By meeting key criteria, clubs will stand out as a leader in the football community and have the potential to attract new players, officials, and sponsors.









This program is not just about meeting requirements – it's about creating a quality environment that boosts the club's reputation, engages the community, and sets the foundation for long-term success.

All Metro Junior Clubs will be required to reach Foundation Club status by the first bye round. The Champion Club Program will be launched in late February with onboarding sessions available in mid March.

Mid-Season Survey and Focus Group

In 2024 the CD&V team delivered its first mid-season survey which gave clubs the opportunity to provide valuable feedback to the team on key club development and volunteer initiatives and events. This included gaining an insight into what club value as key priorities for their ongoing development.

From the survey, clubs were invited to a focus group session which delved deeper into three the key topics highlighted in the survey, which in turn influenced the teams forward planning for 2025.

We will again be providing clubs the opportunity to give feedback through the 2025 mid-season survey and focus group.

Club Committee Meeting Attendance

To continue growing and strengthening club committees, the CD&V team have developed a suite of workshops which we can come out and run with club committees. These workshops will run for 45 mins to an hour and can take place at a regular committee meeting or at a stand-alone date. The topics chosen were influenced based on feedback from the mid-season survey and are focussed on growing the capacity and capability of club committees.

YouVolunteer Program

WA Football is partnering with the Duke of Ed to provide opportunities for community football clubs to increase their volunteer base through the YouVolunteer program. The program links young people who are participating in the Duke of Ed through their school with volunteering opportunities at community football clubs. Research shows that the earlier someone starts volunteering the more likely they are to continue to volunteer throughout their lives. By engaging youth volunteers, clubs are in turn strengthening ties between young people and their club.

By linking the Community Football Award nominations with WA Football Volunteer of the Year Award nominations, clubs have a greater opportunity to showcase their amazing volunteers without increasing volunteer workload at such a busy time of year.

Clubs will be able to nominate their Club Person of the Year and are encouraged to nominate for the Further with Football Award.

In addition to nominations received through Volunteer of the Year Awards for Junior and Youth Club of the Year, additional criteria based on club's performance throughout the competition season. These criteria are as follows:

- Team nominations and withdrawals
- Willingness to work with other clubs e.g. merged teams
- Participation growth
- Retention of players
- Yellow and red cards (players and officials)
- General game incidents and forfeits
- Code of conduct/rules and regulations breaches
- Attendance at Competitions meetings
- Effective, respectful and timely communication
- Club members who umpire
- Attendance at coaching education, workshops and meetings
- Coaching citations
- Payment of affiliation fees
- Attendance at Community Football Awards

Please note that results are scaled based on club size.
