

To all our valued members, I want to thank you for your loyalty and support over the past year.

The performance of our senior men's team this season was encouraging, and we made great in-roads, but not playing finals was not really acceptable.

Having said that, one of the key performance indicators I look at is our percentage on the WAFL ladder and for most of the season we sat on around 80%, up from 60% last year. It means we are much closer to becoming a consistently competitive team. One goal either way in four games and we would have had an eight-win season. Injuries to three of our best recruits hurt us badly, otherwise I'm certain our best was good enough to play finals.

The season started with a magnificent tribute to our ruckman Dakota Baldwin-Wright. Our players wore black armbands in honour of their fallen mate, and produced an emotionally charged win over Subiaco as the club retired the No.19 jumper.

Personally, I'll never forget when Dakota's guernsey was placed in the centre of the team circle after the match and we all sang the club song; his parents, Rita and Greg and brother Ethan included.

We hadn't beaten Subiaco in eight years, so it was also good to consign that statistic to history.

These are the moments to hold onto. These are the memories that we can cherish forever

Like you, Perth will always be a huge part of my life. And you, our loyal members, are the lifeblood of our club and are the reason we exist.

It is clear we have challenges ahead of us, but you should take comfort in the knowledge that your Board, and the club's staff and players, are ready for those challenges.

This is about the next chapter in this football club's famous history, and it will include engaging with you all.

We are a united club, and our players led by captain Matt Taylor... and our coaching staff led by Mark Stone... are incredibly determined to build on the gains made in 2024, with the ultimate goal of course - a Demons premiership.

It's always tough to farewell a coach but Peter German made a huge sacrifice to be in the West for two years without his family.

Football Manager Trevor Williams is also stepping away after a period of tremendous service, alongside club great Steven Armstrong and 2023 Butcher Medallist Charlie Thompson.

Importantly, our colts and reserves teams played finals this year and we are building from below. Highly respected coach Scott Moore will again head up our colts programme.

We have also been granted a senior WAFLW team, starting in 2025, and we have appointed Jess Sedunary as our new League Coach and Manager of Female Football.

Our club is now complete and any child in our zone who dreams of pulling on a red and black jumper can do so.

This season was special in one sense for our club, marking 125 years. And while we didn't get the fairy-tale season we were hoping for, our Rogers Cup team over-achieved under Michele Burton and Gavin Outridge and look set for bigger things.

As mentioned, Mark Stone is our new senior coach and he comes with outstanding credentials, coaching a premiership in the SANFL and also having a successful AFL career at the West Coast Eagles, Fremantle Dockers, Sydney Swans, and most recently the Brisbane Lions.

Our new Football Manager Brad Dodd, who built a premiership list at East Fremantle, is also one of the best in the business.

In women's football, community engagement and sponsorship we are flying. I'd like to personally thank our board members and welcome to the board former player Daniel O'Sullivan.

In terms of our new clubrooms, we feel confident that we will soon be able to announce some exciting news about a state-of-the-art community, WAFL and women's football facility.

Football seasons come and go very quickly. As we say goodbye to season 2024 I would like to reflect on the year that was.

The Rogers Cup team commenced their season on March 2nd with a narrow loss to Peel Thunder, however the improvement in the team was very noticeable as they pushed their more experienced rivals. History was made for our Rogers Cup program on March 8th when the team beat South Fremantle by 21 points on a Friday night in Fremantle. The season only got better from there with the team rounding out the year with 6 wins from 14 matches, finishing in 6th place on the ladder. My thanks to Coach Gavin Outridge and support staff, the driving forces to this being such a successful season.

As stated in last year's report, one of our goals for 2024 was to win a licence to compete in the WAFLW in season 2025. A project group was formed early in the year driven Project Manager Gerard Arangio. The WAFC set some key targets the club needed to achieve to be given the green light, and I am pleased that we were successful in our bid and will field a team in the WAFLW in the 2025 season. A key appointment to begin the program was that of Jess Sedunary as inaugural coach. Jess will double in the role of Football Manager – Female Program. We were very excited to announce the arrival of Isabella Shannon as our first marquee signing with the forward / midfielder having played 17 games of AFLW for St Kilda. Another major boost to the team is the signing of former Australian Netball Captain and Champion Caitlin Bassett. We look forward to the 2025 WAFLW and Rogers seasons as a complete club.

After two years in the role of Hungry Jacks Community Engagement Manager Oscar Bird decided to pursue education and sporting opportunities to the east and possibly overseas. Charlie Thompson commenced in the role in February of 2024 and immediately started building on Oscar's community programs. The Free Kick Project returned to York and Cunderdin in 2024 with both programs well received and growing. Junior club visits, school clinics and our relationship with the Bachar Houli foundation were just some of the growth areas in 2024. Thanks to the Hungry Jacks partnership, Perth Football Club continued our success in the West Australian Wheelchair Football League taking out back to back Premierships.

The ongoing support of our sponsors, members, fundraising activities as well as the day to day business operations of the club continue to be strong in terms of revenue growth. The Sponsorship and Business total Development portfolio grew again in 2024. I am pleased to report that revenue surpassed \$3m for the first time in 2024.

The recruiting for the 2024 season could not have been better with high profile recruits Charlie Constable, Sam Simpson and Blake Schlensog (all formerly listed with Geelong), Aaron Clarke (Coburg) and Joshua Edwards (West Coast) joining the club.

Sadly, during the pre-season break, we were to learn of the passing of our much-loved Dakota Baldwin-Wright, or Two-Dads as he was so affectionately known. Our hearts were and are with Rita, Greg and Ethan and the extended family.

Our 125th season started brightly with a stirring win for the league side against Subiaco. In fact, it was the first time in many years that we walked away with three wins for the day against Subiaco.



A disappointing loss to West Perth away in round two was followed by a strong win against Swan Districts at home in round 3. With a bye for round four, the round five clash on ANZAC Day was set to be a big one with both Perth and East Perth on 2 wins and a loss. A huge crowd of 3,831 attended the day but were left disappointed with East Perth running out 21-point winners. Making matters worse was the fact that Sam Simpson missed the clash and subsequently would play only one more game for the year, while Charlie Constable went down early with a leg injury and would miss the next six matches as well. For the remainder of the season, it would be fair to say the league results were disappointing, but it must also be noted that the team lost four matches, East Fremantle 4 points, WCE 2 points, East Perth 7 points and South Fremantle 5 points, by a combined total of 18 points. Our previously mentioned recruits only managed the one game together for the season, the 20-year drought breaking win over West Perth at Mineral Resources Park. In another pleasing development 5 players from the 2023 Colts team made their league debuts in 2024, and 2024 Colt Cooper Moore also made his debut late in the season.

Our Reserves team returned to finals for the first time since winning the 2021 Premiership, but were unfortunately eliminated in week one. My thanks to Coach Craig Mueller for his dedication to development.

To Scott Moore, my congratulations on season 2024 where he once again led the Colts to the finals. Unfortunately, there would be no fairytale, with the team going down late in the elimination final by 2 points.

Thank you to all assistant coaches, statisticians, trainers, physios, doctors, timekeepers, property staff, team managers, players and volunteers across all grades for the countless hours you all put in to support the Perth Football Club.

At the conclusion of 2023 it was apparent that we needed to recruit some key players to bolster the playing strength of our young list. The Recruiting Committee did an excellent job in securing several well credentialled recruits to the Perth FC for season 2024. Pre-season commenced in late November, with some clear goals set for players to achieve so that they were ready to impact when the season got underway. After 3 interclub practice games and a searching preseason we were ready to launch into the Home and Away season. New recruits in Blake Schlensog, Charlie Constable, Sam Simpson, Aaron Clarke, Josh Edwards, Joey Chaplin and Jed Kemp were primed and ready to impact Round 1 versus Subiaco at MRP. This was always going to be a significant game, more so than any previous Round 1 fixture. Not only was the club launching its 125th Year, but it was also our opportunity to play a tribute game, acknowledging the sad passing, in the off season, of Dakota Baldwin- Wright. We were ultimately successful in winning this game, giving us a great launching pad into the season. Unfortunately, our nemesis in West Perth brought us back to earth quickly, beating us convincingly in Rd 2, albeit we got back on track to beat Swan Districts at Home in Rd 3 which primed us for the ANZAC Day clash against traditional rivals in East Perth. A great contest ensued before a large crowd, with East Perth reigning supreme on the day, as the injury curse again struck. By the end of Round 4 we had lost our 3 most significant recruits for an extended period; and our results reflected this.

We endured a lean spell losing 6 consecutive games, albeit 2 were by less than a goal to East Fremantle away and WCE in Northam. Importantly we got our season back on track in Round 13 against West Perth. Finally putting 4 quarters together we convincingly won this game; against a side we had not beaten at Lathlain since 2004. Our next three games were to be against the top 3 sides in East Fremantle, Peel and East Perth. We started to see the return of some of the long term injured players in this period, and although we lost all three games we were certainly very competitive in all, and took a positive mind set into our Rd 18 clash against WCE at MRP. An opportunity to have a win and get off the bottom of the ladder and avoid the wooden spoon. We dominated the game to half time but could not apply the scoreboard pressure required. Thankfully this dominance translated on the scoreboard after half time and we ran out convincing 48pt winners. This gave us new found confidence and motivation to take on Subiaco the following week. After dominating early against Subiaco and leading at every break, we capitulated in the last quarter and were soundly beaten.

With two games left to restore something from the season the club took a change of direction after Senior Coach, Peter German, resigned. We faced South Fremantle at home under the new interim leadership of Mark Stone.

Our last game was up at Bassendean against SD and they proved to be far too good for us and we had a disappointing loss and finish to the season.

The positive for the senior group was the performance of our Reserves under the leadership of Craig Mueller. They withstood some difficult times during the season, with player availability, to finish the season strongly to earn the right to play Finals football. Unfortunately they lost in the Elimination Final to South Fremantle, however the young talent on display gives Perth something to look forward to in coming seasons.

Well done to all the players who made their League debuts for the Perth FC in season 2024.

It was pleasing to see several boys from our Colts team of 2023 play League Football. Noah Cachard, Elijah Scoble, Jake Watson, Noah Murray and Cooper Moore (Colts 2024 as well). After an injury plagued two seasons it was exciting to see James Ewing makes his debut for Perth as well in Rd18. It was a long road for James having not played League football since 2022. Riley Wills and Ryan Newick who joined the club from Subiaco as aspiring League footballers also made their debuts for Perth. Ben Fairbank and James Preston-Coates also made their League debuts after coming through our Development Programs in recent seasons.

Well done to all the Coaching Staff for your dedicated work and support of each other in challenging times. League assistants, Darren Rumble continuing, and with the addition of key assistants in Mark Stone and Trent Barrett we had a well experienced group, coupled with our Reserves coaching team lead by Craig Mueller in his first season as Head Coach of Reserves, who was ably assisted by Pat Litherland and new assistant coaches in Matthew Burgess and Ben Thomas. Thanks to Steve Armstrong for his key role in driving our 'Rising Red Legs Program' and mentoring of the coaching group.

Thank you to Diamond Fitness, in particular Johnny, in leading the strength and conditioning team in such a professional manner, with the assistance of Jessie, Emily, Tara and Regine in assisting the players prepare and recover in readiness for training sessions and games. Our medical and training staff again proved to be an awesome team.

Dan and Clare as our physios, and Mithun as club doctor, working with our head trainer Imogen provided a great professional service to all our players. They have led a great team of assistant trainers and interns volunteering their time to assist. We thank you all.

Our 2024 season was one full of twists and turns. With so much turnover in our squad, the coaching staff was excited to get to work with such a talented group of players coming through.

Pre-season at Kenwick saw 95 players trialling, each vying to make the final squad. In what would be a strong and challenging summer, the playing group knuckled down and got to work. Building strong connections and maintaining high standards was critical for what would be a demanding year.

A key part of setting our year up was a camp in our regional zone of York, at Gilba Downs—an opportunity for the players to get away from footy, spend quality time together, and complete some meaningful team-building tasks. From herding sheep in the paddock to rowing a pontoon across a dam, the group came together to achieve each objective.

Out of the camp emerged our values, trademarks that would guide us throughout the year: Passionate, Ruthless, United, and Belief. This year, we demonstrated countless examples of living by these values, and I'm proud that they were on full display to everyone who watched us.

Our year was set, and we felt that our best would be good enough for a great season. Round 1 arrived, bringing the opportunity for 13 players to debut—over half a side playing their first game of Colts football. Over the course of the year, 52 players would earn an opportunity to play.

Our performances were up and down, but we were competitive in most games. Five of our eight losses were by 8 points or fewer, underscoring the tight competition. I'm extremely proud of our entire group for what we achieved throughout the season—not being defined by wins and losses, but by the growth we demonstrated. I can't wait to see where these players go in the future. The future of the club is in good hands.

2024 saw our talent pathway continue to build on the success of 2023. The Colts squad made finals for the second year in a row and our Futures, 15s and 14s development squads look to be producing high level talent. This year also marked a transition within the Talent Manager role, with me assuming responsibility in February. Building on the solid foundation laid by my predecessors, I am thrilled to have overseen our development programs across 2024. The invaluable contributions of our coaches, support staff, and regional leaders have been instrumental in fostering the positive progress we have seen this year, and I look forward to continuing to build on these achievements in 2025.

Colts (U19)

2024 was a season filled with both challenges and milestones for our Colts team. The year began with final list cuts in February, reducing the squad to 67 players. The mix of youth and experience in this squad, ranging from 17 to 19 years old, set a strong foundation as we prepared for the season. February also featured a successful preseason camp in York, which helped build team chemistry ahead of the competitive games. Additionally, we were pleased to see both Loch Mactaggart and Koby Evans be selected for the State 18s squad.

The season kicked off with a thrilling 38-point victory over Subiaco, followed by a nail-biting draw against West Perth in Round 2. Despite a narrow loss in Round 3, the debut of 14 new players was a highlight, demonstrating the depth of talent in the squad. However, the impact of the PSA season and several key injuries in May made this period challenging. Despite the adversity, the squad's development remained positive with 21 debutants gaining valuable game experience.

June brought about a resurgence, with a key win against East Fremantle placing the team in the top five, and players returning from injury boosted our prospects. By September the Colts successfully secured a spot in the finals, finishing 5th after a hard-fought win against South Fremantle.

Unfortunately, the season came to a heartbreaking close with a narrow two-point loss to Swan Districts in the Elimination Final. This season the Colts played a total 52 players. 1x 16-year-old, 16x 17-year-olds, 23x 18-year-olds and 12x 19-year-olds. Of these 52 players nearly half made their debut in the Colts.

Our annual Ensor Medal night crowned Cooper Moore as the winner with 110 votes. Other significant awardees included Mitch Keene (Players' Player), Brodie McLean (Most Consistent), and Robert Warrell (Leading Goalkicker), Jacob Roberts (Spirit of the Colts), Will Tilbee (Past Players Encouragement award). Furthermore, we were pleased to hear that 3 of our Colts players were named in the Colts Team of the Year, Cooper Moore, Jacob Roberts and Robert Warrell.

I'd like to thank our coaching staff this year, Scott Moore, Ben Tomasini, Ross Mackenzie, Josh Smith, and Ross Clark for their dedication and leadership. Additionally, special thanks to Maddy Rogers (Physio), Mitch Tiernan (S&C), Anthony Gugliotta (S&C), Lucas Abbs (Head Trainer), Madi Butler (Trainer) and Eleasha Donovan (Trainer) for their invaluable support throughout the season.

As we look ahead to 2025, I'm pleased to announce that Scott Moore has agreed to continue as our head coach for the 2025 season.

Futures (U16s)

The Futures program saw a highly developmental and competitive season in 2024. February set the tone with a successful jumper presentation night and a resounding 114-45 victory in the first round. Over the course of the 9-game season, the squad showed tremendous spirit and determination right through to the conclusion of the program in April after an extensive 5 month campaign. A total of 51 players participated in Futures games. 5x 15-year-olds, 31x 16-year-olds & 15x 17-year-olds.

This talented group of young athletes also performed strongly in their two games against West Perth and Peel Thunder, securing resounding victories.

FROM THE COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT MANAGERS

In 2024 Perth Football Club (PFC) has continued to thrive and make significant strides in the community sector, driven by our commitment to fostering strong relationships and creating positive impacts across our metropolitan and regional zones. We extend our deepest gratitude to our major sponsor, Hungry Jack's, whose unwavering support has been instrumental in our success. We also acknowledge the valuable contributions of our partners, including Fugro and MacMahon. This year we have proudly collaborated with a diverse range of individuals, clubs, communities and organizations. Our efforts have enabled us to strengthen our community engagement, support local talent, and promote the spirit of the game across all levels.

The Free Kick Program returned for its third year in 2024, continuing to provide young people in regional zones with the opportunity to train with Perth players, share meals with peers, and participate in educational and developmental presentations. This year we delivered four-week programs in York and Cunderdin, with over 40 participants in York and over 30 in Cunderdin. Participants ranged in age from 7 to 16, with notable female participation and strong involvement from Indigenous communities. The program included a football clinic focusing on fundamental skill acquisition and fun, educational sessions on topics such as healthy eating, goal setting, and anti-vaping, as well as shared dinners and engagement with PFC players. We look forward to expanding the program further in 2025.

In 2024 the partnership between PFC and Penrhos College continued to flourish, with five senior players—Noah Cachard, Elijah Scoble, James Ewing, Riley Wills and Ryan Lee—coaching Penrhos teams during Term 1 IGSSA Football. The Perth players were actively involved in both training sessions and games, focusing on the acquisition and development of fundamental skills while ensuring the experience remained enjoyable for all participants. Additionally, PFC facilitated a weekly football program for grades 2-4 throughout Term 3, concentrating on skill development and the fundamentals of the game. With the establishment of our new senior women's team entering the WAFLW in 2025, the pathway from Rogers Cup (U18) to senior women's football at Perth is now complete, providing young girls with a clear and inspiring progression within the club.

PFC's wheelchair football team, having successfully defended their premiership title in October 2023 and aiming for a three-peat, is gearing up for an exciting new season from October to December 2024. To enhance visibility and community engagement the team is rolling out several key initiatives including pre-season training, team photos, a 125-year commemorative uniform, and increased social media recognition of match scores. These efforts will celebrate past successes and prepare the team for continued excellence in the upcoming season.











COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT MANAGERS' REPORT 2024











PFC is committed to fostering a love for football within our community through the delivery of engaging football clinics to schools across our region. These clinics are designed to introduce children to the sport in a fun and inclusive environment, focusing on the acquisition of fundamental football skills while ensuring an enjoyable experience. Senior men's players, along with the Community Engagement Manager, actively participate in these sessions, enhancing the experience by providing giveaways, taking photos, and engaging with the children by answering their questions. These clinics not only serve to promote the sport and our club but also play a crucial role in strengthening the connection between PFC and the broader community.

Another vital component of PFC's community connection is maintaining a strong and active relationship with the junior clubs in our metropolitan catchment region. This connection is fostered through various initiatives, including regular player appearances at junior training sessions where they run drills and engage with the young athletes. Additionally, the club organizes half-time mini matches during League games, providing junior players with the exciting opportunity to showcase their skills on a larger stage. Furthermore, the club extends invitations to the committees of junior clubs to attend pre-game President's Lunches, promoting a sense of community and collaboration between the senior and junior levels of football.

In 2024 PFC have partnered with Curtin University and The Heart Foundation to deliver the Aussie-Fit program. The Aussie-Fit program is a free 12-week program designed to help men make positive change in their life, such as lose weight or make healthier eating choices.

The program aims to educate participants so the lifestyle can be sustained beyond the 12 weeks. As part of the program Curtin University trained 2 PFC players, Kieren Pettit and Riley Wills, so they could facilitate the program. Across 2024 PFC will host two programs, where participants will attend 12, 90-minute sessions including an educational component and a physical activity component. The first 12-week program has just finished, and participants are undertaking health assessments to provide data to Curtin University.

Leading up to the Round 9 WAFL clash on June 2nd, 2024, Perth Football Club (PFC) executed a series of impactful community engagement activities in Northam and surrounding towns. Key initiatives included organizing nine football clinics across six local schools, providing young participants with opportunities to develop their skills and foster a passion for the sport. Additionally, PFC held a specialized training session for its regional talent squad, aimed at honing the abilities of aspiring local footballers, and conducted a holiday program for Children in Care in the area, with a morning of football activities, Q & A, giveaways and lunch together. These efforts not only generated excitement for the game but also reinforced PFC's commitment to community engagement and the development of future football talent.

Overall PFC's dedicated community initiatives in 2024 have significantly enhanced local engagement, supported talent development, and strengthened our connection with diverse communities. As we look ahead to 2025 we remain committed to building on these achievements and continuing to make a positive impact in the community.



Talent Development and Training

The training session was focused on selection for the July carnival, with clean, skilful competition and some outstanding individual performances.

- The selected squad participated in the July carnival, although the team faced significant challenges, with injuries severely affecting the team's performance. The team showed resilience, with 16 fit players in the final quarter of their last game. Despite the tough circumstances, the squad displayed excellent sportsmanship and commitment.

Academy Girls Development

For the first time, the West Coast Eagles delivered training for the Academy girls, with 10 girls from the North Midlands area attending. These players have been part of the Academy training program since November 2023, and they greatly appreciated the expertise and support from Chris Brown of the Eagles. Later in the season, five girls were selected to play for the Eagles underage team during a curtain-raiser for the AFLW Round One game at Mineral Resources Park.

Additionally, five girls attended the Rogers Cup training, with two invited to try out for the 2025 season. These achievements are a testament to the dedication of these young athletes and the continued support from Russ Clark and the Academy team.

Challenges and Key Events

The Grand Final day coincided with the Butcher Medal, preventing the PFC staff and executive from attending many of the major events. However, the WAFL game in Northam between PFC and West Coast Eagles was a significant success, attracting a good crowd and allowing for the female trial game. The Wheatbelt Wolves Senior Women's team also had the opportunity to progress and play in a post-game fixture, which was well received.

Facility Audits

A comprehensive audit of club facilities was conducted over a two-day roadshow, covering all seven clubs in the Mortlock Football League. The audit, supported by the WAFC Facilities Manager, had a positive impact, helping identify areas for improvement and ensuring that the clubs continue to offer high-quality facilities for players and supporters.

Future Focus

The WAFC's focus for 2025 will centre on participation and growth at all levels of football, including a particular emphasis on schools, in line with the AFL funding agreement.

- A review of the new talent model completed by an external agency resulted in over 40 recommendations, with Jon Haines leading the process.
- Moving forward, WAFC staff in country areas will not be involved in talent management but will serve as consultants to the Talent Managers at WAFL clubs.


