Tony Notte, 300 Games

Congratulations go out to Tony Notte for becoming the seventh WAFL and second Swans player to play 300 WAFL games. Apart from a short stint at the West Coast Eagles Tony has played his entire football career at Swans, etching his name into the Swans history book. The Club stalwart has captained the League side, won three Swan Medals and represented the State six times.

Women's Football

Round eleven saw the girls take on Subiaco at Leederville Oval. It was a mixed result with the Rogers Cup girls winning by 10 points and the League unable to overcome a slow start going down by 11 points. Round twelve saw the girls back at home with the Rogers Cup taking on Perth and the League South Fremantle.

It was an even first half in the Rogers Cup game but Perth got the ascendancy in



the second half kicking 5.2 to 2.0 and take the win by 26-points. The League game was crucial for both sides, win and consolidate a spot in the top four, lose and fall back to the pack. It was a tight affair all day with Swans coming out on top by 11 points. Round thirteen saw the girls back at Leederville Oval versus East Perth. It was a day out for with both sides with the Rogers Cup girls winning by 85 points and the League by 101 points. Round fourteen was a bye for the Rogers Cup girls with the League team back home against ladder leaders East Fremantle. It was a close game but the visitors took the win by 12 points. So, after Round fourteen both sides sit fourth.

Men's Football

Round seven saw the men's teams take on Peel at home. It was not a good day for the home sides with the Colts going down by 42 points, the Reserves by 25 points in the bottom of the ladder clash and the League losing by 18 points with inaccuracy in front of goals proving costly. Round eight was at home against West Perth. In the Colts the visitors had the better of the young Swans for three quarters, going into the last break 53 points up. Swans came out and kicked 8.1 to 1.2 in the last but the defecate was too large and they lost by 12 points. The Reserves game was the 2023 Grand Final replay and a battle of the cellar dwellers with Swan's not having won a game and West Perth with only one win. It was all Swan's for three quarters, going into the last break 55 points up. Although West Perth had the breeze in the last, kicking 6.4 to 2.1, the damage was done, with Swan's winning by 28 points and notching their first win of the season. It was a crucial game for the League, win and stay in touch with the top five, lose and fall back to the pack. The first half was a shocker for Swans with West Perth all over the home side, but only going into the long break 22 points up. Swans came out a different side after half time, dominating against what wind there was, kicking 5.1 to 1.1 and going into the last break 2 points up. It was an arm wrestle for most of the last quarter but Swans took ascendancy late in the term to come out victors by 13 points, great turn-around. Round nine was away to Subiaco. The Colts got up by 36 points while the Reserves went down by 28 points. In a hard-fought game, the League kicked 4.2 to 1.1 in the last quarter to come out on top and celebrate Tony Notte' 300th game with a win. After Round nine the Colts sit fifth, the Reserves 8th and the League fourth.

All Abilities Football

Round 4 saw the team take on Warnbro at Warnbro. Swans came up trumps by 25 points. Round 5 they were up against old foes Coolbinia at Coolbinia. It was an even first half with Swans going into the long break 4 points up. A strong second half by the Black and Whites saw them kick 3.3 to 1.1 and bring home an 18-point win. Rounds 6 & 7 were byes. They currently sit fifth on the ladder.
