, a revised Constitution was lodged with the Department of Mines, Industry Regulation & Safety in June 2019.

The Committee has determined that the Association is not a reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements. Under the Act, the Association is classified as Tier 1 for reporting purposes and does not require an annual review or audit unless requested.

The financial report has been prepared on a cash basis and is based on fair value costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets. The Association is exempt from income tax. The accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

Note 2: Current Liability

The Swansmen are committed to pay out the Chase the Ace Jackpot at some time in the future.

Scope

I have reviewed the attached Special Purpose Financial Statements of the Swansmen Incorporated which comprises the Statement of Financial Position, Detailed Profit and Loss Statement, Summary of Key Activities, Notes to the Financial Statement and the Statement by Members of the Committee for the year ended 31st October 2021.

Committee Responsibility

The Committee and its members are responsible for the preparation and presentation of the Financial Report and the information contained therein, and has determined the basis of reporting below. I have conducted an independent review of the Financial Report in order to express an opinion as requested by the Committee. The Committee is also responsible for all matters to do with internal control and have declared that the report is free from material misstatement.

The audit procedures have included on a test basis, agreeing the balances in the Financial Statements, checking receipts listed against banking, verifying payments and supporting documents, confirming the bank reconciliations and the set of Financial Accounts in accordance with Auditing Standard on Review Engagements ASRE 2415.


